Session 1

Maths- Four Operations

10 min warm up: <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/daily10>

Daily 10-level 5-multiplicationmixed tables up to x12 (WI)

Quick problem to solve: Trafalgar Square is 12,000 metres squared, what do you think its length and width is? Q: How many times would your kitchen fit in it?

Tips: 4 steps is roughly 3 metres **Area - the amount of space inside a 2D shape.**

LO: Subtraction of two 5 digit numbers

35 minutes Activity 1: Roll a dice 10 times (or use digits 1, 2, 3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6) to make two 5-digit numbers.

Create a subtraction calculation. Put the highest digit at the start of the first number in your calculation. Use the formal written method to solve (layout below).

Complete 12 different formal subtraction calculations.

Tips: Draw a place value chart if you need to keep the digits in place. Use the inverse operation to check answers

I rolled a dice 10 times. I generated these numbers: 2, 3, 4, 6, 2, 5, 1, 4, 1, 1.
With these digits, I made this subtraction calculation:

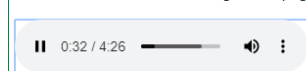

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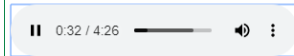
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
