<p><u>LO: Rounding to the nearest 100</u></p> <p>Task 1 – Problem solving</p> <p>I can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Determine if the tens column is 5 or more to round up or 4 or less to round down <p>5<u>4</u>7 to the nearest 100 = 500 35<u>6</u>7 to the nearest 100 = 3600</p> <p><i>You might like to do activity 1, 2 or both... it's up to you!</i></p>	<p><u>LO: To write an alternative ending or write a backstory for one character.</u></p> <p>Task 3- Responding to the movie</p> <p>I can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Organise my writing by using paragraphs. Use commas after fronted adverbials. Extend my sentences by using a wide range of conjunctions, including when, if, because, although.
