CRAFT PROJECT INSTRUCTIONS

Episode: Snow Party Project: Penguins in snow

Materials:

1 cup hair conditioner
6 cups bicarbonate of soda
Mini plastic bottle
Black acrylic paint
Goggly eyes
White and orange card
Glue
Wooden tray
Pine cones
Toy tractor

Tools:

Big bowl
Spoon
Paintbrush
Pencil
Scissors

Method:

1. Start by making the snow! Put 6 cups of the bicarbonate of soda into the big bowl and squirt in about 1 cup of the hair conditioner.
2. Mix it well, use your spoon first and then knead it with your hands until it feels like fluffy snow. You can always add more conditioner if you need to.
3. Put the snow onto the tray and play with it!
4. Now it's time to make the penguins. Take your little plastic bottle and paint it black. Give it a good even covering and leave it to dry.
5. Draw out the stomach on the white card and cut it out.
6. Draw out a triangle for beak on orange card and cut it out.
7. Draw out a long oval shape on the orange card and cut it out, and then cut it in half to make the feet.
8. Glue the stomach to the black bottle, and then add the feet and then the beak.
9. Then glue the eyes on. Leave it to dry and give it a name.



Episode: Slime Party
Project: Slime farts

Materials:

1 cup of PVA glue
Blue/green food colouring
Around 1 tsp of bicarbonate of soda
Around 1 tsp contact lens solution
Jar
Coloured paper
Goggly eye
Glue stick

Tools:

Bowl
Spoon
Scissors



Method:

1. Start by making the slime. Pour the glue into the bowl, squeeze in the food colouring and mix well.
2. Add the bicarbonate of soda and stir.
3. Slowly add the contact lens solution, and then mix again. Once it starts to come away from the sides of the bowl, knead into a small ball. If it's too sticky, just add more contact lens solution. Put the bowl to one side.
4. Now decorate a jar to put it in. Draw around the lid of the jar on the green paper and cut it out. Draw out some teeth on the green paper and cut them out too.
5. Draw out some hair on the yellow paper and cut it out. Draw around something round to be the eye on the yellow and cut that out too.
6. Cut a strip of the blue paper to be the mouth.
7. Cut two small strips of orange paper to make a criss cross eye.
8. Lay out all pieces to see how they make up the face. Glue the green circle to the top of the jar. Bend over the bottom of the hair and stick that across the top of the jar.
9. Stick the orange strips onto the jar to make a cross for the first eye, then stick the yellow circle to the jar for the other eye. Stick a goggly eye onto the yellow circle.
10. Stick the blue strip on the jar to be the mouth, and then stick the green triangles underneath to be the teeth.
11. Let the jar dry, and then stuff the slime into the jar to make fart noises.

Episode: Unicorns Party
Project: Wearable Unicorn horn ring toss

Materials:

Gold, pink, white card
Double sided tape
Glue stick
Wool
Tape
Pom poms

Tools:

Scissors
Something circular to draw around



Method:

1. Take a long strip of white card and measure it around your head to create a headband. Fix it in place using the glue stick.
2. Cut out two small ears out from the white card and then cut two smaller pieces of pink card to be their insides. Stick them together using a glue stick, and then stick them onto the headband.
3. Now it's time to make the horn. Draw out a large quarter of a circle shape on a piece of gold card and cut it out.
4. Stick a length of double sided tape down one of the straight edges, peel off the backing paper and bend the card round to complete the cone.
5. Stick some wool to the top of the horn using double sided tape, wind it around the horn and stick it in place at the bottom with more double sided tape. This will look like the swirl of the horn.
6. Cut a slit either side of the horn, and slide it on to the headband. Stick the back of the horn to the inside of the headband using tape. You can put it on to check that it fits.
7. Now it's time to make the rings! Find something circular and draw around it a few times on the card.
8. Then find something circular which is slightly smaller and place it inside the first circles, before drawing around it too. These will become your rings.
9. Cut them out and then decorate them. Tape the end of the wool to the first ring and wrap around the card passing it through the hole in the middle. Securing the end of the wool with more tape. Repeat the process with the other rings. If you don't have much wool you can decorate them with coloured pens.
10. It's now time to play! Place the unicorn horn on someones head, and take it in turns in try to and get the hoops onto the horn.

Episode: Chocolate Party
Project: Chocolate bar notebook

Materials:

Notebook
Thick cardboard
Brown tissue paper
Tinfoil
Paper
Pens
Glue
Gluestick

Tools:

Scissors
Ruler
Brush



Method:

1. Use the ruler to draw rectangles on to the piece of thick card.
2. Cut them out!
3. Stick them to the notebook to look like the pieces of a bar of chocolate, leaving gaps between them.
4. Carefully stick the tissue paper on top, making sure to get it in all the gaps. Stick it down well around the edges of the notebook.
5. Wrap a piece of tinfoil around the notebook to look like the wrapper of the chocolate, peeling back the corner to reveal the chocolate.
6. Think of a name for your chocolate, and draw out it's logo on the paper. Colour it in.
7. Cut it out and stick it to the tinfoil.

Episode: Hearts Party
Project: Heart soap

Materials:

2 bars of clear soap
Food colouring
Jug of warm water
Thick cardboard
Tape
Tinfoil

Tools:

Scissors
Spoons
Bowl
Grater
Heart shaped ice tray



Method:

1. Start make the mould. To do this, draw out a heart shape on the thick cardboard and cut it out.
2. Take a long strip of thick cardboard and stick it around the edges of the heart using tape to secure it in place.
3. Line the mould with some tinfoil so you can easily realise it.
4. Grate the two bars of soap into the bowl.
5. Squirt in some food colouring and about 6 tablespoons of warm water. Give it a good mix.
6. Then use your hands to knead it and distribute the colour evenly.
7. Push the soap mixture into the mould, and into the ice cube tray and leave it to set.
8. Turn the mould upside down, and release the soap from it.

Episode: Fruit Party

Project: Grape ball

Materials:

3 cups fabric softener

2 cups Cornflour

Thick balloons - green and purple

Nylon net, green and purple (or black)
(with holes in - you can use a fruit
net)

String

Tools:

Scissors

Bowl

Spoon

Funnel x 2

Empty plastic bottle x 2



Method:

1. Put the fabric softener into the bowl, and add the cornflour and give it a good stir.
2. Put the funnel in each the bottles, and pour the contents of the bowl into the bottle.
3. Inflate the balloons, and stretch them over the top of the bottle.
4. Turn the bottle upside down and squeeze the contents of the bottle into the balloon.
5. Carefully take the balloon off the end of the bottle, release the excess air from the balloon and tie it off.
6. Put the net tightly around the balloon and secure it in place with a piece of string, around the top of the balloon.
7. Carefully trim off the excess net.
8. Stretch the end of the balloon around the cut ends of the net.
9. Take extra green balloon, cut down into it to create leaves, and stretch its neck over the end of the grape ball.


Episode: Glitter Party
Project: Glitter ball

Materials:

Long strips of card
Shiny papers
Glue stick
String
Cardboard tube
Tape
Sticky tak

Tools:

Pencil
Scissors



Method:

1. Cut the shiny papers into squares, slightly wider than your strips of card. You'll need lots of these!!
2. Stick the squares along the strips.
3. Find the middle point of one of the strips. You can do this by folding the strip in half.
4. Use a pencil and some sticky tak to make a hole in the middle of the strips..
5. Mark through to the middle of the rest of the strips, and then make holes in them in the same way
6. Stick two of the strips together in the middle, to create a cross shape.
7. Stick the rest of the strips evenly around the initial cross, to create a star.
8. Thread the string through the hole in the middle and tape it down.
9. Take you cardboard tube and cut into each end to make tabs.
10. Stick the cardboard tube in the middle of the strips, over the hole with the string through it.
11. Bend the strips up, overlapping the ends and stick them to each other, over the top of the tube.
12. Use the string to hang it up.

Episode: Ice cream Party
Project: Ice cream shaped bath bomb

Materials:

1 cup bicarbonate of soda
½ cup corn flour
½ cup of salt
4 tbsp cream of tartar
4 tbsp oil (either vegetable oil or baby oil)
Food colouring
2 tbsp water
Scents (optional)
Sprinkles
Greaseproof paper
Card
Brown colouring pencil
Double sided tape

Tools:

2 Mixing bowls
2 small bowls (to use as a mould)
2 Spoons
Scissors
Ruler

Method:

1. Put the dry ingredients in the mixing bowl (the bicarbonate of soda, corn flour, salt and cream of tartar) and mix them together.
2. Split the mixture between two mixing bowls. (*one for each presenter*)
3. Take two cups and mix some oil, water, any scent and one colour of the food colouring in each.
4. Pour a cup of the wet ingredients into each bowl of the dry ones and mix together. The mixture should be crumbly.
5. Put each each colour into the small bowls, packing it firmly down. Put some sprinkles on top.
6. Turn the bowl out onto the greaseproof paper and leave to dry.
7. While its drying make the cone. To do this take a square of card and use a ruler to draw criss cross lines over it to look like the waffle effect.
8. Fold along the lines to give it some texture.
9. Roll the square up on the diagonal, and use double sided tape or a glue stick to secure it in place.
10. Once dry, place your bath bombs in the top of the cone.



Episode: Robot Party
Project: Robot head


Materials:

Cardboard box
Paint
Coloured paper
2 Paper cups
Glue
Paper fasteners
Silver pen/pencil

Tools:

Scissors
Paintbrush
Hole punch

Method:



1. Draw a square on the front of your box which will be your face hole. Carefully cut it out. (you can do this by cutting up from the bottom, completing the square and taping the bottom back together).
2. Stick the paper cups to the box where the ears go.
3. Paint the whole thing and leave to dry.
4. Put elastic bands over the ears.
5. Cut strips of silver card and stick them diagonally inside the box, leaving gaps between them.
6. Cut out a mouth from card and some teeth and stick them to the box.
7. Make a cog template out of paper and draw around it twice and cut it out.
8. Cut out smaller circles of paper and stick them behind cogs to make up the eyes.
9. Carefully poke the paper fasteners through the box in place of the eyes.
10. Time to make the Party-O-meter! Draw around the roll of tape (on the navy blue) and cut it out. Use a silver pen to draw the dial on the 'C' shape, and fold over the bottom of it.
11. Cut orange bits and stick them to the C.
12. Take the piece of card that was the inside of the navy blue circle. Fold over the bottom of it, and hole punch through.
13. Take a silver arrow of card, hole punch the end of it and attach it to the hole punched navy blue circle using a paper fastener .
14. Stick the dial to the top of the box.
15. Finally stick a pale blue C shape at the front of the box- label it the Party-O-meter!

Episode: Birthday Party
Project: Mini present pinata

Materials:

Thick cardboard
Tape
Tissue paper
Crepe paper
Glue stick
Pen
Pencil
Sweets
String
Sticky tak

Tools:

Scissors

Method:

1. Take the cardboard and draw out the net for the box on it. The net should be made up of 6 squares arranged in a cross shape.
2. Cut it out.
3. Make a hole in the middle of the middle square and the end square using a pencil and some sticky tak.
4. Thread the string through the middle square hole and tape it down on the other side.
5. Fold the square up into a box, and tape the edges.
6. Now put the sweets in! Cut some triangles of tissue paper into the box as well to make confetti.
7. Thread the string through the end square, and then tape this square down to complete the box.
8. Cut long strips of tissue paper and fold them up lengthways. Snip down in to them a few times create tassels.
9. Stick the strips of tassels around the sides of the box using a glue stick. Start at the bottom, overlapping as you go.
10. Take a long strip of crepe paper and tie a bow around the present. Hang it up and play!



Episode: Beach Party
Project: Miniature beach

Materials:

Tray or deep plate
Shiny blue card
Pebbles and shells
Shaving foam
Salt
Yellow paint
Green paint
Egg box
Green paper
Googly eyes
Green pom poms
Glue
Card surfboard
Paper umbrellas
Wooden teaspoons

Tools:

Bowl
Spoon
Scissors
Brushes

Method:

1. Draw around your tray onto a big piece of shiny blue card.
2. Cut it out, and place in on your tray. This will be the sea.
3. Next make the sand. Put some salt in the bowl, and add a few blobs of yellow paint and a squirt of shaving foam and give it a good mix. Start with a spoon, and then rub it in with your fingers. This bit can be messy!
4. Put the sand onto the tray, you can use a spatula to smooth it down. Wash your hands.
5. Now make the turtles. Cut the bottom off the egg box, and paint it green (*one each*). This will be the turtle shell.
6. Draw a body shape on the green card and cut it out.
7. Stick the shell to the body and a pom pom to the shell. Put some googly eyes onto the pom pom.
8. Place the turtles in the beach.
9. Add paper umbrellas and a cardboard surfboard and use the wooden teaspoons to dig in the sand.



Episode: Space Party
Project: spaceships that land on the moon

Materials:

2 x Paper plates
2 x Paper cups
Scrap/news paper
Kitchen roll or tissue
PVA glue
Double sided tape
Silver and black paint
Big piece of thick card
Pencil
Coloured paper
Tape
Pipe cleaner

Tools:

Scissors
Brushes



Method:

1. Start by making the spaceship. Scrunch and twist a piece of news or scrap paper into a long sausage and then spiral it round.
2. Stick it to the first paper plate and then stick the other paper plate on top using double sided tape.
3. Take the paper cups, trim them down and then cut little slits all the way around the bottom of them.
4. Fold out the flaps, and stick them to either side of the paper plate spaceship using double sided tape.
5. Paint the whole thing silver and leave it to dry.
6. Cut out a bit paper to be the spaceship window and draw an alien driver inside. Stick it to the top cup.
7. Cut out other shapes of coloured paper and stick them to decorate the space ship.
8. Take a pipe cleaner and stick it to the top of the cup to be the antenna.
9. Now make the moon. To do this take a large circle of thick cardboard, twist kitchen roll or tissue into rings and stick these to it.
10. Cover the rest of the moon in kitchen roll or tissue paper too, scrunching it slightly as you glue to look the craters on the moon surface.
11. Brush around the craters with silver and black paint to look like the shadows on the moons surface. Leave to dry before throwing your spaceship on it.

Episode: Halloween Party
Project: Wearable skeleton

Materials:

White card
String
Pencil
Glue
2 hairbands
(Black clothes to wear)



Tools:

Scissors
Hole punch

Method:

1. Take a strip of cardboard that fits between your shoulders and a wibbly one that looks like a spine. Stick them together to create a T shape.
2. Cut out a piece of card that looks like a pair of pants and stick that to the bottom of the T shape.
3. Make holes using the hole punch on the top ends of the T, and the bottom of the pair of pants.
4. Take long strips of card and stick them in to loops. These will be the ribs.
5. Stick them to the spine of the T shape.
6. Stick another strip of card on the front of the ribs to secure them in place.
7. Now it's time to make the arm and leg bones. USE TEMPLATES Draw four long bones to make up the legs, and four shorter bones to make up the arms.
8. Cut them out, and then use the hole punch to make holes in each end of them.
9. String two of the longer bones together to make the legs, and then tie them to the holes in the pants.
10. String two of the shorter bones together to make the arms, and then tie them to the top of the T.
11. Tie the hair bands to the hole in the bottom of the arm bones.
12. Tie a longer piece of string between the top two holes in the T, long enough to comfortably go around your neck. Put some black clothes on and put it on!

Episode: Monster Party
Project: Monster pong

Materials:

Paper cups
Paint (yellow and turquoise)
White paper
Coloured paper
Glue stick
Marker pens
Ping pong balls

Tools:

Scissors
Paintbrush



Method:

1. Start by making the monster cups. Paint each of your cups a different colour and leave them to dry. (We can bring on extras at the end)
2. Draw out an eye on the white paper and cut it out.
3. Draw out some hair and arms and cut them out.
4. Draw out a mouth and some teeth and cut them out too. Lay out all your pieces to see how they make up a face.
5. Stick your face features to the cup to create your monster cup. (Bring out the other friends) You can get as creative as you like.
6. Decorate each one of your ping pong balls to look like a different monstrous eyeball. (decorate a few each and bring on extras).
7. Set your cups up, stand either side of them and try and bounce your eyes into the monsters.

Episode: Safari Party

Project: Tiger tail

Materials:

Thick cardboard
Pencil
Sticky tak
Wire
Old newspaper or scrap paper
Pair of tights (Black)
Black wool
Felt (orange)
Tape
Double sided tape



Tools:

Scissors
Something circular to draw around

Method:

1. Take a circle of thick card and make a hole in the middle of it, and two holes nearer the edges using a pencil and some sticky tak.
2. Poke a piece of wire through the middle hole, bend it over and stick the end down.
3. Take newspaper or thin scrap paper, scrunch it into long lengths and build up around the wire to create a tail shape, taping it in place as you go.
4. Cut the waistband off the top of the tights and then snip it so it's one long piece.
5. Thread each end of it through one of the holes left in the cardboard circle, and tie it off.
6. Cut one of the legs of the pair of tights off, and make two small holes in the toe of it.
7. Take short lengths of black wool and thread them through the two holes. Take another piece of black wool and tie all the strands together, to make the tip of the tail.
8. Stretch the leg of the tights down over the tail shape, around the cardboard circle and stick in place
9. Cover the back of the felt in lengths of strong double sided tape and cut strips out of it to be the tigers stripes. Peel off the backing paper and stick them to the tail.

Episode: Pirate Party
Project: Pirate ship

Materials:

One juice carton (cleaned and empty)
2 x Paper straws
White and red paper
Brown paint
Gold pen
Modelling clay (plasticine)
String
Acrylic paints
Marker pens (black and gold)
Pencil

Tools:

Scissors
Hole punch



Method:

1. Put the carton on its side and draw a line which will be the top of the boat. Stick a pencil in a few times to make holes.
2. You can then carefully get the scissors in through the pencil holes and cut off the top side of the carton.
3. Now paint the outer edges of the carton brown, and leave it to dry.
4. Tape two paper straws together and paint them brown too.
5. When it's dry take a marker pen and draw some lines around the sides to look like the wood grain. Also draw some circles with the marker pen to be the portholes.
6. Use a gold pen to add extra details.
7. Put a small amount of modelling clay in the centre of the boat, and stick the paper straw in it. This is the mast.
8. Now make the sails. Take a square of the paper and a smaller rectangle of carefully hole punch a hole at either end so it can thread on to the mast later. Draw your pirate design on it.
9. Thread the sails on to the mast.
10. Now tape a piece of string to each of the inside corners of the boat, and tape the other end of each piece of string to the top of the mast.
11. Stick little triangles to the string to look like bunting.
12. Cut out a flag and stick it to the top of the mast.
13. Put your boat in water and use a straw to blow it around.

Episode: Superheroes Party
Project: Cape and eye mask

Materials:

Felt
Thin card
Elastic
Wrapping paper, a few different sorts works well
Glue stick
Clear tape
Ribbon
Pencil

Tools:

Scissors



Method:

1. Take a length of wrapping paper which is long enough to go from your shoulders to your bum.
2. Fold it in half lengthways, and cut a diagonal line from the corner of one end to the middle of the other end.
3. Unfold it, this is the basic cape.
4. Cut strips and shapes of other coloured wrapping paper and stick them to the cape. You can build up as many different patterns as you like.
5. Roll the cape up width ways to soften the wrapping paper - this will mean it flies better!
6. Take the ribbon and cut two equal lengths of it. Tape them securely to the the top of the cape, reinforcing them with extra tape. These will be the cape ties.
7. Now make the mask. Take the piece felt and stick it to the thin card. Draw out a eye mask shape on it.
8. Cut out the main shape. To get inside the eye holes, fold the felt in half and carefully cut them out.
9. Cut out a star shape and stick that to the mask too.
10. Make a tiny snip in each side near the edge. It's easiest to do this by folding over the felt and carefully snipping in.
11. Tie the elastic between the two holes, making sure it's long enough to comfortably fit around your head. Snip off any excess and put it on!

Episode: Emoji/tech Party
Project: Emoji poop hat

Materials:

Pair of tights
Brown paint
Scrunched up newspaper/or stuffing
White, black and pink felt
Double sided tape

Tools:

Scissors
Wide paintbrush



Method:

1. Stuff the scrunched up paper into the tights, making sure to get right down to the toes.
2. Fold the waist of the tights in and stick both sides of it together using double sided tape.
3. Now paint the whole thing brown. It will look like a really long poo! Leave to dry.
4. Spiral up the long poo, sticking it together with double sided tape. Make sure to push it down to really secure it.
5. Draw out the outside of the eyes on the white felt and cut them out.
6. Draw out the inside of the eyes on the black felt and cut them out.
7. Draw out the mouth on the pink felt and it out.
8. Stick all of the face features to the poo using double sided tape. Put the poo on your head.

Episode: Secret Dens Party

Project: Fox mask (to play grandma's footsteps with at party)

Materials:

Card (strips)
Tinfoil
Orange tissue paper
Brown tissue paper
White paint
Black paint
Glue stick
Tape

Tools:

Scissors
Paintbrush



Method:

1. Start by taking a long strip of card and measure it around your head. Fix in place with a bit of tape and cut off the excess.
2. Stick strips of card from the front the the back and from one side to the other of the headband.
3. Take a few lengths of tinfoil and cover them with the glue stick. Carefully and quickly lay the orange tissue paper on top and rub it down.
4. Make one of the pieces into a nose shape and stick that to the headband
5. Wrap the tinfoil tissue combo around the headband scrunching it to secure. Cut of any excess.
6. Double up some of the offcuts to make the ears and stick them the top of the head.
7. Add white paint around the underside of the nose and the insides of the ears.
8. Then add black paint details for the eyes and nose.
9. Finish off by adding whiskers. To make these twist long pieces of brown tissue paper and glue these around the nose.

Episode: Music festival Party
Project: 3D Main stage face (for selfies)

Materials:

Thick cardboard
Gold tissue paper
Glue stick
Tape
Black paper
Coloured paper
Coloured pens
Pencil

Tools:

Scissors
Ruler
Something circular to draw around



Method:

1. Cut a piece of cardboard as wide as your shoulders and about 45cm long. It's good if the grain of the cardboard goes the width of your shoulders.
2. Stick a piece of coloured paper or card to it to be the base colour of the stage and cut off any excess.
3. Measure 10 cm up from the bottom, draw a line and fold the card along here- this will be the front of the stage.
4. Draw around something circular on the bigger side of the card, overlapping the edge. This will be the head hole.
5. Cut it out.
6. Take a long strip of cardboard, with the grain running the width of it. Break up the the grain of it, by rolling it up tightly.
7. Stick a base colour of card to it using a glue stick.
8. Stick bits of coloured paper to it on both sides to look like the stage decor- you can use any shape you want but we're using triangles. (they were offcuts from other projects)
9. Tape the cardboard to the side of the stage, bend it up over to create the top of the stage and stick it to the other side using more tape on the inside.
10. Draw around the back of your stage onto the tissue paper. Cut out the piece all as one, and then cut slits up into it to create a slash curtain effect.
11. Stick it to the back of the stage using small bits of tape.
12. Stick stars around the front of the stage, with some speaker shapes and a few more triangles of colour.
13. Stick a mini-figure of yourself onto the stage, and put the stage on.
