Opening prayer

If you have a candle, ask an adult to light it as you remember that God is always with us. Say the words:

May the light of God shine in my heart and in the lives of everyone I love. Amen.

What is Christian Aid?

It's Christian Aid Week this week. Christian Aid is a charity that started 70 years ago after the Second World War to help refugees—people who had been forced to leave their homes. It's one of the good causes we raise money for at school each year.

Christian Aid exists not just to help Christians but people in need—of all faiths and none. As the Bible teaches us, everyone is equal in God's eyes and today Christian Aid is working for a world where everyone can live a full life free from poverty.



Activity

Love never fails

Usually, during Christian Aid Week, volunteers go from house to house knocking on doors or standing outside Underground stations to ask for donations. Last year, Christian Aid raised £8 million. But imagine how difficult it is this year when nobody is allowed to do this because of the Coronavirus Pandemic. So just like our learning has gone online, Christian Aid has too. Christian Aid Week reminds us that 'Love never fails'.
