



Home Learning at CCHT 2020- 2021

Whole School Closure (January 2021)

In light of both schools being assessed as being in a "Contingency Area" we have re-enacted our home schooling policies from March 2020 with a few updates to our procedures that we have informed all parents about and have outlined on the Home Schooling part of the school website.

Learning Bubble Instruction to Quarantine

In the event of a Learning Bubble needing to close as advised by Public Health England we intend to move the bubble year groups back to the website as we did for home schooling.

Due to our risk assessment planning we do not anticipate that it will be necessary to close more than one bubble at a given time as we follow strict procedures ensuring learning bubbles are kept exclusively in their own spaces during a working school day. This also included before and after school activities.

We have contingency "Everything is Interesting" and Maths and Literacy planning that we will aim to publish on our website no more than 24 hours after the school group has been sent home. Following the initial work that is published we will put on a remaining week's planning or indeed were possible a whole week' planning in line with the format we used during home school learning in the summer term.

Class teachers wherever possible will resume the zoom sessions weekly and the leadership team and teachers will resume the online posting of films for children to watch.

We will ask children to post their work using Class Dojo and teachers will respond to this as quickly as they can.

As for during home-schooling in the Summer Term we will contact all parents to ensure that they have access to the internet to access work and will deliver paper copies of work either by post or by hand to any family that need it.

We will prioritise keeping close links with children and families that are home schooling and work to ensure they feel part of the community as we did earlier in the year.

Individual Families Self-Isolating

Individual Children or Families needing to self-isolate will be directed to a good online home-schooling website that has work broken down into year groups for the duration that they are not in school. We are currently exploring whether we can provide live teaching of the lessons children are receiving at school via zoom. This has now been trialled in a number of our classrooms. .

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
