


Recommended Read



Poppy Goes Wild for ages 6-8 & up

Author: Nick Powell **Illustrator:** Becca Hall **Publisher:** Little Steps Publishing



When Poppy stays at her grandpa's farm, she listens to his tales of the old days – when otters raced each other in the river, when you could spot peregrine falcons above and when the meadows were full of wild flowers. Yet, none of those animals can be found on the farm anymore because of the use of pesticides and modern farming techniques. Inspired by some research on rewilding, Poppy inspires grandpa to make some changes and welcome nature back to the farm, with marvellous results.

This charming book with full colour, whole page illustrations from Becca Hall will delight young nature enthusiasts and especially those who are interested in conservation. Rewilding seems much in vogue nowadays, and while this is a story, it's also a pretty detailed guide to how the approach works to increase natural biodiversity. A lovely and very educational read for fans of Nicola Davies and David Attenborough.




Year 6 at - Osmington Bay



This week, in Reception class:

Alphabet Code	Some children reviewed the sounds /oa/ /oo/(long) /oo/(short) and worked on blending, segmenting activities as well as sentence building. Other children were introduced to the different codes for the /oo/ sound. They now know /ew/ as in new and /u-e/ as in huge.

Learning in Year 1 at Holy Trinity

Friday 28th May 2021

This week in English, we started researching information for our next non-chronological report, all about mammals from North America.

In maths, we continued addition and subtraction within 40. This week we focused on subtraction with regrouping, adding two 2-digit numbers together and solving word problems. All of this practising will help us use the vertical addition and subtraction methods.

In Alphabet codes, we investigated the different codes for the /n/ sound. We discovered n as in now, kn as in know, gn as gnome and nn as in sunny.

For RE this week, we thought about the importance of promises. We then wrote down some promises we would like to make to our family, friends and communities.

In science, we recapped our trip to the Chelsea Physic Gardens. We drew diagrams of the different plants we saw at the Physic Gardens, labelled them and wrote down some interesting facts we discovered. We had such a fun time at the gardens. A big thankyou to our two parent volunteers 😊

In Art, we started our new topic 'what is sculpture?' Next term, we will be focusing on the work of Ai Weiwei and we began our topic today by researching his life and art.

This week was our last Forest School session of the year. The children have had so much fun each week exploring the woods and learning new skills.

Learning in Year 2 at Holy Trinity

Friday 28th May 2021

This week in Year 2:

In English this week, we have been reading the 'Ocean Meets Sky' book by the Fan Brothers. This book is about a Grandfather and his Grandson's relationship and we have been writing our own character descriptions using expanded noun phrases and similes. We have also written a diary entry as the character Finn using the correct tense, focusing on conjunctions.

In Maths, we have been consolidating our learning on column addition with 3-digit numbers. We have been revising column addition with regrouping the Ones and Tens as well as how to regroup with subtracting 3-digit numbers.

In RE we have been discussing the 'I am' phrases and understanding those ideas better. We savoured some grapes before eating them as symbolism for patience.

In science, we made our own plant pots out of recycled items and the children have brought their sunflower seeds home to see if they grow. Fingers crossed! They could keep a diary and log what is happening when the seeds germinate.

We have provided more reading books for half term.

Learning in Year 4 at Holy Trinity
Friday 28th May

This week in Reading, we practised reading the entire story of *The Time-Slip Scarab*. We discussed what it means to read fluently - appropriate pace, appropriate volume, use of expression and pausing at punctuation. We also learned about, and practised using, appositives and how they can add extra detail to our writing.

In Maths, we identified and sorted different angles including *right angles*, *obtuse*, *acute* and *straight*. We then learned that two lines that form a right angle are *perpendicular* whilst two lines that are the same distance apart and never cross each other are *parallel*.

In Religion, we finished our unit on Islam by reflecting on the question "Which pillar of Islam do you think is the most important to Muslims?" We had a great discussion and came to the conclusion that most of the pillars linked tightly with each other.

In Science, we investigated the processes of evaporation (liquid → gas) and condensation (gas → liquid) and linked this to the water cycle. We were also very lucky to get to taste the ice-cream we made last week when learning about freezing (liquid → solid).

In History, we unpacked a special painting found in the tomb of a nobleman called Nebamun. The painting gave many insights into the lives of the ancient Egyptians including their hobbies, clothing, social hierarchy and the different animals around.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 5

28th May 2021

Math:

This week we have been hard at work wrapping up our learning of Area. We have been calculating the area of composite shapes and attempting some hands-on activities to further develop our understanding. This included making 1 square meter out of newspaper as a team, then dividing it up into 5 parts and creating our own composite shapes. This was trickier than expected and took a lot of teamwork and thinking 'out of the box'. Mrs McCrone has continued teaching coordinates on a grid this week. We're looking forward to continuing this next term.

English:

It was our final week for our unit on *Curiosity*. We finished our news report of the landing. Next, we were given a special job...NASA has requested help in designing the next rover set to venture off to Mars! So this week we have been very busy carefully designing, labelling and explaining our very own rovers. It has been incredible seeing everyone's creativity and dedication towards this task, certainly taking the task very seriously.

Chelsea Physic Garden/ Ancient Greek STEM Challenge:

On Thursday we ventured to Chelsea Physic Garden. Whilst there we had the opportunity to explore the world of seeds, both large and small! We were so lucky to have wonderful sunny weather throughout the day. The class was split in half with the students remaining at school attempting a special Ancient Greek STEM challenge: building the Parthenon!

**Learning in Year 6 at Holy Trinity
Friday 28th May 2021**

It has been a busy week back at school after an exciting week away in Osmington Bay. Although we have been exhausted, we have thrown ourselves back into learning.

We immersed ourselves back into Shakespeare, rehearsing daily, practising our lines, we have almost cracked it without looking at our scripts.

On Monday, we eased our return to school with a trip to Fulham Palace, where we took part in an immersive theatre performance of Titania's Dream, inspired by Shakespeare's Midsummer Nights Dream. We really enjoyed being a part of this performance and the quest we were set to plant the lovely purple flowers. We had to find all the fairies in the woodland and met some characters along the way.

In English, we have been working towards producing work for our Julius Caesar performance program. We learnt about what a synopsis is, in groups, we worked together to summarise each scene. Then looked at how we could summarise each scene in a digestible way for our readers.

In DT, we used our designs to create a character for our production program. Using wire and a wooden bead, we made a wire model figure of our Julius Caesar character. These character models will be used to support our program.

In Maths, we revised 2D and 3D shape, focusing on angles within a quadrilateral and triangle, using a protractor to calculate the angles in a shape. Then we went back to our previous topic of area, this week we looked at finding the area in a parallelogram, looking at how we can partition a parallelogram into rectangles and triangles. We then used the formula; base x perpendicular height to calculate the area of a parallelogram.
