

Learning at Christ Church in Year 1

Friday 17th September 2021

Another fabulous week in Year 1, we have been working hard getting used to our new routines.

In maths this week we have been looking at number bonds to 5. We revised how number bonds are made of a part-part-whole and used cubes to explore all the different combinations we could come up with for number bonds to 5. We then drew pictures to show all the different parts that can make these numbers.

In English, we began learning about captions and even wrote our own! We remembered that captions give us more information about a picture. We then reviewed our writing and thought about how we could make it even better!

For Alphabet Code this week we have been looking at the /ee/ code and writing sentences using this code. Next week, we will start the /igh/ code.

In Geography, we have been looking at different types of maps and drawing our own maps of the classroom from a bird's-eye view perspective. In Science, we have been looking at our baby photographs and looking at how much our bodies have changed over time!

In PSHE this week we have continued to look at the different zones of regulation, we have read 'The Colour Monster' and talked about the different zones the colour monster is in throughout the book!

Next week, we will read 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' and work with our friends to retell and act out the story, sequencing the main events from the beginning, to the middle and then the end. In maths next week, we will be looking at number bonds to 7, 8 and 10, using the part-part-whole model.

It was so lovely to see so many of you at the parents' drinks on Tuesday!

Learning at Christ Church in Year 2

Friday, 17th of September 2021

We have been very busy in our second week of Year 2. We have done lots of fantastic work but have also been working incredibly hard to improve our active listening skills and should be very proud of our efforts!

This week in Maths we compared numbers up to 40 using the terms 'greater than' and 'smaller than'. We used number lines, number squares and base tens to help us. We then began to find the difference between numbers up to 40 using the terms 'more than' and 'less than'. For example, **31 is 2 more than 29** and **29 is 2 less than 31**.

In English we began our unit called *The Big, Big Sea*. We came up with lots of fantastic expanded noun phrases to describe the setting and the main character of the story. We then wrote about a special moment we have had with someone in our family, remembering to use expanded noun phrases to add detail, capital letters at the beginning of sentences and full stops at the end of sentences.

In Science we worked on our observation skills with a little help from a magnifying glass. We noticed how the object we looked at became bigger, or more magnified, as we pulled the magnifying glass further away. We then sketched some magnified leaves, ensuring to add all the fine details we could see.

In Geography we looked at the local food sources along the high street. In groups we drew maps and labelled the different food stores along Kings Road. We then thought about whether the food sold at these stores were fast, fresh or frozen.

In Art we began our unit called *Mother Nature*. First, we learnt a range of interesting facts about Dutch artist, Vincent van Gogh. We then looked at some of his famous artworks and discussed different aspects of his art, including his use of colour and brushstrokes.

As a reminder, please bring in green Home Learning books on Monday and reading books on Tuesday. All homework will go home on Wednesday afternoon.

Learning at Christ Church in Year 3

Friday 17th September 2021

This week Year 3 have done a terrific job at applying themselves across a huge variety of topics!

In Maths, we've been building on our understanding of place value and using inequality symbols to show how numbers compare to others.

In English, we've been adding extra information to our sentences by using adverbial phrases about how, where or when something happened.

In Science, we've been thinking about how light reaches our eyes; in History, thinking about how we find out about the Stone Age when there are no photos or written sources and in Computing, thinking about how we can stay safe online. We also had a wonderful time tasting bread as part of our research for how to make an excellent, healthy sandwich.

Undoubtedly the highlight of the week was our first swimming lesson of the year! Everyone did a great job of showing their confidence in the pool and encouraging their classmates too! Unfortunately, the pool are still sticking to the policy of **no parents to watch swimming lessons** at the moment but we will keep you up to date with how they are doing!

Good things to ask your child this week are:

How do I write "3 is greater than 2" or "24 is less than 408"? Can you show me the symbol?

How can we add extra information to a sentence?

How do we find out about what life was like in the Stone Age?

We're looking forward to continuing our swimming next week, some of us could be speedier getting changed so do practice at home this week with a time limit whenever possible!

Learning in Year 4 at Christ Church
Friday 17th September 2021

This week in Year 4, the children have been learning how to round 2–3-digit numbers to the nearest 10 and 100. Their homework is based on this – they may need some support completing task 2.



32 rounded to the nearest 10s = 30
35 rounded to the nearest 10s = 40
38 rounded to the nearest 10s = 40

What would 456 be rounded to the nearest 10s? 450 or 460 – Why?
What would 456 be rounded to the nearest 100s? 400 or 500? – Why?



In English, they completed their shared write which involved writing a recount and they were introduced to lengthening their sentences by using fronted adverbials.

We've enjoyed reading our class book – George's Marvellous Medicine. A few questions you might like to revisit with your child:

- Do you feel sympathy for George or Grandma? Why?
- How is Grandma described?
- What would you do if you were in George's position?
- Which Ingredients does George put in the medicine?
- Why did George turn the mixture brown?

In Science, the children explored classification keys to group species of living things together. We are looking forward to exploring living things and their habitats at Chelsea Physic Garden when we visit later in the term.

We have been very lucky to get tickets for the Van Gogh Alive experience in Kensington Gardens next Wednesday 22nd. We will walk there together at 9:15, have lunch in the gardens after the exhibition and return to school by 1:30pm. Please keep an eye out for an email about this from Judith Kelly.

Learning at Christ Church

Friday, 17th September 2021

It has been an exciting week at Christ Church and we have learned about lots of new things. A special welcome to Andrew who has joined us this week, it already feels like you have been with us for ever!

In English, we learned how to use expanded noun phrases and relative clauses in a piece of descriptive writing. We have also looked at how to use dialogue in a story and imagined a short piece of dialogue between the busker and the barber of our story 'The Swing of Change'.

In Maths, we have learned how to compare numbers up to 100 000 and how to work out the pattern in a sequence of whole numbers. We are also refreshing our timetables in our Maths meetings. Next week, we will be moving onto rounding numbers.

In Art, we have learned about Grayson Perry and his famous vases. The children will be designing their own vases next week inspired by Grayson Perry's work.

In PSHE, the class has defined what mental health means to them and brainstormed helpful strategies to help us deal with problems. We have also been talking about the 4 Zones of Regulation (blue, green, yellow and red) and how our energy might feel when we are in different zones, consequently impacting our mood and emotions.

In Science, we have learned about different types of scientific experiments and the types of scientific methods used by scientists such as fair testing, classification, or conducting a survey. We also defined who scientists are and children have come up with their own definitions of a scientist.

In History, children have researched information about the Ultimate Victorian, Queen Victoria.
