Prayers of Penitence

For behaving just as we wish, without thinking of you; Father, forgive us:

Save us and help us.

For failing you by what we do, and think and say; Father, forgive us: Save us and help us.

The priest says:

May the God of love and power

Forgive you and free you from your sins,

Heal and strengthen you by his Spirit

And raise you to new life in Christ our Lord.

The Collect

Holy God, our lives are laid open before you: rescue us from the chaos of sin and through the death of your Son bring us healing and make us whole in Jesus Christ our Lord. All Amen.

The Old Testament reading

Psalm 51

You are kind, God! Please have pity on me. You are always merciful! Please wipe away my sins. Wash me clean from all of my sin and guilt.

You want complete honesty, so teach me true wisdom. Wash me with hyssop until I am clean and whiter than snow.

Let me be happy and joyful! Create pure thoughts in me and make me faithful again. Don't chase me away from you or take your Holy Spirit away from me. Make me as happy as you did when you saved me! Keep me from any deadly sin. Only you can save me! Then I will shout and sing about your power to save.

The Gospel reading

Matthew 6: 1-21

When you do good deeds, don't try to show off. If you do, you won't get a reward from your Father in heaven. When you give to the poor, don't blow a loud horn. That's what show-offs do in the meeting places and on the street corners, because they are always looking for praise. When you give to the poor, don't let anyone know about it. Then your gift will be given in secret. Your Father knows what is done in secret, and he will reward you.

When you pray, don't be like those show-offs who love to stand up and pray in the meeting places and on the street corners. They do this just to look good. When you pray, go into a room alone and close the door. Pray to your Father in private. He knows what is done in private, and he will reward you.

When you go without eating, don't try to look gloomy as those showoffs do. Instead, comb your hair and wash your face. Then others won't know that you are going without eating. But your Father sees what is done in private, and he will reward you.

Don't store up treasures on earth! Moths and rust can destroy them, and thieves can break in and steal them. Instead, store up your treasures in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy them, and thieves cannot break in and steal them. Your heart will always be where your treasure is.
