


## Recommended Read



### Paradise on Fire (ages 9-11 & up)

**Author:** Jewell Parker Rhodes **Illustrator:** Serena Malyon **Publisher:** Orion



When Addy sets out on an organised adventure holiday into the forests of North America with a group of other Black children from inner-city New York, it brings back tragic memories of the fire that killed her father and mother. Then a real fire breaks out and as the forest around them goes up in flames, separating them from any help, Addy has to use her map-reading skills to lead the others through terrible danger to safety.

In this dramatic and exciting story, Addy discovers she loves the wilderness and feels it is her natural home. She reaches her potential as a leader, and learns that survival isn't just about her own safety, but about rescuing others too. There is also a message about climate change, further explored in the author's note at the end of the book.

It would have been nice to see indigenous American characters included in the story, or perhaps a reference to indigenous American knowledge and wisdom regarding climate change and nature among Addy's experience of the wilderness. Nevertheless, *Paradise on Fire* is a lyrical and important story which moves swiftly and builds relatable characters in very few words.







# Remembrance Day Assembly

Armistice Day is on 11th November and is also known as Remembrance Day. It marks the day in 1918 that World War One ended, at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month.

On this day and on Remembrance Sunday (the 2nd Sunday in November), a two-minute silence is held at 11am to remember the people who have died in wars around the world.

At Holy Trinity, we held a silence in the Cadogan Gardens playground after our special, Remembrance Day Assembly.



At our remembrance assembly, we learnt all about the significance of Armistice Day and the meaning behind the wearing of poppies.



During this time of remembrance, some people wear poppies to commemorate those who sacrificed their lives in World War One and conflicts that followed. Wearing a poppy was inspired by the fields of poppies that grew where many of the battles were fought. The red poppy is said to represent remembrance and hope.



The purple poppy is often worn to remember animals that have been victims of war.



The black poppy is most commonly worn to commemorate the contribution of black, African and Caribbean communities to war.



The white poppy is said to commemorate people who died in conflict, but focuses on achieving peace and challenging the way we look at war.



Learning in Reception at Holy Trinity

**Literacy-** We have continued to listen to the story of 'The Jolly Postman'. The children sequenced different scenes from the story and designed their own stamps. We also practised writing a weekend recount: "Over the weekend I went to the park."

**Alphabet Code-** This week's new sounds are: /f/, /ff/, /l/.  
**Tricky words:** the, to, my, I, of, said.

**Maths-** We have been working on forming numbers correctly, putting numbers in order to 20 and saying one more, one less than a given number.

**Art-** Painting like Kandinsky! The children listened to the story "The Noisy Paint Box". We played some classical music while the children painted to the rhythm of the sounds.

**Reading books:**

Reading books and homework need to come back to school on **Monday** in order for Miss Saadnia to have time to both mark their homework and change their books. If you would like to keep the same books for another week (if you feel this will help your child's blending and fluency when reading), that's absolutely fine- just let us know on their reading record.

It is important you write a brief comment or just sign their reading record every time you read with your child, as this will give us an idea of how your child is getting on. If there aren't comments in their reading book we will assume the reading hasn't taken place on that week.

We believe that a little and often is the best recipe, so we suggest reading two/three pages every day. If your child is not confident with their blending, we recommend practising the words at the back of their book on isolation to begin with. This will improve their fluency, as sentences could feel a little overwhelming at times.

We will release new books and homework on either **Tuesday or Wednesday** (depending on how quick we can change them).

**Sound book:** practise sounds on a regular basis.

**Tricky words book:** check which high frequency words we have learnt so far on our weekly learning brief and practise those words at home on a regular basis.




### Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2021

This week in English, we have been getting creative! We created our own owl nests and used a variety of materials and objects to make the nests cosy and warm. We thought about what we could see in the baby owl's nests and tried to include these things in our own creations. This activity helped us to build description, which will help us when we write our own versions of 'Owl Babies'. We then created our own pom-pom owls. We worked very hard to follow the instructions and we didn't give up even when it seemed tricky!

In Maths, we started our shape unit. We have been identifying and investigating the properties of 2D shapes and looking at all the shapes we see around us every day. At home, you could play guess my shape with your children. Give them clues such as, 'my shape has 4 equal sides' and see if they can name your shape.



Next week is **times table's week**, so Year 1 will be practising lots of counting in **2s**, **5s** and **10s**.

In Alphabet Code, we investigated all the codes for the /ow/ sound. We discovered **ow** as in **cow** and **ou** as in **shout**.

In DT, we used our designs from last lesson to create our very own slider cards for someone special to us at home. We worked hard to follow the instructions and create our slider mechanisms.

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## Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2

Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2021

This week in English, we have been working hard to rewrite a known story in the first person. We have been exploring using conjunctions and expanded noun phrases to build suspense in our writing. It was thrilling to read our stories to the class with dramatic pauses, tone and intonation.

In Math's, we are beginning to explore multiplication as repeated addition. It has been wonderful to see Year 2 grouping and spotting patterns in their learning. Please continue to play [Times Table Rock Stars](#) to support our understanding of the 2's, 5's and 10's times tables. The login details are in the back of your homework books.

This week we enjoyed a trip to Battersea Park. We identified and named trees such as oak, willow, ash and maple. We noted the change in seasons and took the opportunity to collect a range of leaves and natural objects to incorporate into our artwork. We created an autumn tree collage and explored printmaking using natural objects. Our beautiful Poppies also made it onto the schools [Instagram](#) account if you would like to view them.

In History, we explored the term 'chronological order' we now know it means the order in which things happen. Please review this when completing this week's homework. We look forward to seeing your family time lines.

Thank you to the parents who attended our meetings this week. I really enjoyed talking to you about your child's progress. There are also appointments available on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> November.

### Learning in Year Three at Holy Trinity

What an amazing week we have had again! As November is traditionally the month of remembering, we have been busy learning about all the Remembrance celebrations that take place this month and remembering all our learning from this week.

The highlight of our week has to be when Year 3 found a poo in the middle of their classroom! A poo that had travelled all the way from the Stone Age. Luckily, it wasn't a real one. However, this fake poo was filled with food that we might have found in a real Stone Age poo. We focused on using other artefacts to give clues about the past and this artefact confirmed that people ate berries, locusts, seeds, worms and crabapples. Yummy!

In Maths we started to look at another way of representing addition and subtraction - bar models. We worked hard on our presentation of the bar models and used part-whole models to help us. We continued to work with word problems, seeking out the important information and using it to help us decide what operation to use.

In English we wrote our beautiful bed time stories. We recapped using expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials and using adverbs before showcasing our learning over the past few weeks. From the ones that Miss Dutson has marked, it seems like this could be our best piece of writing yet! Year 3, you all make fantastic authors!

In RE we looked more in depth about Remembrance Day, why we wear poppies and what different celebrations happen during the day. We listened to the Last Post and watched the laying of wreaths at the Cenotaph whilst making some beautiful poppies. We wore our poppies to the Remembrance Assembly on Thursday and impressed the whole school with our knowledge.

*Good questions to ask your child this week are:*

- *What events happen in November that make it the month of remembrance?*
- *Can you tell me an expanded noun phrase about space?*
- *Can you draw a bar model representing this equation?  $875 - 489 =$*

It was lovely to speak to some parents on Tuesday, I really enjoyed our chats and I look forward to meeting with the rest of you next week on Tuesday!

### Learning in Year 4 at Holy Trinity

Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November

This week in English, we have learned about personification. This writing device allows us to give inanimate object human qualities and brings descriptions in our stories to life. We practised writing sentences about different storms and then described the clouds, waves, and wind as if they were humans by describing how they behave, speak and move.

In Maths, we have been looking at short multiplication. We have broken down the stages to solve multiplication problems, remembering to place the greater number at the top and to include the 'x' symbol.

In RE, we used role-play to act out the story of Ruth and Naomi. We explored how sacred Ruth must have felt when she lost her husband and how in spite of this, she still remained selfless and decided to stay with Naomi.

In History, we learned about the different sports and games that Tudor children played. We had a go at playing with some Tudor toys in class and reflected on which ones were our favourites and why. We also described how they were created and how they were designed to be used.

#### Good questions to ask your child this week:

- How could you use personification to describe the sun?
- What kinds of toys did children play with in the Tudor era?
- Why do we also wear purple poppies on Remembrance Day?

**Word of the week:** personification - is when you give an inanimate object human feelings or actions.



Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity  
Friday 12<sup>th</sup> October 2021

This week in History, we started learning about crime and punishment in the Victorian period. We learnt about typical crimes including theft, pickpocketing, poisoning etc. We then acted as Victorian judges, discussing cases and what kind of Victorian punishments each one should be given. In English, we revised how to write dialogue between two characters - remembering to include punctuation inside speech marks, using synonyms for said and using a new line for each character. We then moved on to learning about words of modality and experimented how to make sentences more persuasive.

In Maths, we started to learn the process of long division. This is a long and repetitive process but with lots of practise, we will get there! To make division easier, we need to know our times tables. Don't forget to do your Times Table Rockstars for 10 minutes every day.

In Science, we revised the properties of different materials including plastic, wood, stone, glass, metal and fabric. We then investigated which type of material would be best package and protect meringues. In groups, we selected three different materials, wrapped our meringue then dropped it from a height.

Thursday was Remembrance Day, and Year 5 had the great opportunity to host the assembly at Cadogan. All the students have a piece to practise and perform at the assembly. It was a great performance for our first time and we will continue to practise our public speaking skills!

**Learning at Holy Trinity**  
**Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2021**

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In English, we have continued to focus on different writing tools to describe, such as personification, deconstructing a text to identify these key features in a piece of writing. Then we wrote our very own action opening, we wrote about the fire chase scene from the *Hunger Games*. We tried to include a variety of verbs and a range of descriptive language to create atmosphere, thinking about all of the senses to help us make our openings an exciting and gripping read. Next week we will be editing and improving our writing before beginning a new unit.

In Maths, we consolidated our learning of negative number, drawing our learning to a close. On Tuesday we practised our geometry skills, drawing and measuring angles. Then continued with our place value unit, where we began our learning on decimals, starting with tenths and hundredths.

In Science, we have been plotting data, drawing bar models to present our findings over the last few weeks on resting and active heart rate. Our lesson then took an exciting turn when Mrs Webb brought real sheep's hearts for us to dissect. We carefully used a scalpel to cut open the heart, we looked at the ventricle, arteries and veins in the heart.

In Art, we completed our pop art portraits and some of us explored shape, pattern and colour to recreate one of Yayoi Kusama's dot paintings.

In RE, we journeyed to the computer room to conduct our research on a pilgrimage a Christian may go on. In groups we found out what made that place sacred, what a Christian might see there and how someone would journey there.

In History, we learnt all about rationing during the war. Learning about the different foods that were rationed. We used playdough to weigh out the amounts that would have been rationed.

In SPAG, we have been learning about the active and passive voice.
