A special thank-you to Basma, a Year 5 parent for cooking for over 100 people with the help of her son Ali and some of our amazing kitchen staff.






# Recommended Read



## Don't Ask the Dragon (ages 4-5 & up)

It's Alem's birthday and he's all alone. He wonders where he can call home so he goes on an adventure to find out. Along the way, he meets several creatures – a bear, fox, treefrog, meercat and bulldog – who maybe know where he should go.

They don't, and they each tell him the same thing: don't ask the dragon, or he will eat you! Alem eventually stumbles across the dragon, but he's nothing like anyone expects. This particular dragon happens to be a vegetarian and a word expert, too. Along with the other animals, the wise dragon helps Alem celebrate his birthday and discover where home really is.

The first children's book from bestselling author and poet, Lemn Sissay, this is a lovely celebration of curiosity and belonging. With an overall message of home being inside you, the story is perfectly matched by wonderful vibrant illustrations.

Learning in Reception at Holy Trinity

Alphabet Code	<p>This week we reviewed the following sounds: /ow/, /oi/, /ear/</p> <p>/ow/- brown cow /oi/- coin /ear/- I hear with my ear</p>
Tricky words	<p>Please continue to go through the tricky words in their tricky words book. Thank you</p>
Literacy	<p>This week we have focused on writing sentences independently. ## Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022

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This week in English, we focused on retelling the story 'The Clock Tower' in our own words. We wrote the beginning, middle and end in stages and we tried to include powerful verbs and adverbs in our writing.

In maths, we looked at mass. We discovered that mass is the amount of matter an object contains. We looked at comparing the mass of different objects using balance scales and finding the mass of different objects using non-standard units such as cubes.

In Science, we observed and identified different plants around our school. We found a variety of plants such as, sage, mint, daffodils and hyacinths.

In Alphabet Code, we investigated all of the sounds for the /m/ code. We discovered **m** as in **mum**, **mm** as in **hammer**, **me** as in **some** and **mb** as in **thumb**.

In History, we learnt about food in the Victorian times. We discovered that rich people could afford luxuries such as spices and deserts, whereas poorer people often ate potatoes and gruel.

This week, we were treated to an African Drumming workshop to celebrate Josephine's birthday. This was such a wonderful treat that the whole class enjoyed!

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2  
Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022

Thank you all for your kindness and support this Spring term. We have loved learning and the class have worked so incredibly hard.



In Maths, we have continued our unit on fractions. We are now calculating a fraction of an amount e.g.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 12. We need to work out how many parts of the whole we need and share these equally. Please continue to practice this at home.



In English, we published and shared our final Zahra stories. These are brilliantly detailed and we are so proud with the interesting vocabulary we have included. We have also focussed on our comprehension skills, understanding what a question is asking and underlining key information in the text. I have sent some practice papers home as part of our half term homework. Please work through these with your child and ensure they are using their retrieval and inference skills.



In Art we painted and outlined our large-scale houses. These are inspired by Kandinsky's focus on lines and colour. Please come and see them as they are on display in our class. We also evaluated our fantastic habitat boxes.

### Learning in Year Three

1<sup>st</sup> April 2022

In maths we have looked at lines, shape and surfaces which gave us a good opportunity to revise our 2D and 3D shapes. We learnt some new vocabulary so we could discuss and describe the features of each shape and line.

In English we wrote our persuasive letters and edited our work with a partner. Our letters were very persuasive indeed and the emotive language produced was outstanding!

In Science we looked at our topic of Rocks & Soils, where we looked at the different properties of rocks and the three types they fit into. We discussed how each rock is formed as part of the rock cycle. We took part in an experiment where we tested the permeability and floatability of rocks and finished off the week with an edible lesson! We made 'metamorphic rock' looking at one 'rock', how it is changed by heat or pressure and when cooled, the 'rock' has another form.

- *Who was Judas?*
- *What does it mean to persuade someone?*
- *Are*

### Learning in Year 4 at Holy Trinity

Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April

This week in English, Year Four wrote a narrative recount from the perspective of the girl in the animation: 'The Girl and the Robot'. We remembered to write in the first person, to use fronted adverbials and to share the character's thoughts and feelings. We then used formal and technical language to label and describe the functions of different robots.

In Maths, we have continued looking fractions and looked at adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator. We used number lines, fraction wheels and bar models to help us work out fractions.

In RE, we continued looking at Holy Communion within the Christian faith and thought about its role within a community and its impact on the lives of Christians. In Drama, we read the story: 'The Boy, The Mole, The Fox and The Horse' by Charlie Mackesy. We reflected on what it means to be strong in life and then we invented superheroes with their own special powers of: kindness, patience and generosity.

In Geography, we mapped rivers in the UK and considered how many rivers start at the tops of mountains. Different river sources include: lakes, bogs and rainfall or a spring. A spring is where the water is released from under the ground. Rivers enter the sea or a lake and the place where the river enters the sea is called a riverbank.

#### Good questions to ask your child this week:

- What is a riverbank?
- How many different ways can you represent the fraction  $\frac{5}{6}$ ?
- Can you give a synonym for the adjective 'pensive'?

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity  
Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022

Another term done and dusted! The days and weeks are flying by.

In English, we explored the features of the NASA's Curiosity and Perseverance rovers. We used these features and their functions to write labels about our own rover – some of which are named Wonder, Explorer and Imagination. When writing our labels, we focused on using technical vocabulary, formal language (e.g. 'equipped with' rather than 'has') and using cohesive devices (e.g. meaning, so that, as, this is because).

In Maths, we focused on subtracting decimal numbers. We made sure to align the decimal and the digits in the correct place value before solving the question. Then we put our addition and subtraction skills to use by solving one-step and two-step word problems.

In Science, we learnt previous ideas people had about the Earth including the idea that the Earth is flat. We read through scientific evidence which supports the idea that the earth is a sphere, and used these to write a persuasive text.

In Religion, we learnt about the last two days of the Holy Week – Holy Saturday, a day of waiting and remembering the death of Jesus, and Easter Sunday, one of the most important days in the Christian calendar as Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. To conclude our unit, we reflected on which day of Lent and the Holy Week is the most significant for a believer.

This term, students chose to read the novel *Holes* by Louis Sachar. An overwhelming number of pupils really enjoyed the book and couldn't put the book down. For others, it was a great chance to read a book with a non-linear time sequence. On Thursday, we watched the movie adaption of the book. We made a Venn diagram, comparing and contrasting elements from the book and movie.

I hope you all have a lovely half-term – see friends and family, get outside, and most importantly, relax. We have a busy term coming up with lots of fantastic units of learning (and of course, lots of trips).

**Learning at Holy Trinity  
Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022**

A very busy week in Year 6 preparing for the Easter celebrations. In English this week, we have been looking at writing dialogue effectively, confidently understanding the features of dialogue; how dialogue can be integrated with action and using dialogue to develop a character in a piece of writing. Then developed another key writing skill for Year 6, practising using semi-colons for a list in a sentence, for descriptions, contrasting parts of a sentence and in a time sequence. In Maths, we have consolidated our learning on fractions, working through past paper reasoning questions.
