






# Middle Leadership Team at CCHT

See them gaily gad about They love to play and shout They never have any cares





It's the first day of school, and young MJ Malone couldn't be more ready! Her outfit is already picked out and her hair is freshly braided, she looks and feels great. But Mum thinks there's something missing. She bestows MJ with a glittery tiara and dubs her the queen of the classroom. MJ is determined to fulfil her duties — brighten up every room she enters, treat others with kindness, and offer a helping hand.

As we follow little MJ through her day, we see her doing all those things. Along the way, she shines as a leader, makes new friends, and shows that she is deserving of the title Queen of the Classroom.

Starting school is a major milestone for both children and parents. It is often accompanied by a range of emotions from anxiety to excitement. This fun, vibrant picture book looks at the celebratory side of the first day of school, helping to put little ones at ease.

# Reception Class

Dear Parents and carers,

What a lovely second week we have had! Well done everybody - children and parents!

It's exciting to see your little ones becoming big, independent children. They have been settling in nicely, building new friendships and exploring their new setting. We have focused on understanding and following classroom rules and boundaries as well as learning about new routines.

Next week we will begin our **Alphabet Code** lessons and we will learn the following sounds: /s/ /a/ /t/. The children will focus on identifying the initial sound in words and they will start practising their cursive letter formation. Exciting!

In Maths, we will focus on reciting numbers to 10, recognising numerals to 10, forming numbers correctly to 10 and matching numerals to quantities.

# Skills to practise at home:

- -Taking off their shoes and putting them back on.
- -Taking off their jumpers and putting them back on.
- -Packing their school bags and zipping them up.
- -Putting their coats on and zipping them up.
- -Using scissors effectively.
- -Toileting independently.

# Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1 Friday 16th September 2022

What another great week! Year One have continued to settle into the busy way of school life and really impressed Mrs Hawkins when she taught us. She couldn't believe how sensible and independent we already were!

In English this week we started to look at labels and captions. We look at the differences between them and why we would use them. We were very quick to identify a caption as a short sentence giving information about an image and a label was more one word naming an object.

In Maths we continued looking at numbers to 10, exploring 1 and how to complete missing number sequences. To find missing numbers we first looked at the first and last number given to see if the sequence was increasing or decreasing. Then we looked at the number of jumps between two given number and from that we could complete the sequence very efficiently.

In RE we discussed whether we are looking after God's Creation as he instructed us to. Unfortunately, we realised humans have done a lot of damage to the world but there is still lots of good. People clean beaches, recycle, plant trees and raise money for those in need. We then thought about what small changes or things we could do to help look after Gods Creation.

We continued with our Alphabet Code lessons where we looked at the different codes making the /ee/. We found ee as in green, ea as in tea, e as in me and ey as in key! Next week, we will be investigating all the different codes for /igh/.

In science this week, we looked at our skeletons. We learnt that without them we would look very different and that it protects our vital organs. We then had a go at making our own skeletons!

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2 Friday 16th September 2022

We have been very busy in our second week of Year 2. We have done lots of fantastic work!

We started the week by creating our class code of conduct. We chose words we would like to as learners, for example 'determined learners'. We then created our own self portraits to represent our class. We are so proud of the detail and care taken to create our beautiful portraits.

In English we have written detailed character descriptions. Not only describing our characters appearance but also her feelings, motions and thoughts. Please continue to practice using adjectives and expanded noun phrases when you work together to complete this weeks homework.

This week in Maths we compared numbers up to 40 using the terms 'greater than' and 'smaller than'. We used number lines, number squares and base tens to help us. We compared values starting the tens and then comparing the ones. We know how important the number order is and decided we would prefer to have 52 treats rather than 25.

We enjoyed our first dance lesson with Miss Beth. We learnt three new hip hop moves and worked in groups to plan, practice and perform our own dances.

In Science we worked on our observation skills with a little help from a magnifying glass. We noticed how the object we looked at became bigger, or more magnified, as we pulled the magnifying glass further away. We then sketched some magnified leaves, ensuring to add all the fine details we could see.

In Art we began our unit called Mother Nature. First, we learnt a range of interesting facts about Dutch artist, Vincent van Gogh. We then looked at some of his famous artworks and discussed different aspects of his art, including his use of colour and brushstrokes. We then created our own inspired landscapes. See Isaac's landscape to the right.

In Geography we looked at the processes that different foods go through before they get to our plate. It was very interesting to see that some foods go through a lot more processes than others! We tried fresh, frozen and processed foods to compare the differences. We were fascinated to learn about the process of keeping peas fresh.

As a reminder, please bring in green home Learning books and reading books on Tuesday. All homework will go home on Wednesday afternoon.

# Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

# Friday 16th September 2022

In Maths, we have been building on our understanding of place value, representing numbers in different ways, using inequality symbols to show how numbers compare to others and recognising the value of the hundreds, tens and ones columns.

In English, we have been looking at sentences in detail. We discovered that every sentence must have a verb and it must make sense on its own. We have been comparing simple and compound sentences. We know that a compound sentence is two independent ideas linked together using the conjunctions and, but and or. We also looked at fronted adverbials and how they add detail about how, where or when something happened. We practised writing exciting sentences using a range of joining conjunctions and fronted adverbials.

In History, we continued to investigate the Stone Age. This week, we thought about how we know facts about the Stone Age when there are no photographs or written information from the time. We then created our own cave paintings.

In Art, we looked a range of self-portraits and we created our own. We looked carefully at our features and their shapes. We also thought about how our features feel and how we would describe them.

In RE, we continued looking at our big question this term, 'What is the Bible's Big Story?' This week, we looked at the first two parts of the Bible's big story, the Creation and the Fall. We discussed what these stories tells us about God, and we thought about why Adam and Eve made the decisions they did.

Thank you to everyone who attended the Parents Meeting this week, it was so lovely to see so many of you there

# Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

# Friday 16th September 2022

It was fantastic to welcome so many parents and carers to our Year 4 class meeting on Wednesday this week. Highlights of our week in Year 4 include:

#### Maths

This week pupils:

- Used simple addition of two 4-digit numbers including regrouping (exchanging) with ones, tens, hundreds and thousands.
- Solved addition word-problems that also involved regrouping with ones, tens, hundreds and thousands.

#### Times-tables:

The children took a times-table test to work out which ones they need to focus on. Since then we have been writing-out and reciting our times-tables over the week.

#### English

This week pupils:

- Identified key events from the animated film 'Tado Jones'
- Sequenced these events in chronological order and then went on to write a recount
  of these ordered events.
- Learnt how to order paragraphs for an existing piece of writing.
- Learnt how to create compound and simple sentences and incorporated coordinating conjunctions.

#### Art:

Year 4 continued with their self-portraits and created their mini self-portraits that we will use for our Year 4 Writing Targets display.

# Science:

We continued our Living Things unit by grouping 12 animals into a Venn diagram that had three criteria: lives in water, lays eggs and breathes air. We also learnt about the life processes that organisms all have. Ask your child what the acronym MRS GREN means (hint: the seven processes of life).

# History:

Year 4 reviewed the idea of 'childhood' as opposed to 'adulthood'; plotted significant events in their lives on a timeline and considered age restrictions for children and what they can do legally. The lesson was finished with analysing children's rights as proposed by the UN (Rights of a Child).

# Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September


Week 2 and we're into the swing of things now!

In English, we have been busy 'text mapping' our diary entry from Oliver Twist. This strategy helps us to see the text, remember the text and internalise its structure. We have also recapped on different types of sentences and their punctuation, including commands, questions, and exclamations.

This week, we also were introduced to our new routine for Spelling which includes personalised word lists and phonemic (sound) related activities, and next week, dictation.

In Maths, we continued with our Place Value unit. We learnt how to write numbers in expanded form and compared numbers to find the greatest/smallest.

Later in the week, we touched on rounding numbers to the nearest ten. We placed a given number on a number line and determined which group of ten it was closer to.

# Learning at Holy Trinity Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September 2022

In English this week, we began our learning by completing a visual response to a clip from the Great Expectations. We used our listening skills to draw what we could hear in a slightly spooky sounding clip. Following on from this we used adjectives to describe what we could hear. Finally, we watched the video clip and some of us had predicted the location and setting, discussing how we can create atmosphere in our writing. Then we created a backstory for our character, Pip by 'hot seating' our character to understand him better. Learning how to 'show not tell' our character's fear as he walked through a spooking looking graveyard.

In Maths, we have continued our work on Place value and recapped that the value of each digit in a number is based on its position in the place value chart. This really helped us with reading and writing numbers up to ten million.

In History, we recapped our learning on World War II, reminding ourselves of the key people and two sides, the Axis and Allies. Using the information we gathered, we were able to create a timeline of events during the war and we are looking forward to learning more about these important events that happened during the war.

In Science, we have been learning about animals with Ms Edgeworth, understanding the difference between invertebrates and vertebrates and learning how to classify different animals.

In Art, we have continued to look at different lines and texture and have begun to plan and draw our self-portraits.

On Monday, we had an exciting afternoon meeting our sheep for the very first time! What fun we had meeting our sheep, enjoying squash and cake in the sunshine. We are looking forward to our fortnightly activities with Reception class.
