





Club information

Changes to the timetable:

- There will be no Gardening Club on Fridays. Gardening is offered between Spring Term 2 and Autumn Term
 1, so we will look to bring this back next year.
- Gardening will be replaced by Yoga with Miss Stephanie, who currently provides yoga for children during
 school time and has previously run a yoga club. This be on Fridays for Reception Class and Key Stage 1
 children. Benefits of yoga for young children includes: helps children manage their anxiety, improves
 children's emotional regulation, boosts children's self-esteem, increases children's body awareness and
 mindfulness, enhances children's concentration and memory, develops children's strength and flexibility.
- After many weeks of searching, we have found a reputable external provider (Edubox) to teach Band Club for KS2 children on Fridays, in the Cadogan Gardens building. Edubox provides a professional tuition service for schools and individuals and they have a great deal of experience teaching in primary schools nationwide. We sadly lost Mr Morely (our music teacher) at the end of the academic year and had lined up a replacement, which fell through at the last moment. All external teachers come with additional costs to the school and to make Band Club viable, we need a strong take-up from the children in order to run it. Our vision for Band Club is to give children the opportunity to learn, create and perform together and give children with experience of playing musical instruments the chance to develop their talents. The club will include learning notation, basic music theory, learning songs from musicals, films & charts, rhythmic exercises, composing songs, improvisation and opportunity to perform!

Things to remember:

- Please check the timetable, which will be sent out via email, to find out when and where your child's clubs take place.
- Clubs are booked and paid for online via School Gateway. If you need assistance with this, please contact Mr Border or either school office.
- If you need to contact the after-school team beyond 4pm, please call the clubs mobile on 07709641069.
- Children attending clubs and childcare are provided with a snack each day. We request children do not bring
 in their own snack unless it complies with the School's healthy eating snack list.
- If you have feedback about clubs, please share with us. It is always beneficial to hear your thoughts and feelings on what is working well and what we need to change/improve. You can email me at nborder@ccht.rbkc.sch.uk or simply tell me when you see me!



Learning in Reception Class at Holy Trinity Friday 21st October 2022

Dear Parents and Carers,

This is what the children have been up to this week:

English- This week, the children have continued to listen to the story The Colour Monster by Anna Llenas.

- -They planned what materials they would use to make a 'sensory bottle'. They cut out different images such as glitter, petals, pompoms etc. and stuck them on a bottle. Then, they had a go at labelling the different materials. Some children wrote the initial sound they could hear in words and others attempted to write the whole word.
- -The rest of the class made their sensory bottles.
- -We have worked on building CVC words (pig, mat, dog)

Maths- Reception have continued to compare quantities to 10 and have used the following vocabulary: more than, less than, greater than, smaller than, fewer than, the same.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 21st October 2022

What a great week, we have been continuing to work on our retrieval practice and completed our first piece of extended writing!

This week in English we finished our topic by writing our own version of a Tiger. There were some absolutely brilliant versions written, with interesting animals and deliciously described food. Then we learnt how to edit our work in green pen, what all the symbols meant that are left in our marking and how to correct them. We worked hard to correct capital letters, full stops and try our best at getting our spellings right. You should all be very proud of yourselves and the beautiful pieces of work you produced!

In maths we continued to look at subtraction, looking at both the counting on and counting back methods in more detail.

We remembered to always start with the whole when we subtract but the parts can be swapped around. We learnt about recognising the known part and using it to help us when we are working out our answer.

In science we looked at two more of our senses in more detail, using our nose to smell and tongue to taste. We learnt about how both body parts work and how our brain receives the information. We found it very interesting that some tastes and smells were liked by some people and not by others.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2 Friday 21st October 2022

Thank you for such a beautiful half term Y2! It has been so lovely to get to know you all and you are a joy to teach.

This week we performed our final dance and followed our detailed choreography to enjoy our pirate dance. We sent an email link to this so you can watch this together at home.

Thank you for your detailed homework we enjoyed sharing our favourite traditional tales and used this language to support our 'Princess and the frog' stories. We wrote a diary entry from the perspective of the frog and ensured we used a question and a first person perspective. Abudi wrote 'You won't believe what happened today, I was relaxing by my pond when suddenly...'.

In Maths we are continuing to use our vertical subtraction method to subtract two 2-digit numbers. We explored this method when regrouping is required and borrowed a group of ten from the tens column.

In RE, we explored temptation. We were tempted to resist a delicious sweet. After waiting patiently, we were able to enjoy our sweet and reflect on the feeling of temptation. We thought about times we are tempted to make a sad choice and who we can ask for help when this happens. Christians believe it is important to ask God for help. We drew our own 'helping hands' of people who would be able to help us e.g. friends, trusted adults, teachers, parents.

In art, we explored Van Goughs's Sunflowers and made our own sunflower field. We worked collaboratively to sketch, paint and shade using oil pastel. We cannot wait to put our beautiful work on display.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 21st October 2022

This week was assessment week and so Year 3 completed individual challenges for reading and maths. Everyone tried their best to independently complete their challenges, and to not give up even when some questions seemed tricky. Well done Year 3!

In English this week, we reviewed and edited our stories from last week. We read our stories back and tried to include more details, as well as responding to our teacher's marking and editing our mistakes.

History:

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity Friday 21st October

What a busy week we have had here in Year 5! This week we completed our assessments in Reading and Maths this is a great way for us to capture our current understanding and what we need to work on this year.

In English, we finished writing our diary entry as Oliver Twist. In our entry, we recapped the horrible week we had since we've met Artful Dodger and Fagin. We put to practise all the skills we have been learning about in Writing, including fronted adverbials, contractions and show not tell.

In Maths, we continued working on two-digit by two-digit multiplication. We even put our skills into practise by solving word problems which involved this type of multiplication.

In PSHE, we distinguished between expected and unexpected behaviours. Expected behaviours are those behaviours which make others around you feel comfortable, such as raising your hand to speak, using appropriate language, and contributing during group work. Unexpected behaviours are those which make others feel uncomfortable or unsafe, such as running down the stairs or saying unkind things.

This week we continued contrasting the miracles of Jesus by comparing two miracles of healing: the woman who touched Jesus' garment and the paralysed man who was lowered through the roof. We noticed the miracles showed that Jesus thought caring for individual people was more important than keeping the social conventions of the day. We also discussed that His willingness to forgive the sins of the people He healed was demonstrative of His divinity.

In Science, we concluded our work on Brilliant Scientists by exploring the vocabulary of different branches of science. We looked at root words, prefixes and syllables, and were able to connect are understanding with our learning in our English lessons.

In Computing, we reflected on our experiences of working collaboratively and individually online over the past two weeks. We learnt about when it is acceptable to change or add to another person's work, and when it isn't. We looked at what happens when we change somebody else's work on Scratch.

Learning in Year 6 at Holy Trinity Friday 21st October 2022

In English, we have begun our new unit, the Hunger Games. Still focusing on creating gripping story openings, we began our week, learning about our main character and the premise of the games. After eating a clip about the reaping, when Katniss volunteered in her sister's place, we generated questions to ask our character, to get to know her better. we created a Q &A and practised expanding our answers. Then we practised personifying the fire, giving it human emotion, action and appearance "the menacing flames licked at the feet of the girl." Using our collection of phrases and adjectives to describe fire, we were able to create our very own poem.

In Maths, we consolidated our learning on rounding and estimation. Then began our new unit, negative number. We practised ordering negative number from smallest to greatest, then calculated the difference between sets of numbers from negative to positive. In Science, we used a platform on the iPads to further research classification and microorganisms. Then we learnt about the linear system which is a system used to classify and group living things and organisms.

In PSHE, we have been looking at positive mental health. Looking at different things and strategies that can help support our mental and physical health to ensure we keep a healthy body and mind.

In SPAG, we put our spellings to the test and learnt about silent letters, 'bile' and 'able' suffixes.

In Art this week, we have used inspiration from key pop artists such as Yayoi Kusama, Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein to create our own pop art inspired portraits. Taking care with our Choice of colour and pattern.

In History, we have been investigating what it was like for Black service people during WW2. We found that there was still serration during this time, particularly in regiments they were assigned to.
