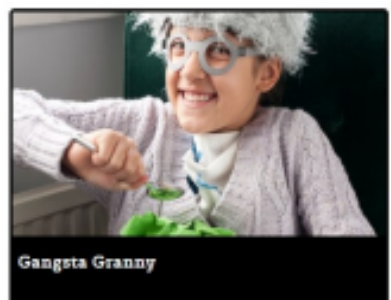
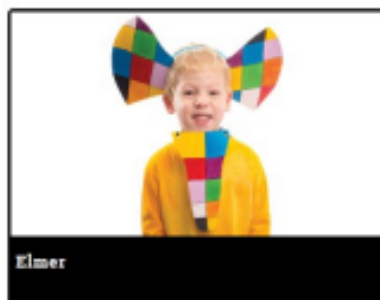
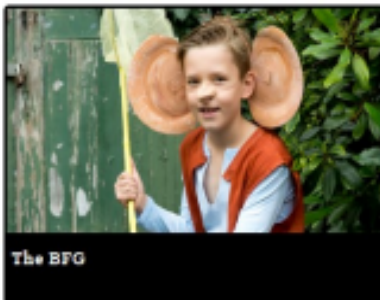

The children will take part in a range of activities on the day and be reading and listening to a variety of texts. We will also have the Book fair in school.

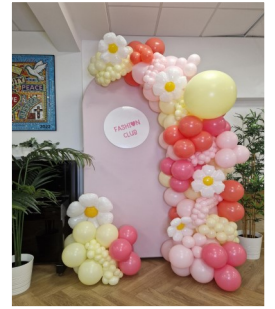

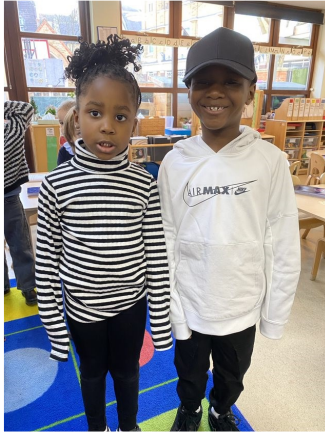

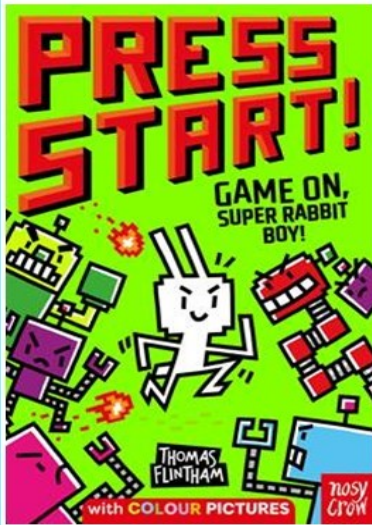

Press Start! Game On, Super Rabbit Boy! (ages 4-5 & up)

Author: Thomas Flintham Publisher: Nosy Crow



Sunny presses start and his new computer game Super Rabbit Land begins. In Animal Town the townspeople have fun all day. Singing Dog sings for them and everyone is happy. But King Viking, who lives on Mount Boom, is not happy. He kidnaps Singing Dog. Oh no! Super Rabbit Boy must complete all six levels of the quest and rescue Singing Dog. There are Robo-Crabs and Robo-Snakes to avoid. But will he have enough lives to do it?

This first chapter book has brightly coloured blockish illustrations designed especially to look like Minecraft and Lego and so has enormous young gamer appeal. Plus, the story begins a few scenes again after the character loses a life, which is an amusing reflection of computer games. The very short chapters and the relatively simple sentences – written in the present tense to add a sense of drama – mean that newly fluent readers will enjoy reading it themselves. It's also great to read together, to engage children who might not see the point of reading, or who see it as a chore. The font has been chosen to aid reading, and there are occasional speech bubbles that add fun.

The first in a super-fun colourful and accessible young series aimed specifically at early readers.

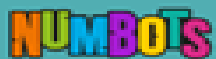

Reception

Alphabet Code	This week's new sounds are: /ow/, /oi/, /ear/. /ow/- 'brown cow' /oi/- 'lots of coins' /ear/- 'I hear with my ear'
English	On Monday, the children wrote a weekend recount without support. This gave us the opportunity to assess what they are able to achieve independently. <u>The Early Years writing goals are:</u> -To write recognisable letters -To use their sounds and codes to spell words -To write short sentences that can be read by themselves and others. -To use a capital letter at the beginning of the sentence and a full stop at the end.
Maths	In Maths, we have been reviewing <u>how to form numbers correctly</u> , saying one more/one less than a given number and 2D shapes.
Homework	This half term, we would like the children to practise their tricky words as well as to focus on their reading (we have issued two extra books). Next term, our History topic will be 'Toys from the Past'. We would like the children <u>to interview a grown up</u> and ask them about their favourite toy when they were little. What is it that you would like to find out from your grown up? You might want to ask them the following questions or create your own. -What was your favourite toy when you were little? -What material was it made of? We would like you <u>to upload a short video to class dojo</u> of your child interviewing a grown up. We will share the interviews during our History lessons. The video needs to be <u>maximum 3 minutes long</u> . Thank you 😊

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 10th February 2023

This week we had Carnival Week! We all had a fabulous week dressing up as our parents, animals and butterflies - a huge thank you to all the adults at home who helped paint faces, found costumes and made accessories!



In maths we looked at subtraction word problems, identifying the important information and finding out the answer. We used 20 frames, bead strings and number lines to help support our working out. We also looked at finding the difference between two numbers by starting with the biggest number and subtracting the given part.

In English we started reading *Dogs Don't Do Ballet* by Anna Kemp. We first discussed what we already knew about dogs and what they like to do. We were surprised to find that the dog in the book doesn't like walks or chasing balls or even bones! He likes...ballet! We worked on inferring from the text, thinking about what the dog was feeling when he was doing ballet.

We were lucky to have a visit from Year 4 this week! They came to show us their Tudor themed moving pictures and give us tips for ours. They were so helpful and even supported us making another of our pop ups. Thanks Year 4!

Thank you so much for the effort and care you have put in to our carnival week celebrations! It has been wonderful to see everyone engaging together and the class have loved it! Today we enjoyed our own Carnival party!

In our English learning we wrote an explanation text. Warning the other mice of the cunning plans Dread Cat has in store. We were very informative and persuasive.

Later in the week, we explored a range of poems and learnt a new class poem 'I think mice are rather nice', ask your child and they can recite it to you. We also wrote our own poems using a range of adverbs and adjectives. I have put a new selection of books on our Amazon wishlist. It would be wonderful to have some of these as additions to our reading corner.

In our maths learning, we have been developing our understanding of 2 and 3D shapes. We need to be clear when using key vocabulary around these such as vertices, edge and face.

Our wonderful race cars are finished! We followed our design specification and plan carefully to create our own cars. This week we enjoyed racing them- although a few had to return to the garage for repair. They will now proudly be displayed around our school. Following this you will be welcome to enjoy these at home.

In Geography we learnt about the migration of Swallows from the UK to South Africa. They enjoy the warmer climate and migrate together, travelling around 6000 miles!

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 10th February 2023

In English this week, we began our new unit on newspaper reports. For this unit, we will be using *Fantastic Mr. Fox* as our text. We started by listening to the descriptions of the farmers in the first chapter and we drew the farmers based on the descriptions we heard. We then thought about what we had learnt about Mr. Fox from the second chapter. We used this information to generate adjectives about Mr. Fox's personality and appearance.

In Maths, we practised subtracting money and we began to look at statistics. We started by interpreting tally charts and pictograms.

In RE, we looked at the Ten Commandments. In groups, we discussed which commandments we thought were the most important, and we came up with some of our own commandments to live by today.

As it has been Carnival Week this week, each afternoon, we have been making crafts for the fiesta on Friday. We have made badges, maracas and decorated biscuit bags so far!

This week, we had a wonderful trip to the V&A museum where the children took part in the Pattern, Shape and Me workshop. We explored how different symbols and patterns have been used throughout history, and we looked at using symmetry to create patterns before making some patterns of our own.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

Friday 10th February 2023

Highlights of this week include:



Maths

This week Year 4 carried out conversions between litres and millilitres which included solving simple word problems and distinguishing between 'capacity' and 'volume'. We also carried out three maths assessment papers. No small thing!

English

In English, we continued with our new unit based on Phillip Pullman's *The Firework-Makers Daughter*. Year 4 explored the reasons behind a character's behaviour and actions. In pairs, pupils wrote and performed scripts based on an argument that occurred between Lila and her father, Lalchand. Going by the performances, we definitely have many budding scriptwriters and performers in Year 4!

Science

Children built their electrical circuits in preparation for their torches which they are designing in DT. For this lesson, pupils incorporated a switch in the circuit - an important component for a well-designed torch. Pupils had to grapple with the many variables that were at play when trying to get their circuits to work. The circuits are particularly fiddly to build and required a lot of patience and determination. Everyone was successful.

Carnival

Our carnival celebrations brought many smiles to our final week of this half-term. See below pictures of a few of the amazing hairstyles and outfits that came to Year 4.

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity
Friday 10th February

What a busy week we've had here in Year 5! We are definitely all deserving of this upcoming break.

This week in English, we produced our final good copy of the story *How the Brazilian Beetle Got It's Gorgeous Coat* from the perspective of another character. We learnt the importance of editing how work to correct errors but also to make improvements in the way our sentences are structured and the words we use.

In Maths, we have continued with fractions - this is a big focus in Year 5! And to work with fractions, we must know our times table and related division facts, so please ensure your child is still practising these at home. This week, we learnt how to compare fractions that are greater than 1 and how to add fractions with different denominators. We realised that we have to change the fraction so that they both have the same denominator.

$$\frac{2}{3} + \frac{2}{9} = \frac{8}{9}$$

$$\frac{2}{3} = \frac{6}{9}$$

$$\frac{6}{9} + \frac{2}{9} = \frac{8}{9}$$

This week we finished our learning on Sikhism, all ready for our trip to the Gurdwara next term! We chose one of the ten Gurus to research, using resources on our Google Classroom. We focussed on their contributions to the Sikh faith.

In Geography, we learnt about wind and water erosion. We looked at different examples, and then we saw it happen in miniature! We made our own mini-mountains using soil, and ran water down the mountains in a mini river. We looked at how the water made its own path down the mountain, eroding the mountain as it went.

In Computing we finished our work on programming a turtle with code to draw different shapes. We uploaded our work onto Google Classroom and shared it with Mr Link.

In Science, we investigated the different methods of separating mixtures including filtration, sieving and magnetism. We had to think carefully about which object we were going to use to separate mixed up materials, for example we used a coffee filter to separate water and sugar because of the small sugar particles.

In DT, we have been working in small groups (our bands) to create and perform a song with the instruments that we have made!

Learning at Holy Trinity
Friday 10th February 2023

Another busy week of learning in year 6 alongside Carnival celebrations.

On Monday this week, we walked to the Natural History Museum for a workshop about evolution. Arriving early, we had the opportunity to walk around the incredible museum to see the dinosaurs. Children were amazed how these incredible creatures once walked our earth. Many of us put our biology learning to use and were fascinated by the fossilised remains and recreations of the muscles in the dinosaur's legs. Then we headed into the Red zone to learn all about evolution. Our first activity was identifying how a horse had evolved over millions of years, learning that they used to have 4 toes (to help them balance) and were much smaller but evolved to their environment, now having a hoof. In the next activity, we learnt how an anole lizard has evolved before exploring the evolution exhibit within the museum.

In computing, we have continued with our google sites webpage all about Manaus.

In English, we have been preparing for our next balanced argument, all about whether we should have a school uniform in school. Using PEE, we have planned our writing and made sure to include connectives and realistic, believable statistics to extend our argument.
