Recommended Read

The Táin (ages 69-11 & up)

Author: Alan Titley Illustrator: Eoin Coveney Publisher: Little Island Books



This prose re-telling of the great Irish battle epic, which was passed down in the oral tradition for about two thousand years, is accessibly written and as full of gore as the battle itself. The original was composed in Old Irish, and there have been many different versions. It is called *Táin Bó Cúailnge* in Irish and *The Cattle Raid of Cooley* in English. The plot centres on the attempt by Queen Maeve and King Ailill of Connacht to steal an enormous bull from Dáire mac Fiachna, who is an Ulsterman. Thanks to a sleeping curse on the leaders of Ulster, only one man can stop them and their large amy – the young warrior Cúchulainn, who kills everyone they send against him, one by one. Will Maeve and Ailill ever win the battle – and the bull?

With an introduction and a glossary at the back, this is a comprehensive version of the epic. It's best aimed at children of 11 and older, due to the many details of casual violence and horrible deaths. Eoin Coveney's illustrations are full of action and atmosphere, often showing battling warriors. *The Táin* is a hugely important part of Irish culture, and it will instigate discussions about war, heroism, myths and legends.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

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Friday 3rd March 2023

This week in maths, we looked at word problems. We practised decoding what the question was asking us by underlining the important information and finding the key words that showed us what operation we needed to use.

In English we looked at voicing our opinion, whether we agree or disagree with someone's opinion and using a capital letter when writing the 'l' pronoun. We read that Dad wouldn't let Biff the dog go to the ballet and we discussed with one another we agreed or disagreed and why.

This week in Forest School we went minibeast hunting. We learnt about what insects we would most likely find in the woods, what their habitats are and how to catch them safely. In groups we hunted for the minibeasts, carefully rolling logs over and inspecting what was crawling underneath. We found a giant earthworm, centipedes and even a toad! Thank you to our parent volunteers and we look forward to Forest school next Wednesday!

Thank you for such a fabulous week! It has been so wonderful to have so many exciting activities you have blown us away with your kindness and care from our trips to cheering on each other while reading aloud!

Year two beautifully represented our school on Tuesday as we visited the National Gallery. We explored the works of Monet, developed our understanding of Impressionism and even got to sketch in front of his famous water lilies. We were so impressed by the scale and layering of paint! Next week we are going to use this as inspiration for our own impressionist art. Thank you so much to parents who accompanied us and made the trip so successful.

This week we have had a big push on reading for joy! After a very convincing book vote we have new books to enjoy for our reading corner! A big thank you for parents contribution to our Amazon Wish list- we have wrapped our new gift and are opening then during story time. This have been such a highlight this week. Please continue to read widely at home, don't forget the joy of a picture book now we are looking at chapter texts. On Thursday we enjoyed a fantastic World Book Day, year two looked incredible. In our Maths learning we have continued to share into equal groups but this week we have been problem solving using fractions of amounts e.g. one third of 30. We have shared our whole in practical ways such as

sharing raisins and cubes.

Our PSHE has linked with our Science learning as we considered why we have rules. We thought about the rules that we have in our school and home and the reasons for them. We also reflected on things we could do to keep us happy and safe.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3 Friday 3rd March 2023

This week in English, we planned and wrote a newspaper article all about the events of chapter six of Fantastic Mr. Fox. Previously, we had identified the key features of a newspaper article and found these features in different texts. We then practised answering questions from the perspective of different characters. This allowed us to generate some brilliant quotes for our articles.

In Maths, we started looking at length and parameter. This week we focused on measuring lengths and understanding equivalent lengths. We know that 100cm = 1m, and 10mm = 1cm.

In our Maths Meetings, we have been focusing on becoming masters at using column method for addition and subtraction and using our strategies to solve more complex word problems.

In RE, we continued our Easter unit. This week we focused on Peter's role in the Easter Story and asked the question 'What does Peter's denial teach us about the difficulties Christians face?

In PSHE we have continued to think about communities and how different people can make up a community. We looked at the story of someone who is 'the same but different'.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

Friday 3rd March 2023

Highlights of this week include:

equivalent fractions?

What are the missing numerators and denominators of these

Maths

This week Year 4 explored fractions by:

- Folding and shading strips of paper into equal parts and then dividing the strips up further to show an equivalent fraction.
- Carrying out the short-cut method to find equivalent fractions using multiplication and division.
- Comparing equivalent fractions by finding a common denominator in order to compare 'like for like'.
- Adding two fractions together having found a common denominator.

English

In English, children created a plan for a backstory for 'Razvani', the fire-fiend from the Firework-maker's Daughter. They used a 'story mountain' to structure their stories and then peer-marked each other's plans. This involved writing down what they felt worked well in their peer's plans. They also offered suggestions for ways to make the plan even better. This was in preparation for writing their stories, next week.

Science

During our 'States of Matter' lesson this week we explored the three main states: solids, liquids and gases. Year 4 learnt that everything is made up of matter and looked at ways particles in matter are aligned. Children got to 'act' like particles by forming groups. The 'solid' group stood close together so they could not move. 'Liquids' held hands and moved together around the room. 'Gases' were free to expand around the classroom which resulted in about 5 children moving around the classroom at high speed!

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity Friday 3rd March

What a busy week we've had - in and out of the classroom!

To start off English this week, we had a look at modal verbs which show possibility or necessity, and wrote about what a Mars rover must have, should have, and could have. We also practised using the words meaning, providing, giving, and allowing to clarify meaning e.g. The rover has flexible wheels, meaning it can easily go over rough terrain.

In Maths, we learnt how to find a fraction of a quantity by using a bar chart and then mentally by using division and multiplication.


In Science, we learnt about two models of the solar system – heliocentric (sun at the centre) and geocentric (Earth at the center) – and the order of

the planets. We even made our own mnemonics to remember it! In RE this week, we learnt about Palm Sunday. We looked at how the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem is celebrated and remembered by Christians from all around the world, including South America, Africa, and right here in London! We also considered how such events create a sense of community and belonging.

On Tuesday, Year 5 went to the Central Gurdwara in Shepard's Bush to learn all about Sikhism. We explored the beautiful building, heard someone read the Guru Granth Sahib (the holy book and last guru) and learnt about different Sikh practises such as wearing a turban and the 5K's. We finished off the trip with a tasty meal at the langar, where we sat on the floor in rows which signifies equality.

On Wednesday, we were treated to a lunchtime orchestral concert at the Royal College of Music. The very talented students performed songs from the musical West Side Story.

The **Book Fair** will be held at Cadogan next week. This is a great opportunity to pick up a new, interesting book and engage children in reading. On top of that, the money goes back into the school so we can purchase reading books for in class.

Learning at Holy Trinity Friday 3rd March 2023

In English, we completed our writing on balanced arguments, thoroughly editing our work to ensure we had met each stage of the success criteria and were independent in checking our spellings for an accurate balanced argument. Then we began our new topic, Historical context (which is based on the Boy in Striped Pyjamas book). Starting off by recapping the context of this story, which was set in a concentration camp during WW2. We revised some of the key vocabulary associated with this topic: Fuhrer, concentration camp, extermination camp, Holocaust, Nazi, Final solution. In our following lesson, we looked at formal an informal language and how this changes according to who you may be addressing. Analysing the features that you would find in a formal and informal text. We used this to write our own short pieces.

On Geometry Tuesday, we have been learning about angles in a quadrilateral, which sum up to 360 degrees. Using this we were able to calculate unknown angles.

In maths, we have been revising dividing by 2- and 3-digit dividends using short division and long division methods.

On Thursday, we continued with our SATs practise, working in small groups to complete past papers, looking at skills that can help us with answering questions so we feel ready for May! In Geography, we have continued our learning on the Amazon rainforest, preparing to conduct an interview on the impact of deforestation on the Amazon rainforest. But first, we needed to gather information on the issues and the effects of this, as well as how it can be prevented. We began gathering information from a range of sources; data gathered, video evidence and
