Miss Martin delivered the sad news.











When Tyra moves in with Nan, they love to visit charity shops in search of hidden treasures and are always delighted if they find anything dragon-related, as Tyra adores dragons. Despite her exuberant personality, Tyra feels anxious about starting her new school. She worries that her classmates will think she's too bouncy or weird, just like they did in her last school. When Nan gives her an exquisite china dragon to celebrate her first day, Tyra has a great idea: she'll take it to school and everyone will be so impressed that they will want to be her friend. Unfortunately, in her haste to show it off, Tyra drops the dragon and watches in dismay as it smashes into pieces. Luckily, Tyra's teacher has a wonderful suggestion to make everything better.

This heart-warming tale sensitively explores the anxieties of starting a new school and trying to fit in, beautifully demonstrating the importance of kindness and inclusivity. The book has many specialist features designed to help dyslexic and reluctant readers, such as a special font to help avoid confusing letter shapes and short chapters to build confidence and stamina. Dynamic black-and-white illustrations perfectly capture the energy and emotion of the tale.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 21st April 2023

Welcome back everyone, I hope you all had a wonderful and sunny Easter break!

This week in maths, we recapped adding, both with regrouping and without. Then we moved onto looking at subtracting a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number without regrouping. We focused on the importance of setting out our column subtraction with the ones in the ones column and the tens in the tens column. Next week we shall start looking at subtraction with regrouping.

In English we focused on using conjunctions to join our sentences, with particular focus on using 'but' when joining two contrasting sentences. We also spoke about the importance of not overusing 'and' as a conjunction in our sentences as we need to give the reader some space to breathe!

In RE we started looking at another faith - Islam. Some of us shared any prior knowledge we had about the faith and then we all thought about some questions we would like answered by the end of the topic. We were then introduced to the Qur'an, the holy book and learnt about the different ways Muslims treat and respect the book. We related this to a book that was important to us and thought about how we might treat it respectfully.

In science we started our topic Treasure Island where we received a mysterious message in a bottle from someone stranded on an island. Together we had to think how we could help this person and we decided that this person needed to build a shelter first. We had a go at making shelters out of different materials and then used water or blew on them to test whether they were strong enough. We found that some materials were better than others, so we reported our findings back to the poor person on the island.

On Friday we ended our week with some fruity Friday adventures where we tried an amazing range of delicious fruits.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2 Friday 21st April 2023

Firstly, a big thank you to parents for your support for the school and class this week. It was wonderful to see so many of you at our parents meet to talk through our upcoming term. Please let me know if there are any links in our learning where you can share your great experience with us. It would also be fantastic to continue to see you on our Monday guest reader session. This week during our English unit we have started our new class story 'The Dark' about Laszlo overcoming his fears. To reassure Laszlo we wrote him a letter. Christopher wrote: "Please don't fear the dark, you are really safe in your home." Later we considered how 'The Dark' might feel and wrote from their prospective. Alexa wrote: "I spread around the house to try and make friends but some are scared of me."

In mathematics, we are reviewing our arithmetic skills and consolidating our addition strategies. We are focussing on using a strategy that supports the equation. For example 5 + 3, counting on from the larger number, or 53 + 28, vertical addition with regrouping.

In Art, we learned about the abstract world of Kandinsky. We then focussed on shape and colour to express feeling. To emphasis this we listened to a range of music and drew how the music made us feel.

In PE, we are practicing our tennis skills and have enjoyed playing in teams.

Today we enjoyed tasting a range of fruit for our fruity Friday! Thank you for dressing up and supporting!




Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 21st April 2023

This week in English, we read part of the book Krindlekrax. In this story, a young boy called Ruskin wants the lead role in the school play. We will be writing a persuasive letter, in first person, to Ruskin's teacher to convince him to give us the lead role. In preparation for this, we focused on the key features of a persuasive letter. These included: persuasive sentence starters, strong, emotive language, cause and effect conjunctions and hypothetical questions.

In Maths, we continued learning about fractions. This week, we have been exploring equivalent fractions. We used concrete resources to help us find and identify equivalent fractions and we used bar models to represent equivalent fractions and to help us spot patterns.



In RE, we began our unit on Buddhism. This week, we learnt about the origins of Buddhism and the life of Siddartha Gautama

In PSHE, we started our new unit all about keeping our teeth and bodies healthy. We discussed what it means to eat well and why this is important.

In Geography this week, we looked at biomes. In small groups we researched a different biome and presented our findings to the class.

A big well done to all the children for coming back to school so ready to learn this week!

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4 Friday 21st April 2023


Highlights of this week include:

Maths

This week Year 4 explored concept of 'area' and combined this with prior learning of 'perimeter'. One lesson included finding the area of items around the classroom (see pics).









English

This week we used information from 'The Museum of Extraordinary Objects' to understand how to write a label for an exhibit and plan a piece of information. This information was used to describe a collection of objects within the museum. Children had the opportunity to practise writing single and multiclause sentences and writing in the correct tense.

PHSE:

This week we investigated how everyday choices can affect the environment. We considered how 'fast fashion' impacts the environment and what people choose to buy or spend money on can affect other people and our planet.

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity Friday 21st April

Welcome back to our final term in Year 5! What an exciting few months we have ahead of us.


This week we started our new English unit, Perseus and Medusa. We have been learning the text off-by-heart whilst also improving our reading fluency, and acted out the text. Next week, we will look at how the text is structured.


In Maths, we started to learn about area which is the space inside a 2D shape. We started off by counting the squares inside a shape, then used our array and multiplication knowledge to mentally calculate the area of rectilinear shapes.

In Science we started our new topic, Plants and Lifecyles. We learnt that all living things have to reproduce to make more copies of themselves, and plants can reproduce sexually through pollination.

In PSHE, we began learning about the adult world. We discussed why adults have jobs and how money moves around an economy.

In computing, we looked at home images are created on a computer and used Google Drawing to create our own personalised images of houses. We will go on to looking at how logos are created.





In RE, we returned to our learning on Sikhism, resuming with the sixth guru, who was a warrior. We had a very interesting discussion on the moral implications involved in a warrior leading a religion, and whether violence can be justified if it is self-defence.

On Tuesday, we had a wonderful trip to Wesminster Abbey. We saw the coronation chair, the grave of the unknown warrior, Poets' corner and many other well-known people who are buried or remembered in the abbey.

Last term, we created our own piece of drama with Mr. Tolley. We have worked incredibly hard – writing our own scripts, working with different people and remembering our lines. This week, we did our last run-through in the Holy Trinity Cellar Theatre. Next Friday (28th April) we will be performing our drama at 2:00pm. We would really appreciate your support in coming to watch us ③

Learning in Year 6 at Holy Trinity Friday 21st April 2023

In Maths this week, we have continued with our learning on fractions. Revising comparing and ordering fractions by finding a common denominator. We then moved on to adding and subtracting fractions within 1, where the denominators are multiples of the same number. On Geometry Tuesday, we practised reflecting shape into another quadrant along the x and y axis. On Wednesday, we have been revising area and perimeter, finding each of these in a range of parallelograms.

In English this week, we have been preparing for our last big write on historical context (Boy in Striped Pyjamas unit). We began by revisiting our characters, particularly, our main character, Bruno. Working in pairs, we took it in turns to interview the character, Shmuel on the events that had occurred on the alternative ending we will be writing for the Boy in Striped Pyjamas. During this interview, we were able to gather ample information to create a rich story. After spending some time planning this, ensuring to include a number of writing devices. Next week, we will be spending more time writing, making sure that our work is to a high standard and editing to further improve.

On Tuesday this week, we took a short trip to the Saatchi Gallery, to visit the 'Beyond the streets' exhibition, which links to our Art unit, Moving Figures. We thoroughly enjoyed this exhibit, and it was fantastic to see some of Keith Haring's work in real life! This gave us inspiration for our next piece of work.

In RE, we have been learning about the Pentecost, discussing our big question, 'How did the Christian message first spread?'

In History, we continued our learning on the Vikings, focusing on where these warriors travelled. looking at a number of sources, which taught us about where the Vikings settled, raided and traded.
