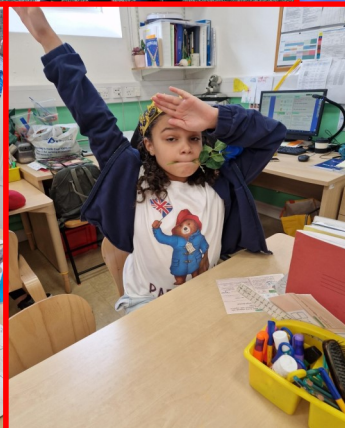
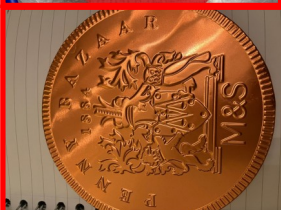

Coram's Fields has been a haven for play since 1936. Located in the heart of London, the park has an exciting mix of play zones for all ages plus two wide lawns for picnics. The adventure play area has a zip wire, a witch's hat swing and one of the largest slides in town. And, with two sandpits and a paddling pool, you may want to pack swim gear! Coram's Fields has a policy of not allowing any adults to enter unless they are accompanied by a child under 16 years old.

THE PERFORM THEATRE

The Perform Theatre is a 500 seat fully-equipped air-conditioned auditorium with flat and tiered seating and designed to be a complete theatre experience. There is a merchandise shop, open air and covered café, buggy park and male and female toilets. Accessible toilets and baby-changing facilities are located just outside the site.

CASTAWAY'S CAFÉ

Open all day every day, the café has seating in open air and covered areas so, no matter what the weather, it's a great place for a snack before or after a performance.

Address: Coram's Fields, 93 Guilford Street, London WC1N 1DN. Nearest tubes: Russell Square, Kings Cross St Pancras, Holborn & Chancery Lane. Nearest buses: 17, 45, 6, 46 at Gray's Inn Road or the 7, 59, 68, 91, 168 & 188 at Russell Square.

The auditorium opens 30 minutes before the start of each performance.

Healthy Packed Lunches

Please see the table below for CCHT healthy packed lunch guidance. Whilst we prefer all the children to have a school lunch, we understand that for various reasons there are some who have a packed lunch. Please use the table for ideas on how to vary your child's healthy packed lunch. Together we can help keep their bodies and brains working well.

Please be reminded that all children should have a snack for morning break time to help carry them through until lunchtime, this should be a piece of fruit or vegetables only.

Here are some examples of items that are advertised as healthy choices but do not nutritionally fit into our healthy lunch guidance.



Packed Lunch Information

What is a healthy packed lunch?

A healthy packed lunch is a balanced meal providing a variety of nutrients, to be found in four food groups:



Starchy Foods

Base each meal on a starchy food, such as bread, potato, rice, pasta, yam. Starchy foods give energy, fibre, vitamins and minerals.

- ☺ Bread, try different types, such as sliced bread, wraps, chapattis, bread rolls, bagels or naan bread.
- ☺ Other starchy foods, such as pasta, potato, couscous or rice.
- ✓ Whole grain varieties are best for fibre, which is vital for a healthy digestive system.



Meat and Alternatives

Add some protein, for example meat, fish, eggs, beans or pulses. Protein foods build muscles and provide minerals.

- ☺ Lean meats, such as chicken, turkey or ham.
- ☺ Include oily fish, such as fresh tuna, sardines or mackerel at least once every three weeks.
- ☺ Cheese, such as cottage cheese, edam, cheddar or soft cheese.
- ☺ Egg, such as boiled, quiche or omelette.
- ☺ Meat alternatives, such as quorn or tofu.
- ☺ Dishes containing pulses, beans or meat, for example curry or falafel.



Drinks

Drinks, especially water, help children to concentrate and feel well. Water is freely available in school.

- ✗ The school has a water-only policy so please do not put any other drinks in the packed lunch.



Milk and Dairy Foods

Include a dairy product or dairy alternative, such as cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais or tzatziki. These foods provide calcium necessary for strong bones and teeth, as well as providing protein and vitamins.



Fruit and Vegetables

Don't forget to include fruit and vegetables. You can use fresh, frozen, tinned or dried. Fruit and vegetables are full of vitamins, minerals and fibre necessary for the body to function properly and to keep you strong and healthy.

- ☺ Add tomato, lettuce, cucumber or apple to a sandwich.
- ☺ A vegetable dish, such as vegetable curry, salad or roast vegetables.
- ☺ Fresh fruit, such as apple, banana, pear or satsumas.
- ☺ Dried fruit, such as raisins, apricots or dates.
- ☺ Fruit salad (fresh or tinned in juice) or vegetable salad.
- ☺ Finger foods, such as cherry tomatoes, carrot or slices of pepper. Good with a dip, such as taramasalata or salsa.
- ✓ Use fresh fruit and vegetables, which are in season to help the environment and enjoy variety!
- ✓ All packed lunches should contain at least one item of fruit, vegetable or salad.



- ✗ The school has a no peanuts or nuts policy as some children are allergic to these.
- ✗ Please do not put chocolate, biscuits, crisp-like products or fizzy drinks in packed lunches.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 12th May 2023

This week in maths, we looked at using repeated addition when talking about equal groups of an amount. As the week progressed, we realised that repeated addition can be represented as multiplication equations! We looked at using arrays to support our understanding and using terminology like 'lots of' when talking about the multiplication symbol.

In English we read the story of Alan's Big, Scary Teeth and made predictions about what we thought would happen next. Then we created a fantastic word bank of adjectives that described Alan and used these to create some wonderful character descriptions. We also looked at different forms of punctuation - question marks and exclamation marks. We discussed when it is best to use them and how they replace a full stop at the end of sentences.

In RE we learnt about how Muslim babies are welcomed into the world. We learnt that the first words the baby hears is the Adhaan, a call to prayer which the father whispers into the baby's right ear. We discussed the importance of this and what we might want to say to a newborn baby.

On Thursday we went to the Science Museum for a fun filled, interactive trip. We spent the day recapping our learning so far in our science lessons and getting very wet! Thank you to all the lovely adults who joined us.

Friday 12th May 2023

This week we have reviewed our multiplication and division recall through the support of arrays. We have used Weetos to build our own representations using columns and rows. In English, we have finalised our own stories and after careful editing and revisions we have wrote our final stories. We have following our plans carefully and ensured the structure is similar to our inspired story 'The Dark'.

In our History lesson we learnt about Felicity Aston polar explorations. In 2011 she was the first woman to ski across Antarctica alone. She travelled 1744km and it took her 59 days. Following this she lead further group expeditions and later won an MBE in 2015. We wrote a detailed news report full of expanded noun phrases to engage the reader with our fun facts.



In our PE lessons we are developing our tennis skills and can now hit tennis balls over a net! We are also finalising the steps in our Dance routine ready for a class performance.

In Computing we are making our own Music on [Chrome Music Lab](#). Please explore this at home it is a fantastic tool and this week we made our own rhyme patterns.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 12th May 2023

This week in **English**, we started to think about the process of writing our newspaper report. We recapped what a witness is and then thought of interesting questions we might like to ask two characters from the animation to elicit interesting information. We looked at the difference between closed questions and open questions and tried to use a range of open question starters. We then thought about how the characters might respond to these questions, using evidence from the story. We used these responses to write speech sentences, practising punctuating speech correctly.

In **Maths**, we continued learning about time. We looked at the number of days in each month and the number of hours in a day. We then used this information to answer more complex word problems.

In **PSHE** this week, we discussed how we keep ourselves safe online. We talked about how important it is not to reveal personal information online and to always tell a grownup when something makes us feel uncomfortable. Please continue to have these discussions at home.

In **RE**, we continued learning about Buddhism. This week, we looked at the four noble truths and we thought about what causes suffering in the world. We then thought about whether always getting what you want makes you really happy.

In **Art**, we have been looking at the work of Lauren Child and Quentin Blake. We have compared their art styles, learnt some facts about their lives and imitated their style in our work.

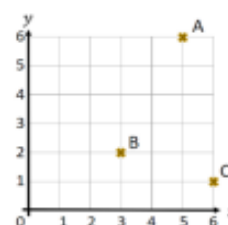
