

The Department For Education and The Eden Project have joined forces to send packets of Wildflower seeds to primary school children across the country to



celebrate the coronation of the King.

'This initiative is inspired by the King's commitment to the environment. If planted together, around 40 rugby pitch sized wildflowers meadows would be created. The packets of seeds include native annual wildflower species, like cornflower, corn poppy and corn chamomile.

Planting the seeds will be an opportunity for children to engage with the natural world and learn more about the importance of biodiversity, as well as being a way for them to celebrate a historic national moment.'

Desperate to impress her criminal family, 12-year-old Jude Ripon steals some rare magic from the Westons, one of the most powerful families in Farrowfell. Jude is infuriated when she realises that the magic is protected by a curse, which can only be lifted by returning it to the rightful owners. Unfortunately, this is impossible, as Mr and Mrs Weston have been missing for over a year. Reluctantly, Jude agrees to help the Weston children, Fin and Eri, to find their parents, as she knows this is the only way she can shake off the curse.

The three children hunt for clues and piece together evidence, while taking care to avoid the Lilthrum, blood-thirsty monsters formed from raw magic, whose deadly attacks on people have been increasing at an alarming rate. As Jude spends more time with Fin and Eri, she is surprised as she experiences friendship and kindness for the first time. This week we were finished our topic of multiplication by looking at the inverse operation, division. We looked at what division meant, to share equally. We had a practice with sharing different amounts of objects and even challenged ourselves to write division equations!

For the second part of the week, we started our new topic of time. We first discussed what morning, afternoon and evening were and what activities we might be doing at those times. Then we had an active afternoon timing how many times we could do an activity in 20 seconds. We were quite impressed with how many star jumps we could do within that time!

In English we completed an extended piece of writing, a retell of Alan's Big, Scary Teeth making sure we showed how good we were in our writing. We focused on using adjectives, conjunctions, exclamation and question marks and remembering to use capital letters and full stops. Everyone worked hard on keeping their handwriting neat, making sure it was a sensible size and on the line.

In science we learnt about invertebrates, animals that don't have a backbone. We loved sharing our prior knowledge about animals and were great at sorting the animals into those that were invertebrates and those that are vertebrates.

In RE we learnt why prayer is so important to Muslims. We recapped the way that Muslims get ready to pray and how prayer might help them lead a good life. We discussed the fact that prayer is their chance to have a conversation with Allah, they use a prayer mat and make sure they are facing towards Mecca.

Thank you for your support and kindness this term! We have achieved so much and the year two team are so immensely proud of your beautiful children. This week we have completed our beautiful inspired blossom following a tour of 'Chelsea in Bloom'. A photocopy of their beautiful zoomed in blossoms has been sent home. We also used this as an opportunity to identify a range of plants and flowers to consolidate our 'young gardeners' science unit. Where possible please continue to discuss plant life cycles and stages of growth. We now know what a plant needs to survive and how we can help the world around us.

To finish out 'Great Explorers' unit I would love you to complete some research on an explorers of your choice. Please bring your research poster with you to explore a day on Friday, the 9th of June. Please also dress as your explorer for the day, we will use this as an opportunity to learn more about great explorers from each other so be prepared to answer questions and share your wonderful learning.

As we have loved our Explorer unit so much we have used it as inspiration to write our own adventure stories. This week we went on many adventures from climbing the Himalayas to trekking through the Moroccan rainforest! These stories were full of expanded, noun, phrases and interesting use of speech.

In maths, we have been completing our understanding of division using arrays. We have consolidated are learning on sharing into equal parts using cubes and counters.

In PE, we have been completing a range of relay races to prepare for sports day, which will take place on Thursday 15th June.

We also completed our final lesson on Islam this half term as we explored the importance of a pilgrimage and why this is asked of Muslims.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 26th May 2023

In **English** this week, we planned and wrote our newspaper articles about the exciting event that took place in SpyFox. We set out our books in the style of a newspaper ourselves and tried to include the key features of a newspaper article. We also tried to include answers to the five Ws within our article (who/what/where/when/why).

In **Maths**, we continued learning about time. This week, we looked at telling time to the nearest five minutes, sorting times from am to pm and telling time on a 24-hour clock.

In **RE**, we continued learning about Buddhism. This week, we thought about how one might follow the eightfold path and what each instruction means.

In **Geography**, we recapped some of our learning on biomes and climate zones. We then thought about how life might be different for people who live in different climate zones. Then, we watched a video which compared the lives of two children, one from Manchester in the UK and the other from Townsend Australia.

In **Science**, we have continued learning about forces and magnets. Last week, we conducted an experiment to test whether all magnets have the same strength. Some pictures from our experiment can be seen on the left 🐵

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4



Highlights of this week include:

Maths

This week we:

- Completed two maths assessments.
- Learnt how to present data on a line graph by plotting data on the horizontal and vertical axis.
- Compared and classify triangles by explaining the difference between a scalene, an isosceles and an equilateral triangle.




Describe the triangle as fully as you can.

English

Year 4 wrote a letter to the 'selfish' giant telling him how his actions have shaped his character. The children created inference statements and many synonyms for 'selfish' to describe the giant's attributes. They then described (in writing) their feelings about playing in the giant's garden using adjectives, conjunctions and prepositions. Their writing included switching between the past and present tense.

RE

We explored the concept of ahimsa as part of our unit on Hinduism. Part of the lesson included the children writing 4 pieces of 'wisdom' to guide people to lead a life of nonviolence.

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity Friday 26th May

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This week we have been working extra hard to complete our Spelling and Reading assessments. In Maths, we have been revisiting decimals. We practised adding and subtracting decimals within 1, and making sure we understand what 'regrouping' is and when we use it.

In Religion, we finished our learning on Sikhism by studying the 10th guru, who created a band of men

to protect the weak. We looked at the 5 K's that each member carried, and Sikhs still do today: a comb, shorts, a bracelet, a dagger and deciding not to cut their hair.

In PSHE, we discussed why adults have jobs, how we can contribute to our community and what volunteering means. We split into two teams and had a guiz on what we have learned.

In Computing, we grouped parts of our vector drawing together and added backgrounds. We managed to change different parts of our pictures, including enlarging, flipping, and changing colours.



On Monday, Year 5 visited Kew Gardens. We explored the Marianne North Gallery, where we picked a painting of hers to sketch. Marianne North was a woman in the Victorian Era who travelled to many exotic places around the world and drew pictures of different plants and landscapes. We then explored some of the greenhouses in the gardens and got to play in the children's garden.

On Tuesday, Year 5 visited the Year 1 students who had some questions about coasts and Osmington Bay. We explained what a coast was, described the fossils we found and explained what activities we did throughout the week.

Learning in Year 6 at Holy Trinity Friday 26th May 2023

Lots more Drama this week, rehearsing in the cellar Theatre, we are becoming more confident in our positions on stage and moving around, making full use of the space, making contact with other actors, whilst performing our lines! We have been working very hard on learning our lines and speaking clearly and fluently. There will be lots of learning of lines over the Half Term, ready to return to rehearsals without scripts!

In English, we continued with our topic on biographies, looking into the features of a biography. We discussed how biographies are broken into chunks under subject specific subheadings about the person's life and how these are usually ordered chronologically. Practising this, we ordered an example of a biography and came up with appropriate subheadings.

In Maths, we have been practising finding a fraction of a whole amount. Dividing the amount by the denominator and multiplying by the numerator.

In PSHE, we talked about adults we can trust and who we can go to when we need help.
