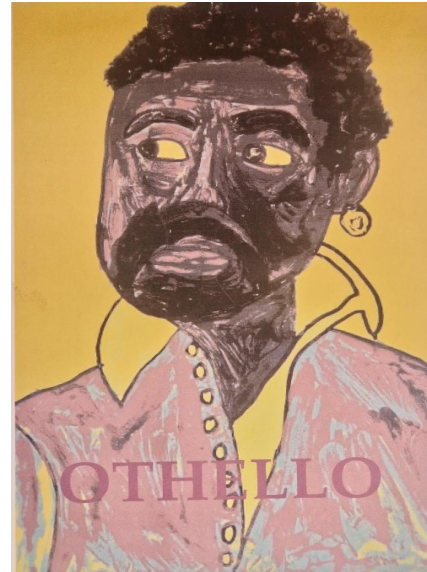

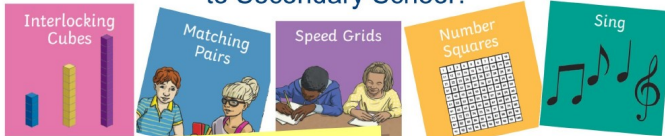

TIMES TABLE WORKSHOP

Would you like to know how best to support your child at home to be successful in school maths right through to Secondary School?

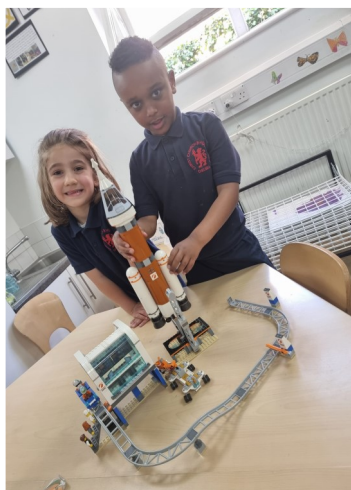

Time Travel Twins: The Viking attack (ages 6-8 & up)

Twins Scarlett and Thomas have a grandad with a time machine! When Thomas is struggling with his homework on Vikings, Grandad suggests he meets some. So Thomas whooshes back to the year 859AD, but without the crucial device to bring him home. Now Scarlett will have to go after him!

Thomas appears in the middle of a Viking longship, amid men keen to fight and steal from Wessex villagers. Meanwhile, Scarlett lands in a pig sty, in a Wessex village, and makes friends with a boy called Alfred. (Eventually to become King Alfred, in fact.) As the twins try to blend in, they quickly realise they're headed towards each other, armed with swords and shields. Can they avoid fighting their new friends, stay alive and return home safely?

Packed with facts about life in the ninth century, and with a historical note at the back, this story is exciting and informative. The chapters switch between the twins' points of view, which reminds readers that there are always two sides to history.

Registration

- All helpers who have signed up need to meet at 9.15am at Battersea park where Mr Henwood will brief you on the day's proceedings and your particular responsibilities. **If you are helping on the day could you, please still send your children to school first.** All children need to walk to Battersea Park from school.

Collection

- If you wish to take your child straight home after Sports Day activities have finished, please ensure that the class teacher is notified. If you are taking another parent's/carer's child home with your child, we will require written permission from the child's parent/carer.

We have started the new half term on a very positive note! The children loved their trip to Forest School and it was good practise before Year 1!

This week, in **English**, the children listened to the story of The Rainbow Fish. They thought of adjectives to describe the fish physical features as well as how he felt throughout the story.

In Maths, we reviewed 3D shapes, number bonds to 10 and comparing numbers (greater than, smaller than).

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 9th June 2023

Welcome back everyone! I hope you all had a wonderful half term break and well done for returning to school ready to learn.

In maths we continued looking at time, in particular reading it on an analogue clock. We learnt about the minute and hour hand, and how the position of the longer minute hand tells us whether it is o'clock or half past the hour.

In English we started our new topic of Hibernation Hotel where we dived straight into showing how many fabulous adjectives we knew. We used these in expanded noun phrases, being careful to separate the adjectives with commas. Then we focused on using conjunctions to join two sentences together but making sure only to use 'and' once, so our sentences weren't too long.

In computing we had a lesson all about e-safety, learning about what makes a secure password and why we need passwords. We also spoke about what information we should not share online such as our address, full name and our birthday. Then we had a very interesting discussion about ownership of things we put online, such as photos and pictures we have drawn. We discussed that even though our name could be on a picture, when we put it online, anyone can access it.

In RE we concluded our Islamic topic. We were given a selection of pictures and artefacts and on post-it notes we wrote information that we had been taught about each item. We remembered a lot of information, such as Muslims pray five times a day, their holy book is the Qur'an and they rub date juice on a baby's gums as they want their first taste to be sweet.

Thank you to all the lovely parents for your time in meetings this week, it was great to celebrate how well your little ones have done this year. I look forward to seeing the rest of you next week.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2
Friday 9th June 2023

Thank you for a fantastic week of learning, it was so wonderful to see so many of you during our parent meetings and book looks. We are so immensely proud of all your beautiful children continue to achieve.

In English this week we have been focussing on using a range of conjunctions, particularly if, or, so, and when. These conjunctions help to expand our ideas and form compound sentences. Please continue to encourage these when you complete any writing at home. This week wrote detailed recounts about our half term holidays. It sounds as though you have had a beautiful break. Later we finished our learning on 'The Piano and the Bear' as we wrote a letter to the bears in the forest describing 'our' adventures in the city. We included a range of comparative adjectives to describe the forest and the city.



During our Maths lessons we have been using scales to check our predictions about the mass of a range of objects. If you have any scales at home please practice the skill of reading scales and weigh a range of items.

In Science, we have begun a new unit on 'Little Master Chefs', during this topic we will make a range of healthy snacks and meals and focus on healthy food choices, planning and preparing meals. Next Friday, we are meeting chefs at Pizza Express as we make our own pizzas.

In Geography we have reviewed the countries in the UK and began to use maps to identify counties. We used a map to find the county of West Sussex and our beach, West Wittering. We are very excited for our trip to the beach on Tuesday 11th July. All parents are welcome to meet us there and enjoy the day. A few parents will be able to join us on the coach, thank you so much for the interest, we will be drawing names from a hat soon.

Another huge thank you for your care and thought behind our Explorer Day costumes and research. The class were so excited to share all you had prepared at home! We hope you enjoyed our presentation in Special Mentions. I will get some photos out to you all soon!

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 9th June 2023

In **English** this week, we started our new book for this unit which is Arthur and the Golden Rope. In this story, Arthur is called an 'unlikely hero', so we began by stating what we think the qualities of a hero are and then looking for clues in the text that tell us why Arthur might be an unlikely hero. We then planned our own short story based on Arthur's adventures and looked at the features of a good story.

In **Maths**, we continued learning about time. This week, we have focused on duration, counting around the clock in fives and finding start and end times of an activity.

In **RE**, we looked at our big question for this unit which is 'Who is Jesus?'. We began by thinking about the things we need in life to sustain us and which of these are the most and least important. Then, we looked at a passage from the Bible where Jesus describes himself as the bread of life. We thought about what Jesus may have meant by this.

In **History**, we began our unit on the Romans. Our classroom was turned into a Roman museum where we explored different Roman artefacts. We looked at each artefact carefully and we thought about the possible uses of each item. We drew detailed pictures of some of the artefacts in our books with labels.

Well done for a fabulous first week back! A good start to our final half term in Year 3 😊

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

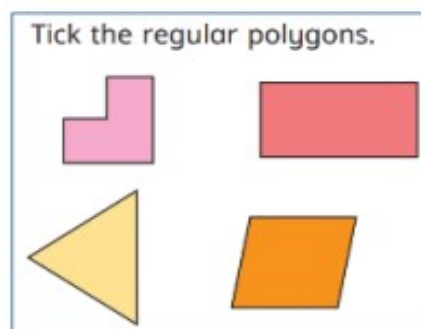
Friday 9th June 2023

Highlights of this week include:

Maths

This week we:

- Reviewed learning on Statistics and Coordinates
- Classified quadrilaterals and polygons based on their properties and sizes.
- Recognise lines of symmetry in 2-D shapes presented in different orientations



English

We continued with reading the *Selfish Giant* and identified examples of personification, such as, '*Snow danced about through the trees.*' Year 4 quickly worked out that this meant that the snow was probably moving around in the air, by the wind. We then, recalled synonyms for the adjective 'sad', to use to describe why the giant may feel 'sad' (and lonely). Children had to justify, using the text, why they thought he may feel this way. Finally, we identified opposites and antonyms to support writing a persuasive letter from the giant to the children.

Science

This week, Year 4 reconstructed the digestive system using crackers and bread, plastic bags (mouth and stomach), water (saliva), orange juice (stomach acids) one leg of a pair of tights (the intestine). See photos below(!).

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity
Friday 9th June 2023

Welcome back to our final term in Year 5! This year has flown by.

This week in Maths, we learnt how to add and subtract decimals with a different number of decimal places e.g. $1.4 + 0.568$. We realised the importance of lining up the decimal point and our digits correctly - otherwise our answer wouldn't make sense. Later in the week, we practised multiplying decimals by 10, 100 and 1000, using a place value chart to help.

In English, we started learning our new text - *How to Catch a Minotaur: A Step-by-Step Guide*. We will use this text to improve our reading fluency, making sure to attend to punctuation and read as if we were talking. In class, we pulled apart the text to find interesting vocabulary and then acted it out in groups.

In Art, we used our notes from our half-term homework to help us understand the artist El Anatsui a little better. We then practised using shading to recreate one of his artworks.

This week we started our new units of work in both Religion and Science. In Religion, we started to look at the religious variety in Chelsea and Battersea. We made a survey of all the religions that we have in our class and made posters to present our findings.

In Science, we started looking at how humans and animals change as we grow up and grow old. We looked at ultrasound pictures of babies before they are born and compared different stages of development. We also learnt what a gestation period is and next week we shall compare the gestation periods of different animals.

In Computing, we started our new half term with a lesson on online safety. We looked at when we should or shouldn't give permissions to Apps, and we explored what makes a strong password. We also discussed how we can sometimes reveal personal information without realising it.

**Learning at Holy Trinity
Friday 9th June 2023**

Lots more Drama this week, rehearsing in the cellar Theatre, we are becoming more confident in our positions on stage and moving around, making full use of the space, making contact with other actors, whilst performing our lines! We also looked at synonyms for Obama, to avoid using the same name all the time in our writing. Using our answers gathered, we discussed how these could be used in our writing as direct quotes or reported speech.

In Science, we have been revisiting electricity, putting our knowledge to the test with a quiz.

In Maths, we have been revising percentages, finding the equivalent fraction and decimal. We then looked at how we can find the percentage of an amount, starting with finding 50%, 10%, 20% and 5%.

In computing, we used tinkercad to produce a 3D model of a physical object, which contained a number of 3D objects. These objects had to be rotated and placed into position in relation to other 3D objects, considering the size of the objects relative to each other.

In PSHE, we had our first lesson with Saskia, understanding how babies are conceived and how they need to be cared for.
