Graduations




Graduations are very important opportunities for us all to celebrate the children's hard work and achievement.

Windrush Day 2023 - 75th Anniversary

Windrush Day takes place on 22nd June, remembering the day when more than 800 passengers from the Caribbean arrived at the Tilbury Docks in 1948. Yesterday marked the 75th anniversary of this historical event, a symbolic moment in the history of Black British contribution to the UK.

During this time, the UK needed workers to come and build up the country after the destruction of the war and many different jobs were advertised to people from the Caribbean and other parts of the world. Many of these men and women had served in the British Armed forces because at the time their countries were still ruled by Britain and were not yet independent.

On 22nd June 1948 the Empire Windrush ship left the Caribbean to travel thousands of miles to the UK, the first time many of them had left their homes. For many, a very scary time but also slightly exciting. However, When the passengers arrived they didn't get the friendly welcome they had hoped for. Many of them experienced racism and discrimination and found it hard to get homes to live in or to find work. Some companies and landlords said they did not want black people working for them or living in their

properties, they even displayed very racist signs like this one. Eventually acts like these were made illegal, but unfortunately these laws didn't always stop all racism and discrimination, but were an important step in reducing it.

Unfortunately some people are still subjected to racism of different levels today.

The contribution that the Windrush generation and their descendants brought to the UK cannot be underestimated, it is invaluable. Finally In 2018 the UK government announced a day to celebrate this contribution - Windrush Day - that would be held annually on 22nd June.

Helping you feel well this summer

113	STAY SHADED	Stay shaded and out of the sun from 11am and 3pm, wear a hat and light clothing to cover up.
	STAY SENSIBLE	If you are having a summer BBQ, ensure that food is stored and cooked safely.
	STAY AWARE	Be a good neighbour and look after those who may need a helping hand during the hot weather.
	STAY SAFE	Pharmacies can be found locally. Your local pharmacist can give you medicine to help with hayfever.
STR	STAY PROTECTED	Always make sure you are protected from the sun, choose a sun protection factor (SPF) of 30 or higher.
	STAY HYDRATED	Keep yourself hydrated, by drinking plenty of water and avoid excess alcohol and caffeine.

Sun Safety

As the weather is changing and we are seeing more sunny days, children will be exposed to the sun and we would like to share some sun safety tips. Please make sure that:

- children come to school with a water bottle
- a hat
- wearing sun screen and have sun screen in their bag particularly on swimming days (Y3/Y4 only)

In addition, the NHS states that you should take extra care in the sun if:

- have pale, white or light brown skin
- have freckles or red or fair hair
- tend to burn rather than tan
- have many moles
- have skin problems relating to a medical condition
- are only exposed to intense sun occasionally (for example, while on holiday)
- have a family history of skin cancer

Friday 23rd June

This week we:

- Used holidays and travel as a focus for our writing in our English lessons. We described our dream holiday and discussed the purpose of writing a postcard. We described a beach scene and wrote a list of items that we would need to pack in our suitcases.
- Explored numerical patterns within 20 in our Maths Meetings. We revisited number bonds and subtraction facts. We also identified one more and one less than a given number.

Learning at Christ Church in Year 1

Friday 23rd June 2023

In English this week, Year One we finished our topic on 'Hibernation Hotel' and began out unit on 'Julian is a Mermaid'. We then thought about what a command is and thought of different commands we could give to Julian to help him be a better mermaid.

In Maths this week, we looked at money. We then counted using money. We looked at both coins and notes at learnt that notes hold the highest value so we can buy more using these.

In DT, we explored many different playgrounds, we looked online of lots of different playgrounds around the world. We then investigated our own playground and voted for our favourite piece of playground equipment.

In Reading, we continued reading Superworm, were we noticed that it is written in the style of a poem that rhymes. We then looked at the words that are repeated often in the book.

In Geography, this week we looked at different cities around the world. We looked at Beijing, Sydney, New York and London. We then compared similarities and differences between these cities.

For Alphabet Code we have been revising the /j/ codes.

Learning in Year 2 at Christ Church

In Maths we have revised place value and started to look at numbers to 1000. We have focused on addition with three digits and next week we will move onto subtraction and problem-solving tasks.

In English we have a new book called Grandma and Me. It's a beautiful story about a young Iranian girl and her special relationship with her grandma. We have been exploring the characters and describing their traits using expanded noun phrases. Over the next few weeks we will look more at the setting of the story and learn more about Iranian culture.

In RE we have been exploring Christianity and what it means to belong to a community. We learnt about baptism and the symbols associated. We had an opportunity to talk to Father Sam about baptism at our clergy and he told us that he once baptized someone at aged 91! We will continue learning about baptisms next week.

Last week in DT we started a new project making Joseph's technicolour coat. Mrs Davies is helping us learn how to develop a design, make a pattern and use different techniques for joining fabric. It will take some patience and persistence but I know the final products will be amazing!

Learning in Year 3 at Christ Church

Friday 23rd June 2023

Year 3 spent time this week preparing for their pop up restaurant on Tuesday evening which was a roaring success! They made over 100 breadsticks, and whisked up delicious tiramisu to serve to their guests. They were even given a 5-star review which you can find on Instagram.

As well as pop up restaurant excitement, they published their newspaper reports online and started a new english unit based on the fantastic book 'Arthur and the Golden Rope'. They revised expanded noun phrases and wrote setting descriptions using other descriptive devices. I am so proud of them for all they have achieved with their writing this year — it has improved massively since September and it's such a joy to see them so eager to share their ideas with each other.

In maths, they finished their shapes and patterns unit by answering some assessment style questions as well as learning some new shape names of 2D and 3D shapes.

Next week, we will continue our learning on forces and magnets and find out more about how the Romans lived before our trip to the London Mithraeum.

Friday 23rd June

This week in English, Year Four wrote book reviews for 'The selfish Giant'. We remembered to include key information about the story's plot, structure, setting and characters. We also designed our own front covers and share our favourite aspects of the story.

In Maths, we have looked at time problems and practised converting from hours to minutes, minutes to seconds, years to months, weeks to days. We also learnt how often a leap year occurs. We then solved problems involving converting from hours to minutes, minutes to seconds, years to months, weeks to days. We are now looking at rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

On Wednesday, Year Four had a fantastic time on their trip to the Natural History Museum. They took part on the 'Emergency! Earthquakes and Volcanoes' workshop where they had to work as a group of scientists to plan an evacuation for a town situated next to an erupting volcano. They worked brilliantly in teams to retrieve key facts from the displays and answered tricky questions. Thank you so much to all the parents who joined us for the day!

In Computing, we have continued our unit on programming. This week, we focussed on writing code for shapes and repeated commands. We wrote the code snippets that we needed in order to draw different shapes in FMS Logo. We then used commands to create count-controlled loops. We experiented with created different sized shapes as well.

- What is the name of the outer layer of the earth?
- How many minutes are in 4 hours?

Learning at Christ Church

Friday 23rd June 2023

Another learning filled week at Christ Church has come to an end. This week, Year 5 went to the Ragged School Museum on Tuesday and experienced what it was like to be a pupil in a Victorian school. Thank you to our parent helper for coming with us. Trips would not be possible without you! Furthermore, Year 5 also had the opportunity to participate in the school's Midsummer festival this Friday. They had a lot of fun making flower wreaths, dancing around the maypole and enjoying fruit skewers.

In English, Year 5 have been designing their own rover to explore Mars. They have named their rovers and thought about the different features they would need to fulfil their mission, which is to send back scientific information about Mars back to NASA. Furthermore, they have written an explanation text to accompany their labelled diagram of their rover. This text explains the main features and equipment on board their rovers.

In Maths, Year 5 have been learning about perpendicular and parallel lines. Year 5 have been learning how to use a set square to check if lines are parallel or perpendicular. They have also been learning how to use a set square and a ruler to draw parallel and perpendicular lines.

In Science, Year 5 have been learning about the different properties of materials. They had to conduct an experiment in order to work out which material (bubble wrap, aluminium, cardboard, paper, fabric...) is best to protect a meringue from a drop. As a result, Year 5 learned how to design a fair test, conduct an experiment and report their results scientifically.

In History, Year 5 have been learning about the city of Sparta, famous for training fearless warriors, and comparing it with another famous Greek city state: Athens.


In Computing, Year 5 have been learning about keyboard shortcuts to copy, past and undo actions when drawing Vector images. Year 5 have also been learning how to rotate Vector images in order to design a variety of animals.

Friday 23rd June 2023

This week, the children have begun creating their slipper project! Over the course of this term, the children will be designing, making and decorating slippers to give to their Sheep in Reception. First, we had to create a mock up slipper out of paper and tape so get our brains thinking about the components of a shoe. Then, we looked at how patterns are used to make creating clothes and shoes easier. We cut out and constructed a variety of slipper patterns and were able to choose which one they wanted to make. Finally, we went to Reception with a questionnaire to interview our Sheep and find out what colour, design and shape they wanted. We used this information to draw a final design of what our slipper will look like!



We have also finished drafting our biographies for the Leaver's book and have reflected on the memorable experiences and people that have shaped our journey and development through Christ Church. In Music, we have begun to decide on the songs that we will be learning and practising for the Leaver's Assembly.

In DT, the children began their fairground unit where they will be constructing games. This will be a combination of Science and Art! In PHSE, we talked about Secondary transfer. We thought about what we were excited for and what we were worried about. In Maths, we continued to look at graphs and read and interpreted line graphs.

We have, of course, done plenty of Shakespeare rehearsals! The children are completely 'off script' and are working on delivering their lines with emotion and meaning.
