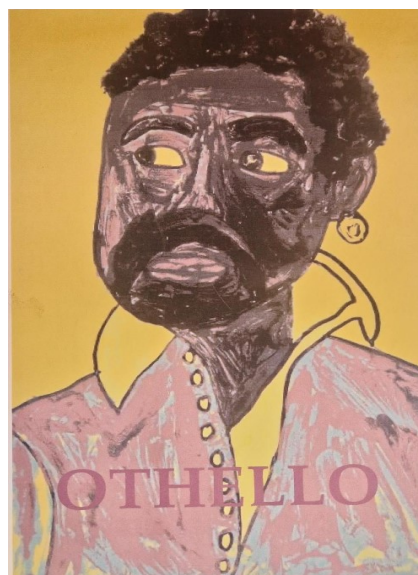

## Helping you feel well this summer



<b>STAY SHADED</b>	Stay shaded and out of the sun from 11am and 3pm, wear a hat and light clothing to cover up.
<b>STAY SENSIBLE</b>	If you are having a summer BBQ, ensure that food is stored and cooked safely.
<b>STAY AWARE</b>	Be a good neighbour and look after those who may need a helping hand during the hot weather.
<b>STAY SAFE</b>	Pharmacies can be found locally. Your local pharmacist can give you medicine to help with hayfever.
<b>STAY PROTECTED</b>	Always make sure you are protected from the sun, choose a sun protection factor (SPF) of 30 or higher.
<b>STAY HYDRATED</b>	Keep yourself hydrated, by drinking plenty of water and avoid excess alcohol and caffeine.

As the weather is changing and we are seeing more sunny days, children will be exposed to the sun and we would like to share some sun safety tips. Please make sure that:

- children come to school with a water bottle
- a hat
- wearing sun screen - and have sun screen in their bag -
- particularly on swimming days (Y3/Y4 only)

In addition, the NHS states that you should take extra care in the sun if:

- have pale, white or light brown skin
- have freckles or red or fair hair
- tend to burn rather than tan
- have many moles
- have skin problems relating to a medical condition
- are only exposed to intense sun occasionally (for example, while on holiday)
- have a family history of skin cancer

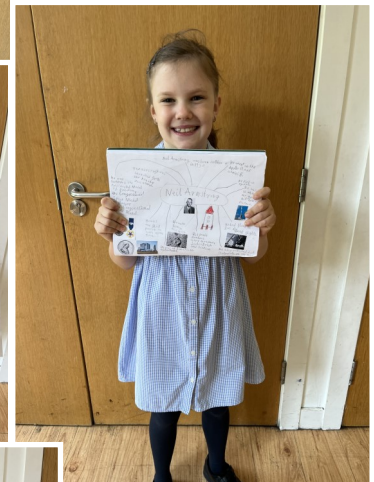
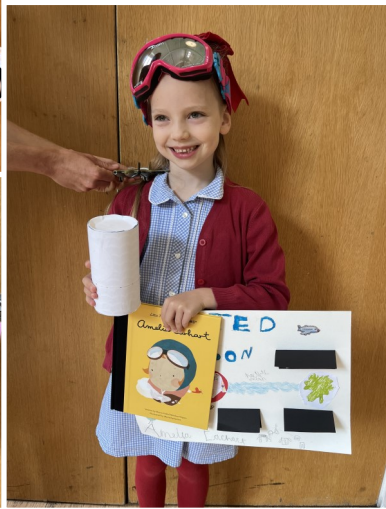

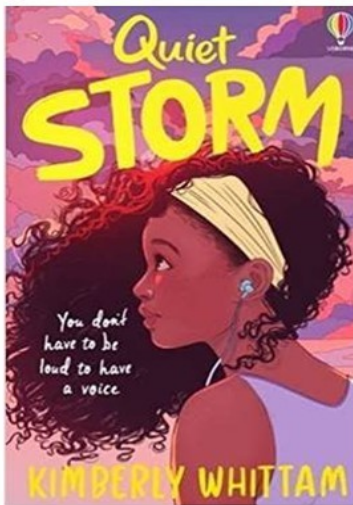


# Recommended Read

Do you hate reading aloud in front of other people? Or sharing your work with the class even when you know it's good? Do you never put your hand up because you can't stand everyone looking at you? Well, Storm feels exactly like that.

So far, she's managed to navigate school by being a shadow to her best friend Zarrish but Zarrish seems to be moving on to new interests and friends and leaving Storm behind.

When Storm breaks the record for the fastest Year 7 sprinter her school has ever had, she has the chance to pursue something she really loves but can she find the courage to speak up and branch out?

Dear Reception Parents,

This week, in **English**, we have continued to learn about sea creatures. On Monday, the children used their senses to describe what they could see, hear and smell under the sea. On Wednesday, they wrote a letter to the Rainbow Fish explaining how his behaviour had affected the other fish.

In **Maths**, the children learnt about odd and even numbers. We organised a teddy bear picnic and shared food evenly. The children understood that when the teddy bears didn't have the same amount of food the quantity would be odd.

The children have enjoyed playing in the outdoor area. They searched for real coins in the sandpit using a metal detector and counted how many coins all together. Then, we discussed if the different amounts were odd or even!

In **Understanding the World**, the children learnt about different animals and their habitats.

Next week, we will be listening to the story of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2023

In maths we began to look at fractions, in particular halves and quarters. We learnt that both are different ways of sharing the whole equally. When we halve something, we share between two groups and four groups when quartering. We showed such good understanding we went onto writing these as fractions, discussing that the denominator shows how many parts there are, and the numerator shows how many of those parts we are looking at.

As part of our Hibernation Hotel topic, we wrote some fantastic non-chronological reports about four animals from North America. First, we researched about a beaver, bear, racoon and a skunk, made some fabulous information posters which we used to write our reports. At the end of the week, we started reading Hibernation Hotel by John Kelly and Laura Brenlla. We stopped halfway through to make a prediction about what might happen next. We are excited to find out what actually happens next week...

In RE we started thinking about the question - Why does Jesus tell stories? On our tables there were images from different stories, or parables that Jesus told, and we had to make notes and guesses about each one. Then we were given the titles and had to match them to the correct pictures. We recognised The Seed Sower and learnt some others. We will repeat this lesson at the end of the topic to show how much we learn over the next few weeks.

On Thursday we had a fabulous Sports Day, supporting each other, being a good team player and trying our best in all the activities. Thank you to all the parent helpers, it was lovely to celebrate our sporting achievements with you. Well done to everyone!

In Science, we have meet chefs at Pizza Express as we make our own pizzas.

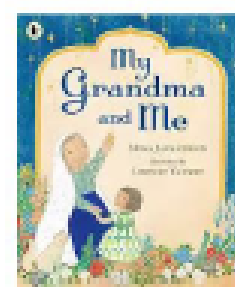
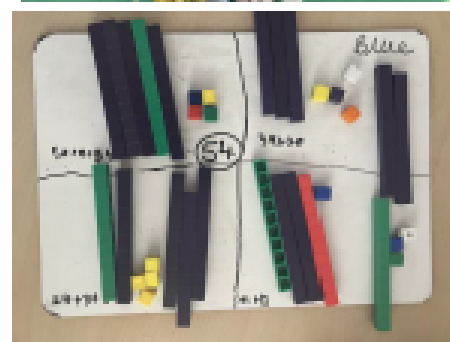
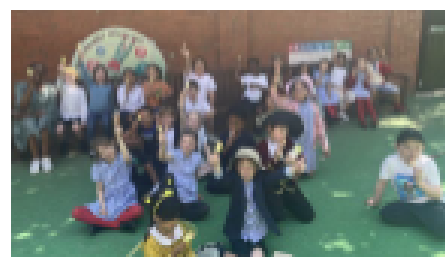

### Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2023

In **English** this week, we wrote our short stories based on Arthur's mini adventures in Arthur and the Golden Rope. We worked hard to remember to include key techniques for good storytelling such as a range of conjunctions, adverbials, expanded-noun phrases and exciting verbs.

In **Maths**, we began learning about angles and turns. This week, we focused on the different ways to describe turns such as a quarter turn, three-quarter turn, a full turn and clockwise and anti-clockwise. We then looked at right angles in more detail.

In **Art**, we designed some artwork for our Pop-up Restaurant next week. Keep an eye out for some famous Italian landmarks.

This week we also had Sports Day! The children had lots of fun competing in the sun and taking part in many different activities. A big well done to all of the children for taking part 😊

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

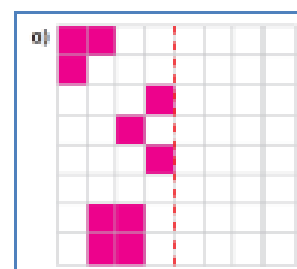
Friday 16th June 2023

Highlights of this week include:

#### Maths

This week we:

- completed simple symmetric figures in relation to a specific line of symmetry
- Answered questions relating to years, months, weeks and days
- Solved problems involving converting from hours to minutes and minutes to seconds.



#### English

We started the week by using words with the suffix *-sion* to create sentences. Words included *invasion*, *confusion*, *explosion*, *expansion* and *extension*. Children explored noun phrases and used these to create 'missing persons' posters, as part of our 'Selfish Giant' unit. Having made predictions about what they thought may happen in the book, Year 4 wrote book reviews. This involved giving compelling reasons for their views of *The Selfish Giant*.

#### DT all day paper-rolling workshop

On Wednesday, we were joined by Darcy Turner, an artist who specialises in 3D art workshops for kids. Our all-day session involved 'paper rolling' to make chairs. Children worked in groups of 6 and began by rolling 5 sheets of newspaper to make a tube with a 'tail'. This tube was placed into a newspaper rolling machine, glue was applied and then the paper was rolled into a very strong paper stick.



This was repeated many times (some groups used over 40 sticks for their chairs). The sticks were then used by the children to create life-size chairs.

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity  
Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2023

This week in English, we worked as a class to map the text *How to Catch a Minotaur: A Step-by-Step Guide*.

In Maths, we learnt how to divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1000. We realised it was similar to multiplication, but the number gets smaller so you have to move the digits to the right.

In RE this week, we finished the poster representing our class, and looked at the different faiths in the wider community in the borough of Kensington and Chelsea.

In Science, we researched the gestation periods of different animals and also found out the heights of fully grown females. We will test our hypothesis that the bigger the animal, the longer their gestation period.

On Monday, Year 5 visited the Ragged School Museum in Mile End. During the Victorian Era, this school provided education for children who were too poor to receive it elsewhere. On our trip, we got to experience what school was like over 100 years ago - we had to sit up very straight, use chalk and slates, recite the alphabet and our twice tables (2 times tables), and be very, very well behaved! We also learnt about the outside of the building which was originally used to store lime juice and still has the original Victorian green on doors.

On Thursday, we had our Sports Day! Everyone had a wonderful day in the sunshine, competing against teams in the field activities and racing their best.

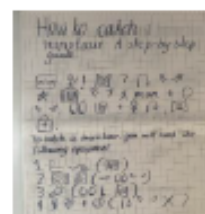
#### Swedish Midsummers Festival

**Learning in Year 6 at Holy Trinity  
Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2023**

Lots more Drama this week getting ourselves ready to practise with full lighting and sound effects. We have made sure that we are feeling more confident with our lines and most of us were happy to perform without our scripts this week. Just two weeks to go! Our performances are on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> June at 2.30pm each day. An additional evening performance will be on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.

In English, we continued with our topic on biographies, we have been busy planning our next piece of writing, making sure that we can include all key features of a biography. Using bullet points and we were able to organise information we wanted to include under subheadings that we thought most fitting for our bio. We have thought about how to engage our reader, encouraging them to read on (using our knowledge of persuasive language). Using our homework, we have even planned how we could use quotations and reported speech in our final biography. On Wednesday, we looked at effective introductions, analysing what was good and how some of the examples could have been improved. This helps us to decide how we could draw our reader in to learn about Barack Obama in our biography. Next week, we will be writing!

In Science, we have been revisiting electricity, putting our knowledge to the test with a quiz. In Maths, we have been revising percentages, finding the percentage of an amount.
