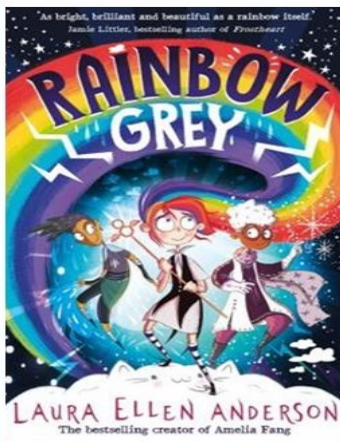

Rainbow Grey (ages 7-9 & up)

Ten-year-old Ray Grey lives in the magical Weatherlands, high in the sky. Ray is surrounded by Weatherlings with astounding weather power at their fingertips, but she doesn't have ANY magic... Until a trip to Earth to find some secret treasure changes Ray's life forever – and she becomes Rainbow Grey.

Rainbow Grey is a rollercoaster adventure, full of twists and turns, secret reveals and a proper "dun dun dun", cliffhanger epilogue. There's enough excitement in this chapter book to keep every child happy, and it's all swept along by Laura Ellen Anderson's joyful, cartoony illustrations that animate almost every page. From rainbow-sprayed edges to dramatic moments when the pages go dark to reflect the weather in the scene, it's a gorgeous book that young readers will love to own or borrow.

Amid all this action – and the farting-cloud-cat silliness you'd expect from the creator of the bestselling *Amelia Fang* books – is a book that lets in quieter moments too, and really focuses on the friendship between Ray and her pals Snowden and Droplett. Indeed, the end message is very much about how love, hope and togetherness will always triumph and give a person a strength they didn't think they had.

Keaton Guimaraes-Tolley

13 July — 26 August 2023

It was my safest place. It was home.

A powerful new verbatim play from the testimony of residents at the heart of the Grenfell Tower tragedy.

Six years on, interviews conducted with a group of survivors and bereaved reveal the impact of the multiple failures that led to a national disaster, asking: how do we stop this ever happening again?

Created from these interviews by Gillian Slovo (*Another World: Losing our Children to Islamic State*), the play is co-directed by Phyllida Lloyd (*The Donmar Shakespeare Trilogy*) and Anthony Simpson-Pike (*The P Word*).

Startling and deeply moving, it explores the courage and resilience of an ill-treated community and their continued campaign for justice.

Dear Reception Parents,

This week, in **English**, we have travelled all around the world on our wonderful outdoor airplane and we have taken the children on different holiday locations. On Monday, they described a beach scene by using adjectives and conjunctions. We also used 'there is' and 'there are' to start our sentences. On Thursday, the children wrote a list of travel essentials.

"I can see a seagull flying in the blue, clear sky."

"There is a black dog running across the beach."

"There are two men swimming in the deep, blue sea."

In **Maths**, we have continued to add and subtract using a number line. It has been so pleasing seeing the children become more independent when using new strategies in Maths.

Next week, we will learn how to count in 2's.

Transition to Year 1: Next Thursday, the children will spend some time in the Year 1 classroom in order to support their transition to Year 1! They will have some golden time and we will complete a writing task so they can become familiar with the classroom and resources. Exciting!

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 7th July 2023

In English we started reading *Julian is a Mermaid*, focusing on improving our inference skills. As this is a book with very little text, we had to use the character's facial expressions and their actions to guess how they were feeling. We also focused on identifying and using verbs, in particular, imperative verbs (or bossy verbs). We used these to create commands for Julian when he was daydreaming.

In maths we started to look at money, learning the names of each coin and how we can tell the difference between the copper coins and the silver coins. Then we moved onto looking at notes and understanding why it is much easier to carry notes instead of lots of £1 coins. We finished our topic by playing 'shops'. Our classroom was transformed into Holy Trinity Stores with a huge range of items to buy. We chose our coins carefully and checked we had the right money before giving it to the shopkeeper.

In RE we were looked at the Parable of the Two Builders. We learnt about what happens when people do not listen to the word of God. We spoke about Jesus using relatable, real-life scenarios in his parables so that his audience would understand his messages better. Then we thought about who helps us makes us good choices and how these people do this and why it is important for Christians to listen to the word of God.

In science we learnt about the process of metamorphosis which is the physical change some animals go through to become adults. We looked at the life cycle of a frog and were amazed that a frog starts out as frogspawn. Butterflies also go through this change; we learnt that caterpillars create a chrysalis and then a few days later it emerges as a butterfly. Then we created our own life cycle of a frog and tackled the challenge of writing our own definition for metamorphosis.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2
Friday 06th June 2023

Thank you for a great week of learning. In English we have written a day in the life of our character 'Mina'. We also began to write our own script based on the text and began to use drama skills to act out key sections of our own play.

During our maths lessons we are working hard to master our regrouping skills as we subtract larger numbers. This is something we are developing; please continue to practice at home.

In our dance lesson, we have performed and sung to 'This is me' from the Greatest Showman. I hope you enjoyed watching, we were very proud of lovely work.

We have also sent home a link to see some of our music lessons. We are very excited to perform for you at our **Graduation on Monday 17th July**.

In Science, we have enjoyed our 'Master Chef' unit and worked in groups to make our own Scone. We measured our ingredients, followed each step of a recipe and enjoyed our delicious scones. We also wrote these clearly in our science books so you can enjoy these at home.

Our DT projects are coming along beautifully, we have now sewed our two sections together, demonstrated our use of running and over stitch. We have also added pockets and next week we are attempting buttons.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 7th July 2023

In **English** this week, we wrote our own stories based on 'Arthur and the Golden Rope.' We worked hard to ensure we were using good story telling techniques, more complex sentences and a range of vocabulary.

In **Maths**, we continued our Geometry unit. This week, we looked at identifying and describing 2D shapes using some of the more complex language we have learnt throughout this unit such as right angles, parallel lines and perpendicular lines. We then focused on drawing polygons accurately. We know that a polygon is a shape with straight sides. Next week, we will be looking at and making 3D shapes.

On Wednesday, we went to **Hyde Park** for a Maps and Orienteering workshop. We looked at the different features of maps and how to use compasses before heading off in small groups to navigate our way around the park and find different landmarks as part of the Hyde Park Challenge. All of the children worked so well together as teams to complete the challenge!

In **RE**, we looked at another of Jesus' 'I am' statements. This week, we focused on 'I am the resurrection.' We looked at the story of Lazarus to help us understand how Jesus was always true to his word.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

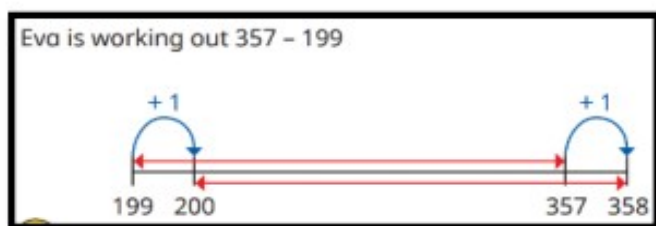
Friday 7th July 2023

Highlights of this week include:

Maths

This week we:

- Used estimation to work out answers.
- Explored 'constant difference' to make more efficient subtractions.
- Used inverse operations to check answers to a calculation.
- Reviewed our addition and subtraction unit.



English

Using Lewis Carroll's poem 'Jabberwocky', we explored and investigated nonsense words and how meaning can be made of them. This activity helped pupils recognise how poets manipulate words and appreciate the importance of the context to understanding a word. Year 4 also had the opportunity to understand the effect of a prefix.

Geography:

On Monday we travelled by bus to the National History Museum to investigate geological forces from deep within the Earth through watching interactive demonstrations. We saw the making of a real earthquake and lava (hot wax) pouring. The workshop highlighted the power of our planet's natural forces and demonstrated the importance and challenge of natural disaster prediction.

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity
Friday 7th July 2023

This week in English, we independently planned and wrote our own instructional text. We based it on the creature we drew for Art - Hydra, Medusa, Harpies and Cerberus, just to name a few.

In Maths, we moved on to measurement where we converted kilometres to meters and kilograms to grams. We learnt that *kilo* means 1000 so there are 1000g in 1kg and 1000m in 1km.

This week in History, we evaluated the story of the Trojan horse by examining evidence and determining whether the story is historically accurate or not.

In Art, we started using the Batik method on our artwork, by firstly using wax on the outline of our creature and then filling in the other areas with coloured dye.

This week we looked at how life changes when we grow up. We were surprised that we are allowed to work at 13 and get a pension at 66! We looked at what we can do at the six different times of life.

In RE, we started researching a presentation on the different religions followed in our local area.

In Computing, we planned a quiz that we are going to program using Scratch next week. We chose our theme and decided what would happen if our users get the questions right or wrong.

Learning in Year 6 at Holy Trinity
Friday 7th July 2023

Another busy week in Year 6 with learning, trips and yet another excellent Shakespeare performance. In English this week, we have begun a new topic, based on a book 'Freedom Bird'. We started this unit off by thinking about our own wants and needs transitioning to Maslow's hierarchy of needs. Using a range of different wants and needs (family, sleep, water, freedom, clothes, food, dreams, home, laughter, love, friends, school), we worked in groups to order these from most important to least. In Maths, we have been learning about algebra, starting off by looking at rules. Revising our knowledge of inverse to calculate an unknown value.

On Tuesday, we took a trip to the Horniman Museum, where we learnt more about the Amazon rainforest and the people who live there. After looking at some of the local wildlife in the Amazon, we learnt about the Wei Wei people and how they survive in the Rainforest. Following our packed lunches, we explored the Aquarium, where we looked at an assortment of aquatic creatures and even saw some poison dart frogs (commonly found in the Amazon and used by the local people to poison animals for food).

On Wednesday many of us spent time out of school to visit our new schools, we are excited to start our new journey in education.

On Thursday, we went on tour to Christ Church to perform Othello one last time before watching Christ Church year 6 perform Romeo and Juliet.
