Grenfell: in the words of survivors

It was my safest place. It was home.

A powerful new verbatim play from the testimony of residents at the heart of the Grenfell Tower tragedy.

Six years on, interviews conducted with a group of survivors and bereaved reveal the impact of the multiple failures that led to a national disaster, asking: how do we stop this ever happening again?

Created from these interviews by Gillian Slovo (Another World: Losing our Children to Islamic State), the play is co-directed by Phyllida Lloyd (The Donmar Shakespeare Trilogy) and Anthony Simpson-Pike (The P Word).

Startling and deeply moving, it explores the courage and resilience of an ill-treated community and their continued campaign for justice.

Grenfell: in the words of survivors is part of a multi-year programme of National Theatre <u>creative</u> activity in North Kensington, delivered in collaboration with local community organisations.



Mac loves music. He plays guitar in the school rock band and often rocks out with his mum, who's obsessed with rock. His favourite lesson is music with the uber cool Ms Fox. But he has a secret. He loves musicals. He can never tell his mother. Or anyone else. Musicals aren't cool, are they?

But when the arts programme at school is going to be cut, and his favourite teacher out of a job, Mac knows he has to do something. And when he lets slip his knowledge of musicals, he's invited to a secret musicals appreciation society, where he meets Flynn. Flynn is a year older, he writes amazing music and he has various physical and verbal tics, due to his Tourette's. Together, can Mac and Flynn write a musical to save Ms Fox?

This is a brilliant story about true friendship, the importance of the arts, and the astounding things a community can do when it pulls together. Written with guidance from someone with Tourette's, this gives a clear-eyed view of the potential challenges Tourette's brings, and information on how it can differ from person to person. Importantly, Flynn is far more than his Tourette's. Uplifting and heart-warming.

#### Learning at Christ Church in Year 1

#### Friday 14th July 2022

For English, we have looked at poems in particular 'Dear Derek Drew' which we discussed in great detail. We then practiced performing this poem to the rest of the class. We discussed that when performing a poem, it is important to focus on body language, pitch, tone, volume of voice. This created a more exciting performance for the audience.

In Maths, we have been describing different movements using positional language. We worked in pairs to create a dance routine using key terms to write out instructions. We then performed the dance routines to the class!

For Alphabet Code this week, we have been revising the // code and have been learning how to spell the tricky word 'because'.

In Guided Reading, we have continued reading 'Superworm' and looked at different punctuation marks. We noticed when the author uses full stops, exclamation marks and question marks and why they use them. We also spotted where there were contractions in the text, such as; 'I'm' (I am) and 'we're' (we are).

In DT, we designed and drew our very own playgrounds thinking of any everyday materials that we could use.

In Computing, we continued practicing using google classroom. We logged on and completed an activity and then learnt how to turn it in back to the teacher. We also practiced creating different shapes and lines using our mouse and keyboard to help us!

#### Learning in Year 2 at Christ Church

What a fantastic week we have had in Year 2! We had such a fantastic day at West Wittering Beach on Tuesday. We made sandcastles, dug a hole (almost all the way to Australia!), swam, played some cricket and football and enjoyed every minute. We are so thankful for everyone involved in making it a very fun and successful day!



Elsewhere, we have been revising time in Maths. We are using our mini clocks in the classroom to test our knowledge of o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. Keep practicing this at home!

In English we are finalizing the plays we have written for Grandma and Me. We have written about two characters and described the setting and on stage actions for these characters. Next week we will perform our plays.

In DT we were lucky to have the year 6 class to come and help us sew our Joseph's Technicolour coats. The year 6's have been making slippers in their class and had excellent sewing skills to show us. We are in the final stages of creating these coasts, next week we will add some designs to make them uniquely ours!



#### Learning in Year 3 at Christ Church

#### Friday 14th July 2023

This week, Year 3 have been busy writing their short stories about Arthur and the magical creature. This will be their last piece of extended writing in Year 3 which will be published, and sent home for you to read next week. They have thought carefully about using expanded noun phrases, similes and ambitious adjectives.

They have been drawing lots of graphs and have become very good at drawing clear, understandable bar charts using labels and straight lines for their axis. Next week, we will be reviewing the maths assessments together by exploring tricky questions, sharing ideas and answers.



In Science, the class carried out a friction investigation to see which surfaces would slow down a toy car. They made predictions using prior knowledge of surfaces, explored push and pull forces and drew up their results in a bar graph.

The last few weeks, in Spanish, Year 3 have been learning about musical instruments, and this week they've put their knowledge to the test with a listening test. The children had to listen to

different musical instruments and decide what they were listening too – writing the answers in Spanish.

#### Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July

In Maths, we have been looking at the most efficient strategy to solve addition and subtraction calculations. For example, we used number lines to jump forwards and backwards in steps. We also used the strategy of adjusting and compensating to work out our answers more efficiently. We then looked at estimating and using inverse operations to check answers to a calculation. In English, we have continued learning about the poem, 'The Jaberwockey' by Lewis Caroll. We identified the different features of poetry, such as; stanzas, line breaks, assonance and onomatopoeia and thought about their effect. We then focussed on specific parts of the poem and wrote our own interpretation.

In RE, we have looked at the importance of Liturgy in the Christian faith. We learnt how Liturgical worship is structured and follows a set pattern for each service. Liturgy includes some keys features, such as; saying sorry, listening to the word of God, praying for people, listening to the homily and receiving the Eucharist. We reviewed our learning on Holy Communion to remind ourselves of the origins and significance of the Eucharist.

On Tuesday, Year Four visited the Battersea Power Station as part of their Geography unit; 'How is Our Country Changing?' We were lucky enough meet two of the key architects who had worked on the design of the Power Station. We looked at a model of the power station and considered the different materials used. We then sketched different parts of the development and identified which features were original and which features were modern and had been added more recently.

#### Good questions to ask your child this week:

- What is onomatopoeia?
- What are some of the main ingredients to the liturgy?
- Which aspect of the Battersea Power Station do you think was most challenging to regenerate?

#### Learning at Christ Church

#### Friday 14th July 2023

Another learning filled week at Christ Church has come to an end. This Wednesday, the children graduated from Year 5. It was a lovely celebration which highlighted all the children's achievements and highlights this year.

This Friday, Year 5 visited the Science Museum in link with our Science topic about space. This was our last trip this year and thank you to the adults who came with us, school trips would not be possible without you!

In English, Year 5 have been writing an informal letter in the role of Kathrine Johnson. Kathrine is writing to her daughters and giving them advice on what to do in the face of adversity. The children in Year 5 have been using ambitious words (innovative, perseverance, versatile) and conditional sentences in their letters.

In Maths, Year 5 have been learning about negative numbers. Year 5 have been learning how to read number lines that go past 0, how to compare positive and negative numbers and how to solve word problems involving negative numbers.

In History, Year 5 celebrated Greek Day on Thursday. They came dressed in their togas, participated in Greek games, learned to write their name in Greek and enjoyed a Greek feast. Year 5 also participated in debates during Greek day and worked very hard on preparing their arguments and their responses to counterarguments.

In Computing, Year 5 have been learning about grouping shapes and selecting multiples shapes before copying them. The grouping function allowed children to draw intricate designs such as a flower bouquet.

In Art, Year 5 have been learning about artistic representations of the Ascension. Children have been using artistic vocabulary to describe paintings about the Ascension and they have used their knowledge to create their own version of the Ascension.

#### Learning at Christ Church in Year 6

#### Friday 14th July 2023

This week, the children went to South Downs to the YHA for our final trip as a class. We boarded the bus on Monday and had a fun-filled trip to the coast. On arrival, we went on a hike and had a beautiful view of the rolling hills and fields. Then we did some Art activities involving hitting leaves with hammers to make imprints and creating beautiful hanging dream catchers with thread. In the evening, we went back up the hill to enjoy the sunset over the valleys.

The following day, we went to the beach by train. We started the day by running into the sea for a swim! Then we spent time hunting for beach wash ups and found cuttlefish skeletons and shark eggs! We then had a competition to see who could build the tallest tower out of rocks and created artwork on the beach. Finally, we went back in the sea for a final swim! In the evening, we went to the local village green and played football and played on the swings.

On our final day, we played team challenges. We had to make a basket and parachute to carry an egg which was then dropped from a height. The best contraption was the one that protected the egg. On Thursday, we did a double Maths lesson (to the children's delight) and learnt about the area of a parallelogram and how to use ratio to solve problems about recipes. We then went to Year 2 and helped them with their sewing of Jacob and his technicolour coat.
