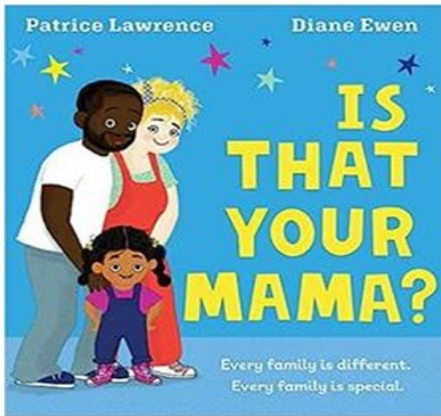

Grenfell: in the words of survivors

a new play by Gillian Slovo

Keaton Guimaraes-Tolley

13 July — 26 August 2023

It was my safest place. It was home.

A powerful new verbatim play from the testimony of residents at the heart of the Grenfell Tower tragedy.

Six years on, interviews conducted with a group of survivors and bereaved reveal the impact of the multiple failures that led to a national disaster, asking: how do we stop this ever happening again?

Created from these interviews by Gillian Slovo (*Another World: Losing our Children to Islamic State*), the play is co-directed by Phyllida Lloyd (*The Donmar Shakespeare Trilogy*) and Anthony Simpson-Pike (*The P Word*).

Startling and deeply moving, it explores the courage and resilience of an ill-treated community and their continued campaign for justice.

Grenfell: in the words of survivors is part of a multi-year programme of National Theatre [creative activity in North Kensington](#), delivered in collaboration with local community organisations.

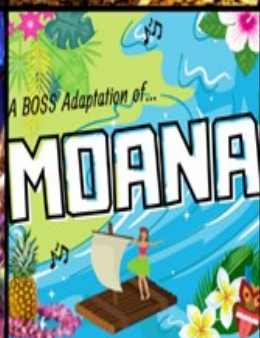

In **Maths**, we looked at reading scales and practised our strategies for solving larger missing number problems. We made sure we could identify the whole and known parts before choosing an appropriate strategy.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

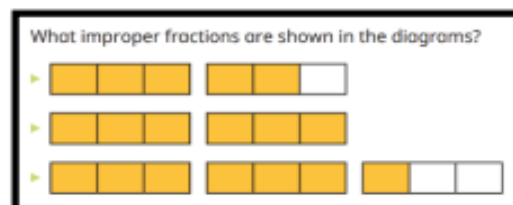
Thursday 20th July 2023

Highlights of this week include:

Maths

This week we:

- identified halves and quarters as decimals
- learnt how to identify improper fractions
- learnt how to convert mixed numbers to improper fractions



English

This week we explored the use of onomatopoeia in poetry by identifying examples from the poem Jabberwocky. In addition, children thought of their own examples of onomatopoeia such as 'thud', 'gurgle' and 'crash'. Year 4 then explored the poem 'Color' by Christina Rossetti by identifying unknown words, themes and likes and dislikes of the poem. Finally, children modified the poem 'Color' with their own ideas. Doing this, they practised using rhythm and rhyme for effect.

Science

We carried out a review of our learning on animals and humans. This included the anatomy and physiology of the digestive system.

To finish off our art unit, Year 4 completed their final watercolours based on Journey on a Cloud. See below for some impressive results:

Thursday 20th July

We made it to the end! 39 weeks of fantastic learning, exciting trips and lots of fun in Year 5.

On Monday this week, we had our annual Ancient Greek Day. We prepared for the Olympics by creating a crest dedicated to one of the gods and each made a laurel wreath. Groups then participated in some Olympic events including boxing (can you remember what was in the box) and javelin. After the strenuous events, students had a wonderful Greek feast - pita, tzatziki, hummus, olive oil, dried fruits, olives, feta and goats cheese. Later in the day, we learnt about the ancient Greek alphabet and wrote our names and also painted terracotta pots. Finally, we learnt about how the ancient Greeks loved the theatre and practiced two plays - Athena and Arachne and King Midas.

This week we were delighted to welcome back Miss Adams for an afternoon! It was great to see her again and to learn all about the Superpower of Looking!

In Computing, we finished our RE presentations on local religions and presented them to the class. As well as learning about different religions, we were able to evaluate our presentations and improve our computing skills!

This week we started packing up our classroom, taking down our displays, cleaning in all nooks and crannies, and made sure it was ready for the next set of Year 5s.

It has been such a pleasure teaching and learning with your children this year. I have seen them grow in confidence, build their friendships and develop wonderful learning habits that they can take with them in the future. I know they will be well looked after and have a great time in Year 6.
