Senior School Talk

Friends of CCHT and Bonas MacFarlane are pleased to bring you Let's Talk Secondary Schools.

Our talk is on Wednesday, 11 October, 19:00 for 19:15 start until 20:30 at Christ Church Primary School.

The choice of schools for parents from Year 7 onwards across both state and independent sectors can be bewildering. 

WHAT DOES THE GOVERNING BODY DO?

60verning Bodies play a vital supporting and strategic role in the effective planning and decision making of the school.

They are responsible for different aspects of the school such as Finances, Premises, Staffing and Curriculum.

WHO CAN BE A PARENT GOVERNOR?

Any person who has responsibility for a child on roll at the school.



HOW MUCH TIME DOES IT TAKE?



The full governing body meets twice a term.

Meetings take approximately two hours.

6 overnors also attend a committee meeting twice a term and at least one monitoring visit during the school day.

TRAINING FOR NEW GOVERNORS


New governors receive induction training explaining the role and responsibilities of governors. There is a designated helpline, website, newsletter and training courses which keeps you informed. Your fellow governors will also support you in your new role.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DO I NEED?

Parent governors do not need formal qualifications and need not be experts in the field of education. What they do need is an interest in the school and in the welfare of our children and the time and willingness to get involved.

I am writing to tell you that there are two vacancies for the role of parent governor on our governing board.

The role of the governing board

The school's governing board is responsible for providing confident and strategic leadership, and creating robust accountability, oversight and assurance for the school's educational and financial performance. The board is passionate about education and committed to continuous school improvement to ensure the best possible outcomes for our pupils.

The role of a parent governor

As a parent governor, you'll work with the board to ensure it carries out effectively the duties referred to above. You'll also play a vital role in ensuring that the board is connected with, and is aware of, the views of parents and the local community.

To be a parent governor you should have:

- A strong commitment to the role and to improving outcomes for children
- Good inter-personal skills, curiosity, and a willingness to learn and develop new skills
- The specific skills required to ensure the governing board delivers effective governance

Expectations of governors

Parent governors should expect to be willing to:

- Attend meetings regularly, including any committees to which they may be appointed
- Read papers/documents thoroughly which are circulated in preparation for meetings
- · Maintain confidentiality in and out of meetings
- Commit to governor training as arranged by the clerk
- Visit the school and the class with which they become partnered



Learning at Christ Church in Year 1

Friday 29th September 2023

In English this week we have been writing sentences about the characters in 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. We have thought carefully about how the characters look and behave. We used exciting adjectives to describe the 'mischievous and greedy tiger' and to describe how 'kind and generous' Sophie is.

In Maths, we have continued with our white rose maths. Where we have been looking at number words as well as counting on from any given number.

For Alphabet Code this week we have been looking at the /igh/ code and writing sentences using this code. Next week, we will start the /oa/ code.

In Geography we have been thinking about our journeys to school. We thought about how we travel to school and how long it takes us. We also thought about which features we might see on our way to school and drew pictures to show a map of our journey.

In Science, we thought about our senses. We identified our five senses and focussed specifically on our sense of sight. We then created a tally chart for the most popular colour of eyes in year one and the most popular was, brown. We finished by labelling the parts of eyes.

In PSHE this week, we looked at our network hands and thought about who we are close to and who we can trust.

Next week, we will be writing our own stories in English! We will using adjectives to describe our characters and familiar settings.

Learning in Year 2 at Christ Church Friday 29th September 2023

This week, Year 2 have been working hard to finish writing their own versions of the story 'The Big Big Sea'. They have carefully planned, mapped out and spoken through their stories before writing them using conjunctions and noun phrases. They have made a big effort to use their words of the week – bulging, colossal, flawless which they have been learning throughout the week.

Together, we used sound lines to practise their spelling words. New words will be coming home on Thursday alongside their homework. I will introduce more spelling strategies next week that they will be able to use with you at home.

Year 2 have estimated where to put tens and ones on numberlines and will continue their learning on place value till the end of this half term.

In Reading, we have thought about the characters in 'Oliver's vegetables'. Year 2 were introduced to the term 'to infer' and have used clues in the text to make inferences about the characters' personalities.

We will continue with this next week.

Homework this week is to use past tense verbs in writing. We have worked on this since the start of term so they should feel pretty confident. Most past tense verbs end in 'ed' but there are some exceptions.

Learning in Year 3 at Christ Church

In English we have started to plan our own adventure stories. We are making sure to think about our characters, setting, problems and resolutions. In our adventure stories we are going to showcase everything we have been learning such as fronted adverbials, dialogue and compound sentences. Once we have finished writing our drafts, we will edit and then publish our final stories!

In Maths we have been finishing up our topic on place value. We revised flexible partitioning, adding 1,10 or 100 more to a number, estimating on a number line and representing numbers up to 1000. We also started our new topic on addition and subtraction. By the end of the half-term we should be able to add and subtract using three-digit numbers!

In Science as part of our topic 'Moon Landing' we explored how a rocket launches into space. We decided to create an experiment using balloons, string and straws to understand how air pressure can thrust an object. We originally predicted that the greater the amount of air in the balloon, the faster it would move along the string. However, we soon found that the opposite was true. This was a great opportunity to think like scientists, look at the data, and discuss theories that could explain our results



Learning in Year 4 at Christ Church

Friday 29th September

This week in English, we have been looking at the features of a diary entry. We identified that a diary entry needs to include; the date, a greeting and time conjunctions. We also thought about how they need to be written in the past tense and in the first person. We then moved on to write our own diary entries about a recent day. To make our writing more interesting, we included a range of coordinating conjunctions and fronted adverbials. In Maths, we have been learning how to read Roman numerals to 100 (I to C). We then practised rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. We identified that if the digit in the hundreds column is between zero and 4, we round to the previous multiple of 1,000, but if the digit in the hundreds column is 5 or above, we round to the next multiple of 1,000.



In RE, we continued to learn about the 'People of God'. We thought carefully about how Abraham demonstrated his faith in God by leaving is home and moving to a new land and by nearly sacrificing his son, Isaac. We also reflected on God's faithfulness to Abraham when He promises to give him a great nation, revealing that He will bless them and make his 'descendants to become as numerous as the stars of the sky'. As part of our Class Worship this week, we looked at the meaning behind the lyrics in the songs we sing, including; 'Autumn Days'. We thought about all the good gifts God gives us and how we can say thank you in prayer.

- Which multiple of 1,000 is 5987 closer to?

Learning at Christ Church Friday, 29th September 2023

Another learning filled week at Christ Church has come to an end.

In English, we have been learning how to use punctuation such as inverted commas and commas to add dialogue to a story. Children have been brainstorming ambitious synonyms for the word 'said' to use in their reporting clauses and they have been using connecting devices such as conjunctions and prepositions to sequence events.

In Maths, we have been learning how to round whole numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10,000 and 100,000. Children have been learning about which place value columns to look at in order to round appropriately. They have been using strategies such as looking at number lines to support them in their rounding.

In Computing, children learned about how information is shared in computing systems and networks. They identified tasks that are managed by computer systems, the human elements of a computer system and explained the benefits of a given computer system. Children also learned how information is shared between computers by using protocols.

In Science, children learned about the different types of scientists such as physicist, palaeontologist, and chemist. Children read about famous scientists in each discipline in order to define what differentiates them from each other.

In Art, children designed their Victorian Christmas cards. Children learned that the first Christmas card was designed in 1843 and that many of our contemporary Christmas traditions started in the UK during the Victorian Era. They replicated Victorian designs when creating their Christmas cards and used watercolours to add colour to their creations.

In RE, we learned about Jesus's third miracle, the miracle of the woman who touched Jesus's garment. Children created freeze frames to represent some of the important moments of this biblical story.

Learning in year 6 at Christ Church

Friday 29th September

Year 6 have continued to impress Mrs Davies and the whole year 6 team with their mature and enthusiastic attitude to their learning and school life. They have played brilliantly together and set a wonderful example to others as they walk around the school, in assemblies and at lunchtime.

English: the class have continued with their unit about the openings of stories. We have been finding and using adverbials in texts. Identifying and discussing descriptive verbs which relate to the two openings of *Great Expectations* we have watched. The first was the David Lean 1946 version and the second an adaptation by the BBC 1999. We compared these openings and thought about which we preferred and gave the reasons why. The children then wrote down verbs and adverbials which linked to the senses.

Reading: we continued to the read Wolf Brother and briefly reread the opening, as it is an example of a very exciting opening. The class are getting more confident at reading out loud and also following the text. Some of the children were finding it easier to follow with a reading ruler and we discussed how we are all read at a different pace. They started to complete a reading comprehension and we thought about the best way to write an answer a question by referring and finding evidence in the story.

Maths: This week in Maths we have continued with the topic of place value. We reviewed numbers up to 10,000,000 and learnt how to order and compare integers in different ways. We completed different types of questions and thought about strategies which would be useful to remember how to be accurate. We then revised and practiced different questions on the concept of rounding numbers. Next week, the class will learn about negative numbers.

PE: On Wednesday, the class had a swimming lesson again and everyone enjoyed the hour. They remembered to bring a snack and loved putting their wet clothes in the new bags that Elmer gave us.

Art: We designed and finished the final touches on our Christmas cards this week! They went to the printers on Thursday. We continued with our self-portraits on Thursday and although we agreed it was tricky to get started, everyone completed the first stage of their artwork. They considered scale, texture, line and finally colour. Next week, they will complete a second self portrait with a pop art feel to it!
