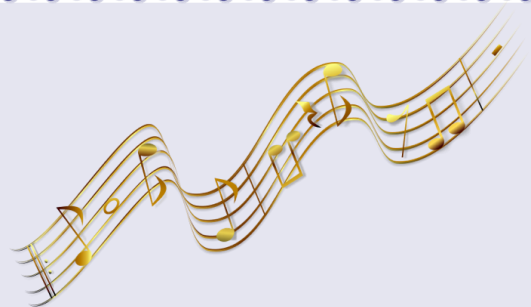


1:1 MUSIC LESSONS

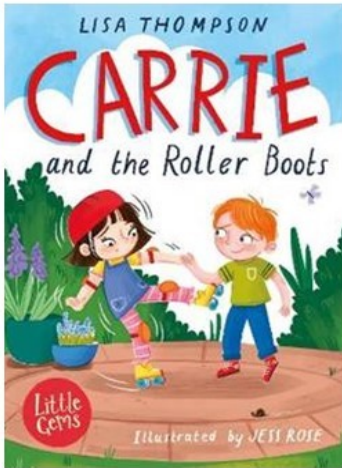


Recommended Read



Carrie and the Roller Boots (ages 6-8 & up)

Sidney has been practising his tap-dancing routine every day, in preparation for his performance at Friday Fun assembly. His best friend Carrie decides to perform alongside him, and devises a spectacular roller-skating act, complete with elaborate spins and cartwheels. However, Carrie has never roller-skated before and her new hobby proves difficult to master. Sidney suggests she performs at next month's assembly instead, to give her more practice time, but Carrie wants to be good NOW and won't accept any help or advice. As the day of the performance approaches, she becomes increasingly anxious.

This delightful chapter book demonstrates that it takes time, hard work and perseverance to develop new skills, and also highlights the importance of supportive friendships. It sensitively explores Carrie's feelings of frustration and apprehension, as well as Sidney's concern for his friend. Colourful illustrations accompany the gentle tale, which is ideal for dyslexic or reluctant readers. A dyslexia-friendly font and uncluttered layout makes reading easier, while thick, off-white pages help to reduce visual stress. Children can enjoy further Sidney and Carrie adventures in Sidney Makes a Wish.

Reception Class Maths this week





Learning in Reception Class
03rd November 2023

A busy week in Reception class, this is what we have been up to:

In English this week, we have been working on:

- building CVC words (pig, mat, peg, tap)
- writing short words using sounds and codes
- Writing short sentences: 'Pat a dog', 'The pig is big.'

In Maths, we have been working on ordering number and one more / one less than a given number. They used a number line to spot the answers.

The sounds we know in Alphabet code are: /s/, /a/, /t/, /p/, /i/, /n/, /m/, /d/, /g/, /c/, /k/ and /o/ /ck/ /e/ /u/ /r/ /h/ /b/.

Tricky words (words that we have to remember): I, the, a.

Reading and writing progression:

- First I need to be able to recognise and say the sounds for each code.
- Next, I should be able to spot the initial sound in words.
- After, I should be able to blend CVC words such as tap, dog, pig etc.
- Lastly, I can begin to write short sentences using tricky words and CVC words that I know.

Learning in Year 1

Friday 3rd November 2023

Dear Parents,

This week in English, we started learning about the Great Fire of London. We started the week by sharing all our amazing facts that we had researched over the half term holiday. Then, we discussed what other information we would like to find out about this historical event. This led us into looking at questions, the importance of using the 5 Ws - what, when, why, where and who and using a question mark at the end of our questions.

In Maths, we have been working on the concept of addition. The children have used the part-part-whole models to elaborate the related number sentences. Example:



In Alphabet Code we looked at all the different codes for /s/. We discovered **s** as in **s**nake, **ss** as in **messy**, **se** as in **nurse**, **ce** as in **nice**. Next week, we will be investigating all the different codes for /or/.

This week we have started with History instead of Geography and Design & Technology instead of Art. The children seem to be enjoying our topic about Bonfire Night in History and Moving imagines in D&T.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2
Friday 3rd November 2023

Thank you all for coming back this half term with such energy and excitement for learning. They are very big thank you to parents who are able to join us at our book look open afternoon! It was incredible to see your children share the lovely learning with you. We are so proud of all they continue to achieve!

A big thank you for your homework tasks and detailed book reviews. We had a class vote and are very excited to enjoy books that have been recommended so highly.

This week we started with a detailed recount of our half term activities, it sounds as though you had an amazing time and it was fantastic to read these as they were full of time adverbials.

Later, in our English lessons we started our descriptive writing based on an animated story called '[something fishy](#)'. We drew our own story maps and retold these in detail. Following this we began to write expanded noun phrases to describe the characters and settings.

Within our Maths learning, we are learning the 'making ten strategy' when adding two 1 digit numbers. This relies heavily on our flexibility to utilise our number bonds to ten. For example $9+5 = 9+1+4=14$.

In science, we are learning about the range of materials around us and their properties. This week we went on a materials hunt and identified a range of purposes for each material.

Within RE we have started our incarnation unit, exploring the importance of Christmas for Christians. We started by learning more about the verse 'I am the light of the world'.

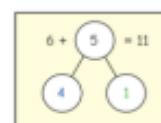
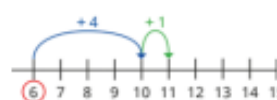

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 3rd November 2023

In English this week, we created an animal description of a fictional animal. We were inspired by David Attenborough's detailed descriptions. We generated lots ambitious adjectives to describe the creature's appearance, habitat, diet and movements.

In Maths this week, we began adding two 3-digit numbers together crossing 10. When exchanging ten ones for 1 ten, we need to remember to carry the ten over to the tens column.

In RE, we began our new unit all about Advent and the Feast of the Epiphany. In this week's lesson, we recapped the Nativity story and we looked at some prophets from the Old Testament who prophesied about the coming of Jesus.

In Science, we began our new unit looking at Nutrition and Diet. This week, we looked at the five food groups and sorted food into each group. We discussed which foods we should only eat occasionally and which foods we can eat more regularly.

In History, we continued learning about the Stone Age. In this week's lesson, we researched Stone Age monuments like Stonehenge and Woodhenge.

We also went to the Natural History Museum this week for a Mission to Mars workshop. We learnt lots about Mars, built our own Mars Rovers out of Lego in teams and programmed our rovers to move using coding.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

Friday 3rd November 2023

Maths

This week we focused on our x3, x6 and x9 times-tables. We explored how to recognise if a number is a multiple of 3 by finding its digit sum. We found out that if the sum of the digits of a number is a multiple of 3, then the number itself is also a multiple of 3. Year4 explored the fact that the 6 times-table is double the 3 times-table and used knowledge of the 5 times-tables to work out the 6 multiplication tables.

For the 9 times-tables, we used a range of strategies to support fluency such as looking for number patterns and finding unknown number facts from known facts. An example of this is subtracting from the 10 times-table or tripling the 3 times-table,

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English

Children had the opportunity to reflect on their reading assessment scores, from last half-term. We went through each question and children were able to set targets for themselves and celebrate where they successfully answered questions.

We ended the week developing a short description of a storm. For this, children included ambitious adjectives and adverbs and incorporated descriptive phrases from other texts.

Art

Year 4 explored the life of the artist Frida Kahlo and considered how artists use their art to reflect their own feelings and life experiences. Finally, pupils created a drawing, using colours, inspired by Frida's work.

History:

This week, we compared leisure activities of Victorian children from both rich and poor families. We then contrasted this with how children in 2023 enjoy themselves. It was clear that Victorian children from poorer households worked more and mainly played with homemade toys.

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity
Friday 3rd November 2023

What a great start to Autumn #2!

Year 5 began our week with computing, and had a whole computing day on Monday. We learned all about computers and how they communicate with each other so that people all over the world can stay connected. We then worked collaboratively on a presentation about a zoo animal.

We then jumped into our new religion unit, where we are getting into the Christmas spirit early and are learning about Christian beliefs around Christmas, and especially how they are shown through art and music! We had a look at the accounts of Mark, Luke and John, and linked our new learning to incarnation - our topic for last term.

We started a few new things in spelling this week: we landed on our feet with our spelling and handwriting programmes; we started reading our new class book, *Varjak Paw*; and we started our new writing unit, all about *The Lighthouse* - a heartwarming story where a small coastal village community comes together to help one another after the bulb in the lighthouse breaks.

- We get stuck into our new computing unit, which is all about making videos
- We continue developing our addition and subtraction knowledge
- We design a vase that has a deep meaning to us (both this week for homework and next week in class)

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 6

Friday 3rd November 2023

We have come back to school after the half term break raring to go, working hard and showing how much we have settled into life in Year 6.

This week in English, we completed our action openings based on the fire scene from the Hunger Games. Then we read our openings out loud to each other to check for sense and interesting features and practice our intonation.

In maths we continued to look at the four operations, in particular adding and subtracting up to 4-digit numbers. We practised using the formal column method, making sure that when we subtract a 2-digit number we used 0 as a place holder. We also discussed which methods were appropriate for different questions and what strategies we could use instead of always writing out the longer formal method.

In history we learnt about evacuation. We watched a clip of Carrie's War and discussed why children had to be evacuated from cities such as London and Liverpool into the countryside. We learnt about how the children were sorted, picked and then treated by their foster families. Some were lucky and some were not.

In SPAG we looked at what adverbials and adverbs are. We discussed how we can identify each and how similar they are. This should hopefully help us remember to start our sentences with fronted adverbials instead of using 'I'.
