

## **Remembrance Day Preparation**



This week we have been looking at the significance of Remembrance Day and how the poppy became an emblem of this important day.









During this time of remembrance, some people wear poppies to commemorate those who sacrificed their lives in World War One and conflicts that followed.

Wearing a poppy was inspired by the fields of poppies that grew where many of the battles were fought. The red poppy is said to represent remembrance and hope.

The purple poppy is often worn to remember animals that have been victims of war.



The black poppy is most commonly worn to commemorate the contribution of black, African and Caribbean communities to war.




The white poppy is said to commemorate people who died in conflict, but focuses on achieving peace and challenging the way we look at war.




## **Recommended Read**



Foxlight (ages 6-8 & up)

Author: Katya Balan Illustrator: Barry Falls Publisher: Bloomsbury



This is the story of sisters Rey and Fen who were apparently found as babies, curled up with a load of foxes in a den. And now they live in a children's home called The Light House at the edge of the Wildlands with all the other foundlings. But unlike the others, they didn't seem to have a mother who left them, no trace of a back story, so Fen weaves magical tales of how they came to be there. Then a real fox appears in the 'Foxlight', which is the name given to the time when twilight meets the dawn, and they follow it into the wildlands hoping to find their mother, and a very odd adventure ensues, exploring belonging and sisterhood

This is a beautiful book and award-winning Katya Balan has a brilliant narrative voice so, despite it being so poetic, it's not a difficult read, just an unusual one. The story is breathtakingly told, and so captivating it will pull a10-yearold child reader into something other, something deeper, unusual, bright and brightening like a fox's fur! The cover, russet red and glowing, and the internal illustrations by Barry Fallsare stunning.

### Learning in Reception at Holy Trinity Friday 10th November 2023

A busy week in Reception class, this is what we have been up to:

In English this week, we have been learning about Diwali. The children listened to the story '5 days of Diwali'. First, we read short sentences (blending known sounds) and matched them to the correct picture. In our next lesson we wrote down the different steps to make coconut Barfi sweets, using add, mix, roll and put. As we had looked at the ingredients and written the steps, we took the opportunity to make our own coconut Barfi in the classroom - they were delicious! Our last activity was to decorate a Diwali Rangoli pattern using coloured sand, rice and other materials.

Next week we will be learning about Holi Festival.

In Maths, we continued our learning on one more and one less than a given number to 10. Some children have ordered numbers from 11 to 20.

Next week, we will be starting a new topic, reviewing 2D shapes and making patterns.

In RE, we have been learning about how people prepare for the birth of a baby and thought about what we might bring to a baby shower to celebrate the arrival of new life. We talked about how a long time ago people were getting ready for a new baby to be born, Jesus. At the time, the world was not a very nice place, and this baby was going to help the world be a better place. The baby was a sign of hope.

## Learning in Year 1 at Holy Trinity Friday 10th November 2023

Dear Parents,

This week in English, we looked at the story of the great fire in a little more detail and worked together to sequence the events. We had a big focus on adjectives and starting our sentences with different words other than 'then'. We came up with some brilliant adjectives to describe the streets - claustrophobic, narrow, creepy and dark. We then used our learning from our previous science topic about our senses to think about what each body part would have experienced. We thought of suitable adjectives for each sense.

In Maths, we have continued to work on the concept of addition. The children have used the part-part-whole models to elaborate the related number sentences.


### Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2 Friday 10th November 2023

In our English lessons, we are writing a known animated story called <u>'something fishy'</u>. We are using expanded noun phrases and interesting conjunctions to retell and publish the story. We are hoping these will be complete early next week and we can send a copy home for you to enjoy.

Within our Maths learning, we are learning the 'making ten strategy' when subtracting two1-digit numbers.





In History, we shared our family timelines in chronological order. Thank you for the time and care you put into these. We were very lucky to have a guided tour with Nadia who showed us many local heroes in our local area. A very big thank you to parents who were able to accompany us. Some of our local heroes included Mozart, Chelsea Pensioners, Rowland Hill, Sir Hans Sloane, William Wilberforce, Olaudah Equiano and Pamela Lyndon Travers. Please research your favourites for homework as we will share these next week.

Within RE we have revised our understanding of the Nativity and it's importance to Christians. We recalled key events within the story and reflected on why this is a cause for celebration for Christians.

In Art, we have taken inspiration from Van Gough's sunflowers and have enjoyed using water colours, salt and oil pastels to make the pop.




## Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3 Friday 10th November 2023

Another busy week in Year 3!

In English, we have been practising grouping information into paragraphs, and we began writing our own non-chronological reports on a fictional creature. We have been writing our reports one detailed paragraph at a time beginning with appearance, and then habitat. Next week, we will continue our non-chronological reports.

In Maths, we have continued learning about addition and subtraction with crossing 10 and 100. We have been practising solving addition and subtraction sums using both concrete resources and column method.





In Art, we created our own sculptures inspired by Anthony Gormley's 'Field'. We each created a small human-like sculpture using just the palm of our hands and completed them with a message of hope or kindness.

In RE, we learnt about John the Baptist and his role in Advent. We discovered that he was the son of Mary's cousin, and that he prepared people for the coming of Jesus.

In Science this week, we looked at the five food groups in more detail. We discovered what each of the five food groups provides our bodies with and we looked at the difference between healthy and unhealthy fats.




### Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

### Friday 10th November 2023

### Maths

This week we worked on multiplying and dividing using our times-tables up to x12. We looked for patterns in each times-table and learnt how to use known facts, such as our x2 and x5s, to work out trickier facts such as 7 x 8. We also practised using strategies to work out word-questions by identifying the relevant information and relating it to the question being asked.



#### Science:

Year 4 began a new unit in Science: Sound. Using rice placed on a drum, we were able to see how rice behaves like air molecules when the drum is struck. The skin of the drum vibrated and made the rice jump. We learnt that as air molecules vibrate against each other, sound waves are formed, and the sound of the drums can be heard.

### History

In preparation for our trip to Hooke Court, we looked as far back as the 14 century, when the households of York and Lancaster were formed, to see what started the War of the Roses. We then explored the Battle of Bosworth and learnt how Henry Tudor triumphed over Richard III to become Henry VII, King of England, in 1485. This marked the beginning of the Tudor period.

### Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2023







We have been learning about the meaning of Remembrance Day and why we commemorate it. In history, we looked at the background of Remembrance Day and the meanings of the different colours of poppies. We then cut designed a background using pastel and white card, then cut a poppy out of a piece of coloured card, choosing the colour based on the meaning. We had some really nice conversations about Remembrance, the people who passed away in the wars, and we talked about how we still even have an army now that goes off around the world. We discussed the charities that money from poppies goes towards and the different ways in which this can help people, from therapy to prosthetic limbs to helping the family members of people who are injured or who pass away while in the army.

Football at Battersea Park went very well, except for a spot of rain – after which we saw a double rainbow! It was so nice for us all to be able to utilise the space we have there – we are very lucky.

## Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 6

Friday 10th November 2023

This week in English, we finish our 'story openings' topic with a free writing activity, creating a diary entry from one of the characters points of view, recounting the reaping (where the Games contestants were selected). These were fantastic and full of 'Show not tell' and emotive language. Then we started our new topic of focusing on letter writing. We read a letter from a WW2 evacuee back to their mother. Focusing the volume, expression, tone and inflection of how we read a text. We were able to infer and retrieve information from this letter to answer questions about this child's expertence of evacuation to a countryside town, living with a new family. Looking closer at the letter, we deconstructed the text, locating where the writer has used different sentence starts, adverbials, different uses of commas, descriptive language and the chronology of the letter. We spent a morning with Jose making a beautiful wreath this week, ready for the weekend. We made poppies out of copies of trench maps and WWI letters and stuck the face of people lost in wars. It was very moving when Jose explained to us that three of the people she had known.



On Friday we spent our morning leading the Remembrance Day Assemblies at both Hoty Trinity and Christ Church. Throughout the week we have been busy practising our script, telling the rest of the school about why who we are remembering and what the poppies, so many of us wear, represent.

It was lovely to see and chat to so many of you at our parent meetings this week! I look forward to seeing everyone else on Tuesday. Thank you for your time
