

## Discovery Atlas: Amazing inventors, explorers and artists from all around the globe (ages 6-8 & up) Author: Thiago de Moraes Publisher: Alison Green Books



It might feel as though humans have lived on earth forever, but we are in fact a relatively new development in the earth's history: modern humans have only been around for approximately 300,000 years, which isn't very long at all, if you remember that our planet formed 4.55 billion years ago. Yet, in those few hundred thousand years, humans have been busy discovering and inventing things, from fire and tools to the internet, toilet paper and ice-cream. It's been quite a ride!

Divided into twelve chapters detailing discoveries in areas as varied as medicine, sport, oceans, art, space, technology and food, this gorgeous, large-format hardback book is a wonderful gift for more or less any child with a curious mind. Thiago de Moraes' humorous, colourful and wonderfully detailed illustration includes brilliant double page spreads that, for instance, feature some of the key players in the developments in medicine over time, or scientists responsible for discoveries in physics and

space.

It's fantastic to delve into some of the fabulous inventions and discoveries made through history and into the present day, and de Moraes presents them with a genuine sense of curiosity and fun.

## **Christingle Service**

On Wednesday we held our Christingle Service at Holy Trinity Church. There was a sense of togetherness as we head towards the season of advent. We all focused on our candles and the good things that God brings to the world.





A busy week in Reception class, this is what we have been up to:

**English** - This week, we have started learning about: Christmas. The children completed the following activities:

-We learned about describing words (adjectives). The children described what Father Christmas looks like.

'Santa is big.' 'Santa has a red hat.' 'He is kind.' -They labelled objects they could find at Santa's workshop. Some children extended their writing by adding an adjective.

red bus big box red bag cheeky elf -Lastly, some cheeky reindeers visited our classroom in our absence! The children completed some sentences and described what the reindeers were doing.

In Maths, In Maths, we continued learning about patterns. The children took part in different challenges where they had to complete patterns against their partners. In Alphabet code, the sounds we know are:

We have now finished learning all the alphabet sounds. Next week we are going to focus on CVCC words (consonant, vowel, consonant, consonant): nest, tent, lamp, pond, etc. **Tricky words** (words we have to remember): I, the, my, to, said, you, he, she, your. On Tuesday this week, we had our Shepherds and Sheep outing to Chelsea Theatre to watch a Pantomime performance - it was great fun!

Next week: please can children bring a pair of white or pale coloured socks to school. We will be designing our own Christmas socks!

Dear Parents,

This week in English, we have continued to look at the story of *Owl Babies*. The children were introduced to **expanded noun phrases**, where we use two adjectives separated by a comma to describe a noun.

The baby awls could see the bright, shiny maan.

There are wet, saggy leaves on the ground.

The children have also started making baby owls using wool and card to make pompons.



In Maths, we have been reviewing addition and subtraction using part-partwhole and recording the different fact families. We will also continue to work on understanding number problems and choosing the correct strategy to solve them. Next week, we will review 2D and 3D shapes.

In Alphabet Code we looked at all the different codes for /er/. We discovered er as in letter, ir as in shirt, ur as in nurse, ar as in wark and ear as in earth. Next week, we will be investigating all the different codes for /u/ as in sun.

On a personal note, thank you so very much for your patience and kindness at this time as I take compassionate leave. It has been so beautiful to hear your well wishes and thoughts at this challenging time. We have ensured your lovely children are well cared for and I look forward to returning soon.

Thank you so much for your fantastic fact files, it was so fantastic to share these and they were enjoyed with great enthusiasm. This week we finished off our Shark non- chronological reports. These are bursting full on wonderful facts! We also completed a range of reading comprehensions around animal information booklets. We have been so impressed with how these have been retained.

Within our Maths learning, we have been consolidated our learning of addition and subtraction strategies. Please continue to practice these skills at home. We now know how to regroup, exchange and use our split method to answer a range of addition and subtraction challenges.

In our science lesson we are continuing to explore a range of materials and focussed on metal. We learnt that steel is made from iron ore, coal and limestone. We considered how the properties change as the material is thinned and flattered. Later we made our own boats using kitchen foil. We found these were waterproof, malleable and light.

In RE, we enjoyed our Christingle service on Wednesday and reflected on the symbols we saw and their importance to Christians. A big thank you to those who have donated to the Children's society appeal ③

In Art, we enjoyed making our own Mattise silhouettes, taking inspiration from his Jazz artwork.

#### Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

#### Friday 1st December 2023

In English this week, we continued reading Fantastic Mr. Fox. We generated exciting adjectives to describe Mr. Fox, and then we used these adjectives to create wanted posters. We also practised using conjunctions and choosing appropriate conjunctions to link clauses together.

In Maths, we began our multiplication and division unit. We started by looking at equal groups, then using arrays to help us create repeated addition sums and multiplication sums, and finally this week we recapped multiples of 2.



In RE this week, we thought about the true meaning of Christmas. We recapped all of our learning so far about Advent and the Feast of the Epiphany and discussed how these events guide us towards the true meaning of Christmas.

In Science, we looked at the diets of different animals. We looked carefully at the teeth of different animals and we discovered that we can tell whether an animal is a carnivore, herbivore or an omnivore by looking at their teeth.

In History, we completed our Stone Age quizzes where we showed off all we have learnt about the Stone Age in History this term.

This week, Holy Trinity had a Christingle service. Thank you

to all who came!


Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

Friday 1st December 2023

#### Maths

#### This week we:

Learnt how to multiply and divide by 10 and 100. Children used their understanding that 1 ten is 10 times the size of 1 one and 1 hundred is 10 times the size of 1 ten to support their understanding of multiplying by 10. Children visualised making a number 100 times the size and learnt that "100 times the size" is the same as "multiply by 100". For division, we visualised making a number one-tenth the size and learnt that "one-tenth the size" is the same as "dividing by 10". Finally, children built on their understanding of dividing by 10 and noticed the link between dividing by 10 and dividing by 100.



#### English:

This we took notes on a short animated film about two shoe-sellers. Children had to summarise the film using conjunctions, adverbials and prepositions within their sentences. We considered how adverts persuade a buyer and finally went on to use descriptive language, modal verbs and factual information to create their own persuasive pieces.

#### History


We learnt how historians use artefacts to understand the Tudor period by analysing artefacts from the Mary Rose, Henry VIIIs famous ship. Children chose a picture of an artefact and had a go at working out (inferring) what we can learn about the Tudors from the picture. For

example, wealthy families left behind portraits of themselves and typically showed people with their mouths closed, concealing their rotting teeth from eating sugar.

#### Science:

This week we studied the anatomy and physiology of the ear and the role this body part plays in hearing. We also learnt that the ear plays an important part in our balance.

Learning in Year 5 at Holy Trinity Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December 2023


We have had a great week full of lovely learning!

We started our multiplication and division unit, with everyone showing off how well they know their times tables through multiples! Keeping up the TTRS (Times Table Rock Stars) will be amazing at supporting us with this topic ③

We have now wrapped up our English unit, *The Lighthouse*, and are very excited to start a more wintery topic on Tuesday. The next unit has a lot of shorter writing activities which are perfect for this time of year, and Miss P-B has loved doing it with classes in the past.

We are learning how to make movies in computing, and spent some time trying out panning, tilting and zooming, along with other types of shots, using the iPads. We will use this knowledge to help us make 'How To' videos that we can then share with each other!

In science we are continuing our forces learning, this week thinking about different types of forces - unbalanced vs. balanced. In art, we drew and then painted our chosen endangered animals using watercolour paints, which we will then put into our shadow boxes!

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 6

Friday 1st December 2023

This week in English, we have been busy writing a letter home as an evacuee. Writing in the first person, we reflected on our learning n evacuation drawing on facts we have learnt in History to make our letter believable. We tried to include several writing tools that we have learnt over the last few months; embedded clauses, passive tense, -ing verbs and fronted adverbials. Our letters were full of description; describing the journey and experience to the countryside and the emotions that children would have felt throughout this time.

In maths we revisited the order of operations we should work out calculations in (BODMAS). We spoke about that whatever calculation is inside the brackets, we calculate that first. Then we spoke about the order of operations and then used this to complete multi step word problems. We spoke about the importance of underlining the important information and finding the language that gives us a clue as to which operation to use.



On Tuesday we had a lovely Shepherds and Sheep trip to Chelsea Theatre to watch a pantomime, Goldensocks and the Three Bears. We had a great time and were fantastic representatives of our school. We looked after our sheep beautifully and made sure they were comfortable and enjoying the show. Well done everyone.

On Wednesday we led our Christingle Service in Holy Trinity. A big thank you and well done to all our speakers who spoke clearly, slowly and with expression!
