

Clubs - Summer 1 2024

Please find attached a copy of the timetable for Spring Term 1. Changes of note include:

- There will be an amendment to French Clubs: we will offer a French Club on Mondays for Years 2 to 6, and reception and Year 1 will be on Tuesday.
- Mr. Escolar will be running a new club on Thursdays for children in Reception and Year 1. The club is called 'Juega y Divertete'
 which translates to 'play and enjoy.' The children will play different games while learning Spanish, incorporating numbers,
 colours, fruits, animals, songs, directions, and sports vocabulary in a really fun way. We are not extending this offer beyond
 these classes because Thursday is homework day for all other year groups.
- Another exciting edition is the Year 2 to Year 6 Science Club on Fridays. Mr. Guimaraes will be doing many interesting and
 educational science experiments, covering many different topics. There will be 15 places, and this will take place on Sedding
 Street in the lab. Experiments planned for the spring term include:
- 1. Chemistry and Physics: Fluid Dynamics—Slime
- 2. Magnetic and Non-Magnetic: Fishing all materials
- 3. Mechanics: Make a water wheel—powerful water
- 4. Fluid Density: Lava Lamps
- 5. Temperature: What is hot and what is cold?
- 6. The Science of Newton's 3rd Law and Friction
- 7. Buoyancy and Density: Boats that Float
- 8. Earth's chemical reactions: volcanoes
- 9. Leaky Pens: Chromatography
- 10. Ready for Launch Day: Forces and Motion: Rockets.

Please, can I request that all childcare bookings be made before attendance because we are having an unprecedented number of children off-register, which is a safety concern as we are exceeding our adult-to-child ratio. It also means that we may not have sufficient snacks for everybody. To book, first choose the date required through 'Clubs' and then making a payment via 'Payments'. The same applies to the Breakfast Club.

Clubs will be available to book via School Gateway on Saturday, December 23rd. A reminder that there are limited places and all clubs are booked on a first-come, first-served basis. If no places are available when you attempt to book, please let me know, and I will put your child on a reserve list. If nothing becomes available, I will give your child priority for that club the following term.

A reminder that I will be on holiday for Christmas but will endeavour to respond to emails at my earliest convenience.

Casander Darkbloom and the Threads of Power (ages 9-11 & up)

Every day Casander wakes up outside a curiosity shop and doesn't remember where he is from. All he knows is that he sometimes experiences random surges of energy in his legs. When he brings a stuffed raven back to life, and is pursued by several men, a girl named Warrior takes him to another world. The Balance Lands is a world of strange powers - and Cas turns out to have both Lifemaker and Deathmaker powers, and to be the Foretold, the one who will defeat the evil Master of All. Casand his new friends learn how to control their powers at the Wayward School. But what will happen when he has to fight the Master of All?

This is the first in a new fantasy series, dealing in familiar tropes – magical schools, being the chosen one, found family - but with a fresh twist. The author herself grew up with an unexplainable movement condition, known as ParaoxysmalKinesigenic Choreoathetosis, and has created a protagonist who is neither defined by, nor held back by this condition. There is further disability representation amongst Cas's friends, too.


